**Etchinghill Residents' Association** has ordered the new replacement ball and plinth for the entrance to Meriden Park, which was vandalised last year. Our grateful thanks to Susan Carey and her generous donation towards this project. Hopefully, it will be completed by the end of June.

**ERA** is also hoping to install a **concrete planter** on the triangle of grass at the bottom of Teddars Leas. This will be planted with low shrubs and colourful flowers to enhance the appearance of the village. If anyone has any views either way please e-mail ERA at [enquiries@etchinghill.org](mailto:enquiries@etchinghill.org) or telephone Wendy on 863495. If the project does go ahead we will be looking for someone to help maintain the planter. If you are interested please let us know. We will also be seeking grants and fund raising for the project in due course. We are also hoping to enlarge the notice board opposite the New Inn to allow posters and notices to be displayed without having to have them under glass. Hopefully, this should stop some of the fly posting on the tree and fence, which can become rather unsightly.

In due course the **pavement** will be repaired in Canterbury Road, where the tree roots have been removed, together with a **dropped kerb** on the opposite side of the road to facilitate pushchairs, prams, electric buggies etc. Again, Susan Carey is kindly funding this from her Members' Allowance as Shepway do not have anything in their budget for this.

Lyminge Parish Council, via our councillor Colin Manvell, has kindly agreed to cut the foliage under the public benches in Etchinghill and to pay for their renovation, for which we are very grateful

If you have any ideas for improving Etchinghill please do let either your local councillors or the Etchinghill Residents' Association committee know. The long period of high pressure kept wind speeds mostly low, 8-18mph. It also accounted for frequent changes of wind direction, some twelve in all, from all compass directions.

## **Dedication of the Rachel Marchant Memorial Bench.**

On Saturday April 17th over thirty friends gathered in St. Nicholas church for the dedication of the Memorial Bench in memory of Miss Rachel Marchant.

During a short service in the church conducted by the Rev. Janet Thornby we remembered Rachel and all she had done for the church and the community. The Reading, Psalm 139, was by Mrs. Karen Llyod who, as a child, attended Sunday School where Rachel was the teacher. However, I understand that to play about in Sunday School was to face a dire telling off! Following the service we made our way into the warm spring sunshine for the dedication at the bench.

This was not a sombre occasion, but a happy event when past friends met again, past pupils of Newington School gathered for a group photo. From the bench there are views of the old school, church cottages, the church and over to Summerhouse Hill, one of Rachel's favorite walks. Many, many, happy memories.

The memories of Rachel's work as District Nurse and Midwife, her love and support for Newington and the Elham Valley continued as Tea, Coffee and light refreshments, very kindly supplied by Mrs. Ann Vincent, were served in the church.

For the very generous donations from friends, residents of the parish of Newington and the Elham Valley, the support of the Village Hall and the Gardeners, and all who helped make this lovely Memorial in affectionate memory of Miss. Rachel Marchant possible - Thank you all very much!

### ***Lyminge Heritage Questions and Answers***

Colin Collier has been studying the trader's token that was found in Lyminge. This has revealed that the shield on one side of the token is based on the coat of arms of the Worshipful Company of Grocers of London. This is described in heraldic terms as 'argent, a chevron gules between nine cloves sable, three three and three' which can be 'translated' as a white background with a red upward pointing 'V' surrounded by nine cloves. Colin has researched Richard Symonson, the trader, and has found, that later, in the 1700s, a family of that name lived in Elham. He has also found that there was another grocer, in Elham, in the mid 1600s and wonders if the population of Elham would have been big enough to support two grocers. He has found a Richard Symonson married a Marie Packe at Little Chart in 1604. The names match the initials on the token but, if they married in 1604, they would probably be in their 80s by the time the token was issued in 1664.

Colin has also been studying the word that indicates the place where the grocer, Richard Symonson was based. He thinks that the first letter is a K and that the second letter is uncertain but may have an apostrophe after it (i.e. K ?' H A M). The question that arises from this is where is this place in Kent? There are two Kelshams on the 1905-08 6 inch O. S. maps of Kent (see [www.kentarchaeology.org.uk](http://www.kentarchaeology.org.uk)). One is in Smarden parish and the other in Headcorn parish. There is no indication of any other place name that fit the letters. I have had another look at the token and although I can see why the first letter of the place name might be a K, I still think it could be an E, making Elham the most likely place where Richard Symonson traded from. I suspect that we may never arrive at a definitive answer to the questions that have arisen.

Penny Keutenius has given me a fascinating document that will be put in the Lyminge Historical Society's Archive. She believes it is the first Lyminge Newsletter. It is dated 'April 1963' and is titled 'LYMINGE No. 1'. It doesn't say who was responsible for the fifteen page duplicated and printed magazine but it pre-dates the Lyminge Association. It starts with an editorial which complains that village societies struggle because of, 'apathy and disinterest on the part of the village as a whole, and also possibly to the lack of publicity or (to be nearer the truth) the lack of funds to provide for it.' The editorial then states that the purpose of the publication is to provide information about every activity within the village and to use advertising of local businesses to fund the production. Of the activities many still exist, such as the Amateur Dramatic Society which was soon to put on 'The Shining' at the Methodist Church Hall. The activities that no longer exist include the Lyminge Film Society and the Lyminge Music Club. The editorial concludes rather ominously, 'We must assure those societies not mentioned that a great deal of effort was put into our enquiries in an endeavour to include you all. We can only assume that those who were approached for information, and failed to give it, did so by design. I wonder why it was necessary to say this? I hope to quote more from this document in future articles. It is surprising how much has changed and yet how much is still the same.

That's all for this month. Thank you everybody who responds to these articles. To those who email from other parts of the country or abroad, I really appreciate your interest and I will try to answer your questions, if I can.
