# From The Lyminge Association Temporary Road Closure at Broad Street, Lyminge plocing the road to Folkestone for 42 days - 25 July to 4 September

August 2022



This is the most current information as we go to press (25 July) by Lynne Collis.

The works planned for this development include the following:

the sewer connection which requires a 3m deep excavation, connection to the fresh water supply, installation of the highway drainage system, the construction of a new junction with dropped kerbs and tactile paving; the resurfacing and high friction coating, change of speed limit from de-restricted (60mph) to 30 mph, with associated signage, roundels, dragons' teeth and red surfacing to indicate the change, construction of new gateway into the village, involving signage on both sides of the road.

Lyminge residents, the Parish Council and members of the Residents Protest Group have been working hard to try to stop the Pentland Homes six-week road closure which started on 25 July. Over 1000 local residents and supporters have signed a petition organised by Mark Barrett for the works to be stopped.

With access to the village already so difficult because of queues of holiday makers, this is no time to cut our main road in and out of the village. Kent Fire and Rescue have already contacted us, and are considering double attendance (ie one fire engine from Canterbury as well as one from Folkestone), during the closure, to reduce the risks to residents. The protest group has been in contact with legal advisors and are seeking a stop order from KCC.

The reasons for opposing the closure are principally:

- That neither Portland Homes nor Kent County Council have made adequate assessment of the risks to the villagers. Pentland Homes have even admitted breaching the Health and Safety at Work Regulations in not assessing the risk to others affected by their works (section 3 (1) b). Such a risk assessment would have identified control measures which could have reduced the impact on residents and businesses.
- 2. That they have not considered other, less disruptive methods of doing the works, although several civil engineers amongst village residents have proposed alternatives. These fell on deaf ears.
- 3. The diversion is not via a route of the same standard as the closed road. Longage Hill is a single-track road with passing places. The risk of delayed access by emergency services puts all residents at unacceptable risk.
- 4. There appear to be irregularities in the process of granting permits for the works. The Temporary Closure Notice was granted to Walker Construction UK Ltd; the works have apparently been taken over by Tony Kirwan Contractors Ltd. The name 'Walker Construction' has been removed from the road closed signs, but there is now no contractor's name to as the required contact.

The planned closure blocks the main road to Folkestone and Ashford for up to six weeks while Pentland Homes digs a trench for sewage works associated with new build housing. The published diversion is twice the length of the closed route at 13.8 miles, via single track roads with passing places, compared with the twin laned route of 6.5 miles.

The developer's Build Director admitted in a recorded call to retired safety engineer and village resident, Lynne Collis, that Pentland Homes had done no risk assessment of the risk to the community affected by the closure. This has been reported this to KCC and to the local MP, Damian Collins. It is also a breach of the Safety at Streetworks and Road works Code of Practice 2013.

Lynne said, 'There are many safety concerns for villagers, but the ones which pose the highest potential threat to life are the risks of delayed access by the emergency services. They will only be able to get to Lyminge via single tracked roads with passing places. During a shorter closure last year we saw many traffic jams. This year the fire engines and ambulances would be competing with harvest-time farm machinery as well as other village traffic. KCC have also scheduled nightime closures of the M20 Junction 11 roundabout (part of the diversion route) and have closed Loughborough Lane for roadworks at the same time.'

Many residents are concerned that the bus service to the village will be curtailed. We will have to walk to New Barn Corner for a shuttle bus to Folkestone and to Sibton Park Gates for a shuttle to Canterbury. The walk is clearly beyond the encumbered or infirm but no shuttle bus through the village has been provided. There will be no number 18 service to the village.

Folkestone and Hythe MP Damian Collins has been contacted by many residents. He wrote to Roger Gough, the leader of Kent County Council, to ask that these plans are looked at again and a less disruptive solution found.

Lynne Collis said: We collected over 1000 signatures for our petition in 4 days, took legal advice, wrote to councillors and our MP. We put the case that the closure should not go ahead without alternatives being considered and the risks to villagers being properly assessed and managed.

We are delighted that Pentland Homes have had to listen to us.

MP Damian Collins commented: 'I am happy to be able to tell you that these [works] have now been cancelled, with Pentland promising to exhaust all other options. I very much hope that different arrangements can be made. I have already asked the Leader of Kent County Council to look into this matter and for the relevant people at the County Council to consider how these works could be carried out with less disruption to local people.'

The legal advice was spearheaded by Sheamus Maher. Having identified a solicitor willing to act on our behalf, he rallied people to verbally support him financially and enable the letter to be finally sent late Sunday afternoon. "Everyone in the village who made an effort to sign the petition, write a letter, send a post, and make a noise deserves great credit. I'd like to think my bit was just the straw on the camels back to make them realise the whole village was serious. The legal action would not have happened unless a few brave souls helped finance the action. It's difficult to choose just one, but Gordon Wallace of Beechborough Park made a very chunky promise of funds and without him I could not of gone ahead." Pledges of financial support (no matter how large or small) can still be made – see immediately below.

An account for the collection of the pledges has now been set up. Nancy Benham has offered to coordinate this collection on behalf of the community.

# **Margaret Saunders' Meanderings**

Unable to follow my intended route due to the cattle resting in the shade around the gate I needed to use, I changed my plan and stayed in the meadow, deciding to walk to the far end. I had already walked along a footpath where I had seen St John's Wort, its bright yellow flowers standing tall. Traditionally this plant was used to treat wounds and was often

hung up in doors and windows to prevent evil spirits entering the house. Alongside this flower was white bedstraw with its sweet perfume; pale flax which is a rare plant found on chalky soils; small bindweed with pink and white striped flowers; the fruiting 'clock' of goat's-beard (a grandfather clock compared to the smaller dandelion clock), otherwise known as Jack-go-to-bed-at-noon and sleep-at-noon, names referring to the flower's habit of closing around midday, and patches of brambles, covered in flowers with

> a few green berries already formed for early summer picking when ripened in another month or so.

> I had taken the upper track in the meadow, following the dry path which was overhung by

hawthorn branches and crowded in on either side by brambles as I headed towards the gate at the far end, where I would leave this field for a short stretch along the road before joining another footpath. Admiring the views of land and sky, it was at this point I saw the cattle clustered together, looking as if they had no intention of moving from their comfortable spot. Earlier in the week I had watched them walk in single file, eighteen of them, steadily moving westwards in the heat of the afternoon, their heads moving up and down with each footstep and their colours of tan, black or chocolate brown, harmonious and pleasing to the eye. The dominant member led the tail-swishing herd without faltering along the well trodden track until they reached a spot in the shade where they stopped, spread out and began to feed. But back to today. Dropping down to the bottom of the valley and well out of sight of the animals, I embarked on Plan B and decided to wander along as far as the path would take me. I passed a blackthorn tree which some time ago had blown down in a westerly gale, its split trunk open to the elements, with some of the branches and leaves still clinging on for dear life. Just to one side of this tree a huge patch of brambles was in flower and a clump of woolly thistles grew tall and strong,

spiky leaves protecting it from foraging animals. Hawthorn berries, already showing signs of red ripening at their tips, adorned nearby trees.

I reached the bottom of the valley and walked westwards passing spent cowslips, their seeds ripening in the sun. Clover, both red and white edged the path and here and there ragwort stood head and shoulders above all other growth. Grasses galore swayed in the strong wind, shedding their seeds far and wide. It is the month for meadow brown butterflies and they were rising as I walked, easy to identify as they close their wings when they land. Marbled whites, their markings distinct and striking were everywhere. These butterflies have very specific needs and appear only on chalkland, so I deemed it a privilege to have seen them. A butterfly alighted on a thistle which looked similar to a 5 spot burnet, but once home I managed to identify

it as a rare variety that has yellow as opposed to red spots. Eventually I reached the end of the meadow and turned to my right to look at a patch of ground left to its own devices at the top end of a field of oats. Immediately I could see that this was a wildlife haven, untouched by human or animal. It was alive with insects visiting the colourful and diverse flowers: in the purple and pink spectrum were common mallow, vetch, small toadflax, scabious, self heal and lesser knapweed. White flowers consisted of ox-eye daisies and hogweed. Yellow included buttercups, bird's-foot trefoil, taller than in the main meadow, mouse-ear hawkweed, rough hawkbit, nipplewort and yellow bedstraw. And I am certain there were many more that I did not spot. I took time, leaning on a fence post, to absorb the beauty and bounty of this rich patch of neglected ground, watching a small skipper butterfly flit from flower to flower. Finally and reluctantly I left this treasure trove and returned along the

dusty cattle track, with its angular diversions around saplings, making for a zig-zag and meandering route, close to the hedge where young hawthorns spilled out, as yet too young to bear berries. As I walked, the strong wind caused the hedgerow to rustle and the trees to roar.

I found three types of orchid here in three separate locations. In the far western area it is the domain of

the dark purple pyramidal orchids, the middle section is where the bee orchids bloom, stunning close up but difficult to spot amongst the grass, and the most eastern section is where the common spotted orchids grow, so called because of the purple oval spots on their leaves.

If I had to choose only one walk, it would be this one. In each of the seasons it has so much of interest and I feel blessed to be able to take advantage of all it has to offer. Not for nothing is the area in which we live designated an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

# Doctors' NewsNotes

Our two GP surgeries are sponsoring a new initiative to improve communications to our residents about key topics within healthcare. This initiative, to be routinely included within our Lyminge Newsletter, aims to provide accurate information for the community that may previously only have been picked when patients visit the surgeries.

This month, to start us off, Tara and Stephen (the Practice Managers from both surgeries) have given some details about waiting times for hospital appointments as well as the recent announcement of autumn covid boosters.

# Waiting Times for Hospital Appointments

As part of diagnosis and treatment of some healthcare problems that our patients experience, there is often a need to refer a patient to see a specialist at a local hospital. Specialisms include Gastroenterology, Dermatology and Cardiology, amongst others, and often the waiting times for patients can be long. GP surgeries are very limited in what they can do to escalate a patient to be seen quicker and, fundamentally, it is down to the Consultant team at the hospital to determine the priority of patients, after taking into account the detail provided by the GP as part of the referral process.

A national website is available to patients that contains up to date information of speciality waiting times at East Kent Hospitals University NHS Foundation Trust. The **My Planned Care** website allows patients to search by speciality and indicates how long they are likely to wait for a routine referral. <u>https://www.myplannedcare.nhs.uk/seast/east-kent/</u>

# Autumn Covid Boosters

As a local resident you are likely to have had your covid vaccinations done in either a Mass Vaccination Centre (such as Folca) or at Oaklands Health Centre. Oaklands gave their first vaccination on 21st December 2020 and were part of only a small group of surgeries who were involved in the initial roll-out. To date approximately 45,000 vaccinations have been given.

On the 15th July the Department of Health published the next phase of the covid vaccination campaign. Nicknamed the 'Autumn Boosters' this phase will provide an additional covid vaccination to the following groups of patients –

- Residents in a care home for older adults and staff working in care homes for older adults
- Frontline health and social care workers
- All adults aged 50 and over
- Those aged 5 to 49 years in a clinical risk group, including pregnant women
- Those aged 5 to 49 years who are household contacts of people with immunosuppression
- Those aged 16 to 49 years who are carers

Patients who fall within the groups above will receive an invite for the vaccination to be done at Oaklands Health Centre during the autumn or be able to book directly at one of the national Mass Vaccination Centres. GP surgeries ask that you do not ring to ask for an appointment and that all applicable patients will be invited to Oaklands or be able to book at a Mass Vaccination Centre in due course.

Other key risks include:

- Delays to Age UK and carers' services have been cited as key risks for the infirm or disabled.
- Businesses are already experiencing cancellations and fear significant losses as they try to recover from the pandemic.
- Access to doctors and to hospital.
- In these times of high fuel costs, many are worries about the additional costs to make basic journeys. A twice daily trip to/from Folkestone has been estimated as an extra 600 miles over 42 days costing about an extra £160.
- Deliveries to the village pharmacies, the food shop and to residents and other businesses.
- The overall environmental impact, including increased pollution, is also a matter of concern.

Until they protested, the Lyminge Parish council were not even consulted about the closure. They have since had a meeting with Pentland Homes and voiced the concerns of the village. They managed to get the closure reduced to a nominal 3-4 weeks, with a later lane closure, but this is not guaranteed. KCC claimed to have written to the community advising of the closure, but few have seen such a letter. Another closure is planned in October 2022 by Openreach.

Pentland Homes own Etchinghill Golf Course. When asked whether the drains could be dug via their land, or whether a temporary road could be built via the golf course, the answer was no, but no details were given. Civil engineers in the village have asked if other possibilities were considered but no response was provided.

The petition asks,' In the event that Pentland Homes chooses to proceed without further regard for our petition that you provide more support for the community including but not limited to support for residents suffering significant financial impact (i.e., easily accessible hardship fund to cover set of fuel and loss of revenue), better access solutions for omergeneous songices, and a cross village shuttle hus

cost of fuel and loss of revenue), better access solutions for emergency services, and a cross-village shuttle bus. Finally, we would also request you all to review what can be learned from how this unacceptable situation can occur.'

Local councillors Susan Carey and Jenny Hollingsbee, and the MP Damian Collins have also been addressing the proposed closure with the relevant authorities (see page 7).

# District Councillors' Update - August 2022

**Closure of Broad Street Lyminge** - KCC have planned to close Broad Street Lyminge for 42 days from 25 July. Jenny is in contact with KCC, Damian Collins MP and Officers' at the District Council to try to find an alternative solution to 42 days complete closure. This is a Kent Highways decision. Unfortunately, despite numerous emails and conversations, it seems as though KCC will go ahead with the closure. However, updates are coming through on a daily basis and Jenny was given this statement last night (18 July) from KCC " We are arranging for "Unsuitable for HGVs" signage to be deployed in order to protect



the shorter resident access diversion and will also be arranging "access to physical location" signs so that local residents can pinpoint more precisely the location of the works."

**Otterpool Park** - Otterpool Park LLP has teamed up with *Strange Cargo* to run some new free craft workshops at Westenhanger Castle throughout the school summer holidays.

Otterpool Green Stars (OGS) is a new initiative that encourages young people to think about their environment and the future. The events are the first of a series of OGS activities and will be held every Tuesday throughout the holidays, from 26 July, from 11am to 2pm. They are suitable for children aged 4 and over.

Everyone attending will receive a Otterpool Green Stars membership card with their photo on it. There will be range of fun craft activities, including:

- Create your own Otterpool Green Stars superhero and give them a superpower reducing pollution and waste, protecting plants and creatures, saving water and energy or make up your own!
- Make a clay pot and plant a seed to take home.

The workshops are free to attend, but places must be booked in advance through Eventbrite – just search for 'Westenhanger Castle.'

**Annual Canvass** - Residents in Folkestone & Hythe are being urged to check their details on the electoral register are correct to ensure they do not lose their voice on decisions that affect them. The annual canvass of all households in the district gets underway this week as part of the council's legal requirement to make sure the register is accurate and up to date every year.

**Scams** – there have been numerous internet, telephone and cold calling scams recently. If you are at all suspicious please call the Police on 101 or report on line or if an emergency call 999. **Consultation on taxi tariffs increase** - The public is to be asked about the first rise in licensed taxi fares in Folkestone & Hythe for 10 years. The maximum fare that hackney drivers can charge while they are working in the district is set by the council. Following 34 representations from local drivers, Planning & Licensing committee members agreed this week (28 June) to increase the baseline hackney tariff by 10% - the first rise since 2012. This will go out for a four-week public consultation and if no objections are received, the new fares will come into force.

**My Account** – is so much easier to use. Residents are encouraged to sign-up or if registered already, to have a look at the new 'front page' as it has recently been updated. Users are able to see council information relevant to them all in one place - including bin collections, benefits and council tax - as well as making payments and tracking the progress of reports made to officers.

# **Overtaking When Driving Or Cycling**

Living in a rural environment means that we often have to share the road with other users such as horse riders, pedestrians, cyclists, etc. A heightened awareness is needed since many of our roads in this area are narrow and tortuous. The following is a gentle reminder to us all as to how we should conduct ourselves when sharing the road with other users.

You may cross a double-white line if necessary (provided the road is clear) to overtake someone cycling or riding a horse if they are travelling at 10 mph or less (Rule 129).

There is updated guidance on safe passing distances and speeds for people driving or riding a motorcycle when overtaking vulnerable road users, including:

- leaving at least 1.5 metres (5 feet) when overtaking people cycling at speeds of up to 30mph, and giving them more space when overtaking at higher speeds passing people riding horses or driving horsedrawn vehicles at speeds under 10 mph and allowing at least 2 metres (6.5 feet) of space
- allowing at least 2 metres (6.5 feet) of space and keeping to a low speed when passing people walking in the road for example, where there's no pavement)
- · Wait behind them and do not overtake if it's unsafe or not possible to meet these clearances.

# LYMINGE PARISH COUNCIL August 2022 Newsletter

**ROAD CLOSURE AT BROAD STREET FROM 25 JULY FOR 42 DAYS** - By the time you read this, the planned closure at Broad Street may already have begun. This item was prepared on 17 July to meet the copy deadline for the Newsletter, so much may have happened in the meantime. This is to explain the background to the planned closure.

The complete closure of the road between New Barn and New Lyminge Surgery was planned for 42 days by Kent County Council Highways Department as the solution to allow various road works to proceed that are required as a result of the housing development by Pentland Homes on the Lyminge side of the Golf Course. KCC did not consult with the Parish Council on this closure in advance, so we had no input into the plan.

Since the planned closure became public in late June, we have been working hard with our local MP, District and County Councillors to get the scheme of road closure re-assessed so the road is not fully closed for 42 days. We have been told that the closure is planned this way for 2 key reasons:

 Drainage works at a depth of 3m are too deep, given the width of the road, to allow traffic to pass safely alongside while the work is in progress;  A variety of works is planned, in addition to the drainage works, including moving existing signage, installing new kerbs and painting new road markings, which together require 42 days to be completed.

We are not convinced that KCC has taken every step possible to minimise the length of this complete road closure. While understanding the safety issue that would prevent traffic continuing to use one side of the road, the complete closure of the road seems to be driven by the cost of an alternative. In busy cities, roads are not normally completely closed and deep excavations are shored up with piling to allow traffic to continue to pass close by. In addition, contractors could work through the night in order to complete the work more quickly. We are told that they will only work in daylight hours. Also, once the deep drainage works are complete, it is not clear to us why the whole road must continue to be closed, and why it would not be possible to keep half of it open and control traffic with lights.

The planned diversion from Beachborough roundabout to Yew Tree Cross is 10.4 miles, compared with the normal route via Lyminge of 3.3 miles. The Parish Council is deeply disappointed that KCC has made so little effort to minimise the impact of this work. They are asking local residents to bear the cost of longer journeys, and the inconvenience of disrupted travel. Car drivers will face a longer travel time between Lyminge and Folkestone. A shuttle bus will run between Sibton Park Gates (Lyminge) and Canterbury bus station throughout the day. Another shuttle will operate from New Barn Corner (Etchinghill) to Folkestone bus station. It is regrettable that KCC has not insisted on steps to mitigate the impact of the planned works, such as those identified here. We remain unconvinced that it is necessary to close the whole road for so long.

Whether our local politicians can force a rethink by the officers at KCC Highways Department remains to be seen. By the time you read this, you will know what has been possible. In any event, it is very disappointing that the County Council considers it appropriate to impose a major disruption on a local community without first consulting with any of the political representatives of that community.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED TO WATER THE JUBILEE AND OTHER TREES -

You will all have noticed how dry this year

has been so far, it has hardly rained since we planted all the Queen's Green Canopy trees back in March to celebrate Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee, and it doesn't look like it is going to rain any time soon. A great thanks therefore to Etchinghill Resident's Association for organising the watering twice weekly of the trees in Etchinghill, they are looking good thanks to that effort. In Rhodes Minnis we have one volunteer watering the fruit and nut trees occasionally, and all but one seem to be doing fine.

In Lyminge the rowan trees have been doing well so far, being located fairly close to the stream surely has helped.



However this past month they have started to show signs of wilting and so have received one or two waterings since then. We will need to start watering them regularly until such time as it rains properly again. We would therefore greatly appreciate it if anyone could help with watering, so that between us we could get a small group of volunteers to commit to watering them at least once a week, and if possible twice a week, through the summer. Other trees recently planted that would also benefit from volunteers watering them including the silver birches along the southern bank of Jubilee Field, the hedge along the top of Tayne Field, particularly at the end closest to the pub, and the fruit and nut trees at both ends of Rhodes Minnis Recreation Ground.

# **BioBlitz analysis: Lyminge-on-sea?**



As reported last month, we were very fortunate to have the Kent County Moth Recorder, Dave Shenton, join us during the Parish bioblitz. Dave has now confirmed a few more moth species, bringing the total to 170 different moth species recorded during the bioblitz weekend. Dave commented that "not only has the overall tally increased but we also added two species which are currently known mostly as coastal specialists! The Kent Case-bearer (Coleophora galbulipennella) and White-spot Groundling (Neofriseria peliella), both rare Red Data Book species, are mostly found at or around Dungeness but appear to call Lyminge home too. Whilst these two may not be the most striking to look at - they're certainly no Elephant Hawk-moth - they are really important records and add more power to the value of citizen science!"

# King Diving Beetle in Lyminge

Many thanks to Cllr Gillian Heywood for bringing a large beetle to our attention following the bioblitz, that was attracted to a patio light on Woodland Rd. With some expert help we have identified it as a King Diving Beetle (Dytiscus dimidiatus), very similar to the closely-related Great Diving Beetle (Dytiscus marginalis) but much rarer. A great record for Lyminge!
