# **Margaret Saunders' Meanderings**

Only just into the meteorological Spring, the day lives up to the definition. The sun is warm, birds are singing, bees are buzzing and blossom is beginning to burst forth. Of the hedgerow trees, blackthorn is the first to open, it's delicate white and fragrant flowers brave the still cool days and nights, together with a few local mirabelles, (cherry plum)



which have a similar flower, but with a show of deep pink around the centre. Blackthorn trees can live for up to a hundred years, their long strong thorns protecting them against being eaten by animals. Over the centuries they have been associated with witchcraft - it is said that witches' wands and staffs were made using blackthorn wood. Traditionally the wood has been used for making walking sticks and tool parts. And of course, its fruit, the sloe, is used to good effect when making sloe gin or syrup.

Along the sheltered footpath, two large fully open dandelion flowers face into the sun, creating mini-suns of their own. Elder trees,





always early to leaf, are well on their way. These trees are alleged to be feared by the devil and that if one is planted near the house, it will keep the devil at bay. Hanging from nearby trees, catkins are opening and lengthening, preparing to release their pollen on a breezy day.

With the latest war news from Ukraine fresh in my mind, I seek the soothing solace of the stream as it weaves and zig-zags its way along the valley. Listening to each little tuneful tumble I am grateful for the peace it bestows, although it too has seen years of war as the Battle of Britain raged across these fields over eighty years ago.

Evidence of fallen trees from the two recent storms, Eunice and Franklin, are all around, as nature had another clear-out of mostly diseased or weak trees. Other trees, amazingly, are still standing despite split trunks, whose inners are soft and riddled with insect holes. Across the valley, lambs are beginning to dot the fields, racing around in pairs, kicking their back legs in the air. This surely is one of the most welcome signs of Spring.

Although it is still largely a Winter landscape, close inspection reveals the hedgerows beginning to show signs of the annual renewal of life.

# Notes from The Lyminge Association Lyminge Parish Council Lyminge Village Hall The Lyminge Association

From time to time, newcomers to the area, as well as some of the more established residents, find it difficult to differentiate one group from another within the parish. This isn't helped when in some cases, individuals serve on more than one committee and this leads to a blurring of the edges and adds to the confusion. To clarify:

- **The Lyminge Parish Council (LPC)** (and not to be confused with Lyminge Parish Church) is responsible for running the structure of the parish, funding of projects using money raised through the local rates stipend and the local approval of planning applications amongst a whole raft of other things. The green centre pages of the newsletter are funded and the responsibility of LPC.
- The Lyminge Village Hall (LVH) committee look after the village hall in Woodland Road and all that entails. They raise their revenue by hiring out the hall as well as periodically putting on events to raise further funds.
- The Lyminge Association (TLA) is a purely community driven body that provides the Lyminge Newsletter and raises money for projects and charities within the parish's catchment area through a range of different activities such as Garage Sale, Garden Safari, Lyminge Festival, helping Father Christmas, litter picks, stream cleans, etc. This year TLA is <u>supporting</u> the Lyminge Parish Council in putting on the Queen's Platinum Jubilee (see below).

# The Queen's Platinum Jubilee

Plans are well afoot to ensure every opportunity is available for people to celebrate The 70th Anniversary of Her Majesty The Queen's Accession to The Throne.

Commemorative trees have been planted, while other details are now being finalised. Union flags will be put up on Station Road using the Christmas tree brackets (27th May), street parties are planned with the necessary street closure in place, a commemorative quiz spanning the 70 years of The Queen's reign (you'll need to book a table closer to the time), a fun dog show, games on Tayne Field, beer festival, live music, prom concert, lighting a beacon on the Church tower, etc all during the period of 2nd - 5th June.

# District Councillors' Update - April 2022



The Great British Spring Clean continues till 10 April and if you would like to join one of the organised community clean ups or go out solo then your District Council is able to provide equipment and make arrangements to collect the bags. We're fortunate to have many volunteers across our district but more are always welcome.

Folkestone & Hythe District Council has set a budget for 2022/23 with an increase of 1.96%; this equates to an extra 15p a day for a Band D household. We are making use of reserves to balance the budget and there will be no reduction in services. The District Council sends out

the council tax bill for all the other precepting authorities (KCC, Kent Fire & Rescue, Kent Police and your local parish council) and its share of the overall bill is around 13% of the total.

The Government's council tax rebate will be made automatically to eligible households that pay council tax by direct debit. Once a solution has been finalised for refunding those whose bank details are not held then those concerned will be contacted – there is no need to make a request to the council.

We're delighted to report that the council has been successful in a bid to the Government's Social Housing Decarbonisation Fund. Over the next 12 months two million pounds will be spent on improving energy efficiency in over 100 of our council managed homes. Those homes most in need of work will be prioritised and tenants will be contacted individually to arrange for the work to be carried out. We hope to be able to use local contractors for this insulation work and boost jobs in the green sector.

Electric Vehicle charging points are now available in most of your district council's car parks. This is part of a wider scheme which Susan initiated called EV600 which provides 600+ charging points across Kent in partnership with Connected Kerb. If you have an EV, your satnav should automatically add these locations to your map and you can download the Connected Kerb app to use them.

By the time you read this newsletter we will have attended the opening of F51 the new indoor skatepark, mountaineering and more centre in Folkestone. We will tell you more next month!

**Bigjigs Toys, Unit B, Kingsmead, Folkestone, CT19 5EU**, is providing space at its warehouse for donations to be made, sorted and loaded onto lorries bound for Eastern Europe. The warehouse is open Monday to Saturday from 9am to 5pm to accept donations. There will be AA signs directing people to the site. The most needed supplies are: nappies, baby wipes, baby food, sanitary products, long-lasting food and drink, warm socks and hats, other clothing, medicine, toiletries, blankets/bedding.

### Invoice Payments for Adverts in the Lyminge Newsletter

When I took over running the newsletter in July 2011, it was based on a ring folder with a page for every advertiser and with many of the ads being paid for in cash via the library. How things have changed as we moved details to an Excel spreadsheet, and the increased use of email allowed invoices to be sent out more easily. BACs changed the way that a greater percentage of the invoices were paid and now we have moved to a more automated form of accounting using Quickfile.

Up until recently I would send the annual invoices out once a year, usually after Christmas. It was very labour -intensive and was unsuitable, both for the client and us.

The new system means that we are able to send the invoices out just before the anniversary of their renewal giving the client a chance to either pay on time or withdraw their ad. We would therefore appreciate it if, in future, all invoices are paid within 30 days of receipt as we look to become a more slick and business focused organisation. Lastly, we can now take Credit/Debit card payments online to again ease the payment process.

**ST EADBURG'S WELL** - The refurbishment of the Well House is now practically complete and by the time you read this, we hope the pump will be back in working order. Do take a look if you have not already done so.

It passes through a rich and varied landscape, for much of the time close to the water or sea or river, as you walk north from the coast at Folkestone across the ridge of the North Downs and follow the Nailbourne towards the sea near Sandwich.

We will add more useful information on other topics in the months to come.

Have you also seen the new information posters displayed in the Station Road carpark yet? This is not just a static display. The poster headed **Did You Know?** contains quirky and hopefully interesting facts about our parish and will be changed every couple of months. So why not go along there to see our latest offering?

# The Nailbourne a globally important chalk stream We are exceptionally lucky to have a chalk stream, the Nailbourne, running through our Parish. Chalk streams are one of the

We are exceptionally lucky to have a chalk stream, the Nailbourne, running through our Parish. Chalk streams are one of the rarest habitats in the world, with only 260 true chalk streams known globally, most of which (85%) are in England. They are so special that some people refer to them as "England's rainforests" or "England's Great Barrier Reef". As such we have a great responsibility to conserve and manage the Nailbourne in a sensitive, informed and appropriate manner.

In October last year a new "chalk streams strategy" was published by the UK government with various partners, which can be easily found online. Recognising that chalk streams and their associated underground aquifers are important for people and biodiversity, the strategy is for everyone who has responsibility for, or uses, chalk streams. The Chair of Natural England, Tony Juniper, explained "These habitats are subject to a complex range of pressures, from pollution arising from road runoff, agriculture and sewage, to low flow resulting from abstraction for public water supply and physical damage to the water courses", and expected the strategy to result in the "joined-up partnership action needed to address these pressures, protecting and restoring chalk streams for future generations to enjoy".



As individual residents living beside a chalk stream we have a responsibility to ensure our actions do not add to the existing pressures on the Nailbourne, probably most importantly by avoiding polluting the stream or physically damaging it, and as a community we have a responsibility to protect and where necessary restore the stream. ### Lyminge Ladybirds - 11 Species Spotted But Where Are The 2-Spots?

Over the past four years I have spotted 11 different species of ladybird in the Parish: 7-spot, 10-spot, 14-spot, 16-spot, 22-spot, 24-spot, Adonis', orange, pine, kidney-spot, and the now ubiquitous Harlequin ladybird, introduced to Europe from Asia. I'm sure I'm not alone in never realising before how many different ladybirds there were in the UK (53), let alone here in Lyminge Parish. But notable by its absence is the 2-spot ladybird



- when I was growing up the 2-spot and the 7-spot ladybirds were the two most common garden ladybirds, but I haven't seen a 2-spot in years. They are still considered to be one of the most common UK ladybirds on the websites I have checked, so why haven't I found any here? If you have any suggestions please let us know (maybe competition from the Harlequin ladybirds?), and of course if you see one please do tell me, or record it online using iRecord.
