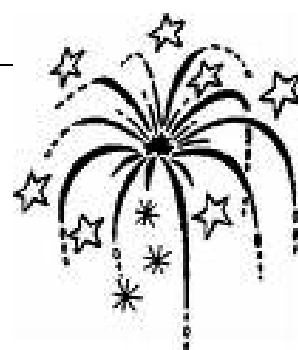

Speedwatch

Have you seen the team monitoring speed through the village over the last six months? They have identified three types of driver: the **innocent** (driving at less than the maximum of 30 mph) the **guilty** (who brake noticeably when they see the team in their yellow jackets so that they do not register on the detector) and the **arrogant** (who still proceed above the legal maximum, or accelerate away from the site or feel that the team should get a life!). At least one elderly resident that we know about, whose sight was not too good, handed over cash in advance for trimming a tree in the front garden – she fell for 'sob' story re lost job, sick children etc., and as he went to get tools from his vehicle, parked down the road, he never returned to either do the job or give her change.

Q/A1 More place name origins to start this month:

- Brady Road - Wendy Perkins has been investigating the origin of Brady Road. She wrote to me saying;
"The name Brady Road or Lane does not appear in any nineteenth century census of Lyminge. The 1901 census gives Brady Lane amongst the names enumerated in the Civil Parish of Lyminge. Only one residence is listed; it has no name but is occupied by a farmer called Frank Elliott and his family. So it seems that the name Brady Lane, which later became Brady Road, dates from about the beginning of the twentieth century. ... The only person of local importance after whom the road might have been named is Francis Brady ... who was the Chief Engineer of the South Eastern Railway when the Elham Valley Railway was built. ... Francis Brady was also the engineer involved in the initial attempts to construct a Channel tunnel in the 1870's I would like to think that Brady Road was, indeed, named after this eminent Victorian civil engineer, although I have no conclusive evidence- yet! A cursory search for the name Brady in the nineteenth century census documents suggests no other likely candidate; certainly no-one of that name lived in the area."

I was recently browsing through Lyminge Village 'Guided Tour' published by Lyminge Historical Society (& available from the Library) and found there that Brady Road "probably follows an ancient trackway. 'Brady' was the name of a medieval yoke ([an] administrative unit [of land]) and also may mean Broad Hedge."
Has anybody any other thoughts on the origin Brady Road's name?
- Etchinghill - Wendy also reminded me that Etchinghill was previously called Each End Hill. This was the Victorian name for the village. There used to be until fairly recently a foot path pointer sign at Broad Street pointing across the golf course that had Each End Hill on it. In fact earlier names were similar to the current name. For example the Andrews, Dury and Herbert Map of 1769 (see www.hereshistorykent.org.uk/) used 'Echinghill'. Judith Glover's (The Place Names of Kent, Meresborough Books, 1982) says that Etchinghill is derived from the Old English Tetting Hilde meaning Tetta's Slope. It was Tettingheld in 1240 and Tetyngheld in 1327. Apparently it is not clear as to when the initial T was lost and the village became Etchinghill. The question is who was Tetta? Somewhere I have seen it suggested that Tetta was a nick name for St Ethelburga but I can't remember where. The 'Guided Tour' booklet for Etchinghill published by Lyminge Historical Society suggests that Tetting means 'babbling' perhaps in relation to the stream that rises in the village. Apparently, much more water flowed through it until the railway tunnel was dug and diverted more water southwards in the Seabrook Stream.
- Teddar's Leas & Teddar's Leas Road - The 'Guided Tour' booklet for Etchinghill published by Lyminge Historical Society indicates that this was named after an Edward who owned some land at the top of the hill. 'Evidently, in the 15th century it was known as T'edward's Leas. Judith Glover in The Place Names of Kent proposes the the land was owned by Thomas Tyndour named in a document in 1348 and that he is the origin of the name. She says that Leas comes from the Old English Læs meaning meadow.
- Eastbrook - This is the old name for the area near Age Concern in Station Road and is probably named after the stream discussed above that rises in Etchinghill, crosses the golf course and joins the Nailbourne at Tayne field. It is also called the East Brook
- Magg's Corner - Older residents of the village often call the corner made by Mayfield Road and Station Road Magg's Corner. This is because before World War 2 there was a builder's yard there and the proprietor was Mr Magg.
- Jubilee Field - Alan Boughton has contacted me and told me, among other things, about how the field behind the Village Hall obtained its name. He was on the Parish Council, in the 1970s, when the field was given to the Council so that the Village Hall could be built on it. This was around the time of the Queen's Silver Jubilee and it was therefore decided Jubilee Field would be an appropriate name. Alan also told me that this field was used as a hockey pitch in the 1930s. The team that played there were known as the Green Owls. Does anybody know any more about this team or the history of any other sports teams in the locality? (Q3/9)

Mention of owls leads on nicely to another bird of prey. I have had more reports of buzzard sightings including one of two buzzards being mobbed by a huge flock of jackdaws and crows. Buzzards do seem to have become more common even in the short space of time since I first posed the question. I think it is now time to move on to some new subjects so here are some new questions.

Q20 Has anybody seen any weasels locally and what is the difference between a weasel & a stoat?

Q21 Are there any environmental projects in progress in the locality?

Q22 What is the history of St Mary's Hospital, Etchinghill?
