Lyminge History Questions and Answers

The July 2009 Etchinghill weather statistics are as follows. Do you remember how wet it was?

The maximum wind speed appears to have been a single gust. I cannot recall any gales during the month. There was a similar recording in June.

Q/A3 My thoughts about place names last month resulted in people contacting with some extra ones that needed adding to the list with possible reasons for their names:

- **Kimberley Terrace** - I have been told the terrace was named after the Kimberley Mine in South Africa. Web searches have revealed that a big hole (in fact an enormous hole) was mined there to a depth of about 800m [2625 feet] with a surface area of ±17 hectares [42 acres] and a perimeter of ±1.6km [1 mile]. Between 1871 and 1914 a yield of 2,722kg [6,000lb] of diamonds was mined. Kimberley was named after John Wodehouse (1826-1902), 1st Earl of Kimberley British Secretary of State for the Colonies. Apparently he took his name from his birthplace, a village in Norfolk.
- **Court Lodge Green** - This is the field between the present-day churchyard and the village hall. Traditionally this field belonged to the Court Lodge which apparently was the Old Rectory before the title was transferred to the farm at New Barn. At the top of the field, where it narrows down, is the site of an old sheep enclosure or pound. (The 1837 Tithe Map shows this as a separate field - **Pound Mead**.) It was an English tradition to hold the local court sessions in such an enclosure. There is a photo of 'Promulgating a court baron' at the pound c1929 - early 1930s on the front cover of 'A Background to the Farms around Lyminge' by Mrs Edna Downes. There is a copy in the village library. Apparently this annual court dated back to 1292 and consisted of the manor's freehold tenants and paid "arrears of quit rents and reliefs due." Sometimes Court Lodge Green is now called the 'bumpy field' on account of the medieval terraces. Apparently kids in the 60's called it 'the green.' Incidentally, nowadays some people call Tayne field 'the green.'
- **Abbott's Field** - This is the area of churchyard west of the church, beyond the ragstone wall, and stretching north to south from the footpath right up to the Old Rectory boundary to the south. The last remaining area of that field being the area that's just been excavated by the archaeologists which apparently showed many post holes and latrines suggesting habitation. The finds possibly suggest that the monastery inhabitants lived there. Perhaps this connection with the old monastery explains the name.
- **Hog's Green** - This is the paddock above Abbott's field belonging now to the Old Rectory. This may have been named because pigs were kept there.
- **Jubilee Field** - Whilst I was looking at the Tithe Map I noticed that the field behind the village hall now known as Jubilee Field was called **Court Close** in 1837. This is also apparently a connection with the court. Why is it now called Jubilee Field?

Q/A8 Several buzzard sightings have been reported to me this month. Firstly Yvonne Sancto saw one in Etchinghill catch a pigeon and disappear with it over the golf course. Dave and Honor Hunt-Cooke have seen buzzards at Woodlands Road, Stowting and Postling.

Andrew Coleman wrote to me; "I've been noting the eastward advance of Buzzards over the years in my travels around the country. It doesn't seem many years ago that you would have had to have gone to the western end of the M4 before seeing any. About four or five years ago I started noticing single birds on the southern part of the M25, then the M26 and then M20 and M2. A few weeks ago I came home and excitedly told any one who was interested (no one) that I had seen the first Buzzard east of Ashford on the M20. I think I've also seen a buzzard over the woods between Stowting and the M20 on a couple of occasions but these are not reliable sightings as they were rather distant. Last Sunday, whilst on my regular bike ride I saw two Buzzards above the woods on the road leading down from Bossingham to the Pett Bottom Road. I think they were young ones as they were doing a lot of flapping and mewing and generally gave the impression of 'larking about' rather than confidently soaring. Last Sunday's sighting was the first that I'd seen this far east, the closest I'd been, and the first time that I'd seen more than one at a time in these parts."

Like Andrew I have been gradually watching buzzards trek eastwards. I came across my late grandfather's Readers Digest Bird Book of Birds a while back. He had obviously purchased the book in the 1960's and on the Buzzard page he had noted in pencil that he had first seen a buzzard over his garden in west Hampshire on a particular date in 1970. They are now very common there. It seems quite clear that buzzards have arrived here now. I wonder if we will think of them as a pest in a few years like some do in the South-West? I hope not. They seem to me to be one of the most marvelous birds and we are lucky that we are now able to see them locally.

That's all for this month. Can you provide me with any reasons for Lyminge's place names as listed in last month's newsletter? if any one wants to ask or answer another question then please contact me.

Dangerous access to Bridleway on Stone Street

Stone Street is a bit of a race track for cars and a number of bridleways 'dead end' on to it. One particular bridleway (HE39) exits onto it on a blind bend at Farthing Common (GR135406). It would only require a relatively short stretch of rerouting to make it exit onto the road where riders can see and be seen by the traffic and access the Farthing Common triangle quickly and safely.

HE39 is a particularly crucial path as it is the way that riders from Postling/Etchinghill can access Lyminge Forest and bridleways west of Stone Street. Without it riders in these areas are isolated and confined to roads as there are effectively no usable bridleways, which is why riders are still risking the hidden exit from HE 39 despite the dangers of the fast traffic on the blind bend. There are no other safer options.

RED TELEPHONE KIOSKS

British Telecom is in the process of removing its red telephone kiosks that are little if ever used.

They have earmarked two kiosks in Lyminge Parish; the one outside the New Inn in Etchinghill and the other in Woodland Road, Lyminge.

Notices were placed in these two kiosks dated 1st July stating that they would be removed in 42 days. The notices were not read until as late as 27th July. B T offered councils three options as follows;

1. The kiosks could be "adopted" at a cost of £1 but the telephony equipment would be removed.
2. Councils can "sponsor" a kiosk at a cost of **£500 per annum** but the telephony equipment would **not** be removed.
3. The kiosks will be removed

B T has been contacted regarding the short notice and it appears to have been erroneous, after consultation with councils, the process of removing kiosks will not commence until after 1st October. B T also acknowledged that the kiosk outside the New Inn is grade 2 listed and cannot be removed but that the telephony equipment is not listed and can be removed.

The Lyminge Parish council are anxious to obtain the views of our parishioners as to which of the options they would prefer. To date, some 50 parishioners have responded to a petition in Etchinghill regarding the kiosk outside the New Inn, most would like to have the kiosk adopted but a smaller number are in favour of keeping the telephony equipment.

If you would like to express your views regarding the kiosk in Woodland Road please contact Councillor Richard Chubb (862015) and Councillor Colin Manvell (862324) regarding the kiosk in Etchinghill.

Suggestions as to what use the kiosks might be put to, e.g. a site for local artists to display their work, would be welcomed.

The Council will be discussing the matter at their General Purpose Committee meeting on Monday 7th September.
