We would also like to thank all the residents who have helped and are still helping to keep the village clean and tidy - you must agree it has made a big difference. Can we check the foliage in the front of our houses. There are still a few hedges and overhanging branches which need to be dealt with as these can hinder pedestrians.

A year in the life of 'The Lyminge Association'

Back in September 2006 we were in danger of folding. However, following a plea, yet again at a time of crisis a packed village hall showed that the parish wanted to lend its support. So, by December, we had a new team of officers and about 12 people coming along at each committee meeting.

We are once again organising events for the community and I have outlined recent activities against the Association's stated aims:

Cultural

- our annual parcel delivery service with Father Christmas took place and was a great success.

Sporting/Recreational

- we promoted a couple of walking routes to Farthing Common to see the Tour de France
- we held a Gardens Open day in June 2007 with 18 gardens opening in Lyminge and Etchinghill.

- We provided a venue for an exhibition of Ethelburga Quilters quilting, Lyminge Dramatic Society's costumes and The Methodist Church 'clubs and societies themed' Flowers Festival.
- as a follow-up to a 'Spring Clean' event in April 2007 we are organising a second 'Autumn Clear-out' Garage Safari on Sunday 7th October 2007 between 10.00 a.m. and 4.00 p.m. incorporating a Charity Table Fair and refreshments at Lyminge Village Hall.

Educational

- we keep a list of clubs and societies in the local library.

Environmental

- new to our constitution this year, we have held meetings to appreciate what you feel we should concentrate on. You were mainly concerned about the state of certain areas in Lyminge and we will encourage participation in some clean-up days.

- we have had many discussions on what, how and where to keep to our promise of a trough in memory of the late Doug Furminger. Working with the Parish Council we aim to get

permission from KCC to site a trough at Yew Tree Cross, Lyminge. We also recognise our wider community by agreeing to purchase a trough for the Etchinghill Residents Association who offered local help maintain one in their village. •

Historical

- we are currently promoting a field history survey of our area and have also given our commitment to looking at any help that the Historical Society may require in creating a local archive.

Community Newsletter

- this goes out free every month to each household and includes advertising for local people and businesses. We have now included an Events Diary that we hope you find useful. Recently we held a thank you afternoon for our deliverers who turn out whatever the weather for the benefit of us all.

Constitution

- we decided that our name 'The Lyminge Association' was too well known to change to any of the acronym-style alternatives that were suggested. We agreed that our correspondence and Newsletter must include 'for the communities of Postling, Rhodes Minnis, Etchinghill and Lyminge' to show who we fully represent (i.e. not just Lyminge). We have established a good relationship with the Etchinghill Residents Association and always looking to be inclusive of all the villages.

- we have redrafted the Constitution to reflect our operation and activities.

Finances

- we are grateful to Haxtons for sponsoring our new event signage and also to China China, Station Road, Lyminge who gave us £200 from their charity Lion Dance evening, to support good causes. Also to all the businesses who sponsored the event map for October.

- we are financially sound and continue to break even or make a small amount from our events plus make a Newsletter profit of about £600 pa. and this is enough to allow us to help organisations in our community.

Donations

- we were able to give £300 to Lyminge Youth Action to cover their costs of staging a fund-raising concert -

- and a sum of £518 to Lyminge Pre-School to purchase 2 mobile sink units to meet their even higher standards of care.

I hope that you will continue to support both our organisation and the events we organise.
