Lyminge Heritage Questions and Answers

The recent snow has reminded Roger Davenport about a previously familiar sight, - Pegden Brothers' Sentinel steam truck. During inclement weather in the 1950s, it was fitted with a snow plough and cleared local, snow-blocked roads. Pegden Bros. were based at Pegden's Yard which was down the last road on the left as you leave Elham in the direction of Canterbury. Apparently, the power of these steam vehicles enabled them to cope with snow very well (perhaps much better than the vehicles of today).

Alan Boughton also remembers swinging on the 'roundabout' (which was mentioned last month) at the entrance to the footpath between Church Road and the Silverlands estate although he can't remember Mr Clayson ever telling him off. He tells me that it can still be seen today at the top of the path that leads from Well Road to the bottom of Ethelburga's Well. Apparently, this 'turnstyle' was moved by the Parish Council when the Silverlands estate was built because there was not enough room for prams or buggies to pass down the footpath by the side of the Methodist Church.

Last month, there was an enquiry concerning Lesley James Smith who was a pharmacist in the 1930s and lived in Lyminge. Mrs Joan Tugwell remembers the pharmacy in Station Road which was on the other side of the road to the present pharmacy. She especially remembers the red and green bottles in the window. She also remembers that the pharmacist was Mr Debrates and has a vague recollection that he was assisted by a Mr Smith. She thinks he may have lived up Nash Hill and also wonders if Mr Smith was the organist at the Methodist Church as Miss Collins was the Parish Church's organist at that time.
