# **Margaret Saunders' Meanderings**

There is a slight breeze and the blue sky is showing evidence of winds high up, with white wispy clouds interspersed with streaks of vapour trails, mostly Europe-bound. As I climb the steep path towards the brow of the hill, I look for evidence of fossils in the chalk, which only seem to appear in one very small area. A couple of lumps of chalk show signs of flat shell material and another has the tell-tale indentations of a clam. Rounding the corner and dodging into the edge of the wood to climb the stile, I enter a field of long grass whose seeds are nearing ripeness. Strong sunlight catches the hundreds of buttercups which mingle with the tall grass. The track cuts through the swaying grass and weaves its way across the top of the field as a magnificent view reveals itself spread out below to the south, with more fields full of golden buttercups.

Postling Wood is to my right and every so often a small animal track dives off through a hole in the undergrowth to disappear into the wood. An animal hole such as this is called a smeuse and is likely to have been made by rabbits, foxes, badgers or small rodents, whose nocturnal habits mean we seldom see them. I can no longer hear the larks whose song accompanied me on the earlier part of my walk, but now I see and hear a couple of buzzards, wheeling and circling over the wood emitting their plaintive mewling cry. Further away a kestrel hovers, patient, silent and still above its prey.

A triangle of ground left unploughed for many years is beginning to show signs of wild flower growth, which once the rains arrive, should blossom forth with a riotous variety of colour and shape, so essential for our diminishing insect population. Sitting on the dry ground I pause to take in the view, with the sea





forming the backdrop. The horizon is faintly misty but Dungeness and the wind farm near Rye are visible, the turning vanes of the latter just discernible. Further to the west the land rises to form the High Weald. Cloud shadows move across the landscape turning the fields a darker shade as they pass from west to east. As I sit and enjoy the scene comprising land, sea and sky, I cloud watch, looking for recognizable shapes. I spot a young chicken running from some unseen foe and a trail of steam as if coming from a steam engine at full speed. Some days lend themselves to cloud watching and this is one of them. Next to me, in the grass, three dewdrops along a blade of grass catch my eye, shining silver in the strong sunshine. Next to them smaller droplets have formed a jewelled rim around a clover leaf. These will soon vanish in the breeze and strengthening warmth of the sun as they begin to emerge from the shade of the taller grasses that surround them.

I have been keeping track of my walk using an app on my phone that shows me a map dating from between 1888 and 1930. It marks features such as old chalk pits and near me now I see there was a sand quarry. Walking along the footpaths today, I have come along smooth white chalk paths, creamy coloured clay paths that are beginning to resemble crazy paving due to the sustained period of dry weather, and now the colour has changed yet again as I am walking along a more sandy track.

Turning northwards I take a sunken lane downhill, taking note of all the wild flowers that inhabit the banks. White flowers include cow parsley, white deadnettle, wood anemone, ramsons, jack-in-the-hedge and greater stitchwort. Yellow flowers are dandelions, buttercups, yellow archangel, celandines, groundsel and yellow herb bennet. Pink and purple are red campion, herb-robert, red deadnettle, ground ivy plus two blue flowers – bluebell and alkanet. Oceans of ransoms fill a cleared woodland area, releasing their gentle garlic scent. A pile of wood is burning, a thin plume of smoke rising skywards until a puff of wind sends it sideways and into my nostrils – a pleasingly sweet and rural smell. I descend back into the village - today's walk has been balm for the soul.

### District Councillors' Update - June 2022

Around 40,000 households in the Folkestone & Hythe District were due to receive a £150 Energy Bill Rebate. Properties in council bands A to D are eligible and those who pay their council tax by direct debit should have received this payment automatically in April or early May. Those residents who do not pay by direct debit should have received a letter asking them to apply for the rebate. Those who do not reply within 28 days will receive a credit on their council tax account for £150 which will either reduce their present bill or, if the account is fully paid it will be held as a credit. The resident can ask for that sum to be



paid to them. There's more information on the council website <u>www.folkestone-hythe.gov.uk</u> One Lyminge resident has said he'd prefer the council to keep this payment but we'd like everyone to know that whilst the payment comes via the council it is funded by the Government and our services are in no way reduced by the payment.

We've written many times about Otterpool Park Garden Town which will provide the majority of the housing and employment sites required for the next decade and more in our district. The Otterpool Park site is between Westenhanger railway station and near Junction 11 of the M20 taking in Stanford and Westenhanger and extending towards Lympne and Sellindge but with buffer zones between. There's now a planning application submitted for the very first stage of the town. For those without internet access, a paper copy of the updated application can be viewed by appointment at the Civic Centre in Folkestone. Please call customer services on 01303 853000 for details. Stanford Parish Council also has a paper copy of the application, which can be viewed at Stanford Parish Room, Folkestone Racecourse. To make an appointment, please call the parish clerk on 01303 814283. A public consultation now runs until Friday 24 June. Anyone wishing to comment can visit the planning portal or you can email your comments to: otterpool.applications@folkestone-hythe.gov.uk

Many people make the point that existing communities can struggle to cope with new homes and building a new town allows facilities to be built in step or in advance of need. We have supported Otterpool Park as we believe it will not only be an attractive place to live and work with its own schools, medical facilities, parks etc. but it will also limit the number of extra homes/employment sites across the rest of our district.

Jenny has been in the lead for the District Council in co-ordinating efforts to welcome the Ukrainian refugees and parish councils and local societies are invited to a Community Safety Event to discuss this. Do contact Jenny if you would like to be part of these efforts. Susan attended a fund-raising quiz for Ukraine held in Etchinghill Village Hall on 23 April and was pleased to meet the Ukrainian family in the village. We are likely to see more such refugees as around 8,000 households in Kent have volunteered to take part in the homes for Ukraine scheme.

# FOCUS ON LYMINGE LIBRARY

The Elham Valley Railway ran from Canterbury to Folkestone through Lyminge from 1887 until 1947, when it was closed down. The station building, situated in The Sidings, off Station Road, then became a home and was eventually converted into a cosy library. Lyminge Library has been closed over the last 2 years because of covid, but has now re-opened and is welcoming everyone back.

When I called into the Library at the beginning of May, I met Louise and Helen, who happily answered my questions about what is being planned at the library over the next few months. The group meetings and events mark a return to normality after a very difficult couple of years:

**Baby Rhyme Time** will have re-started on Thursday 12th May at 10.15am. This is a fun time for pre- school children aged 0 – 4 years old and parents/guardians.

**Talk Time** will be restarting on Fridays at 10.15am for coffee and a chat with occasional speakers.

**Poetry Group** will be restarting on the last Tuesday of the month, 10.30-11.30am.

There will be a **Summer Reading Challenge** from July to September for 4 – 12 year olds.

**Ukrainian Families**, who have moved to the area are encouraged to go into the Library with a member of their host family (who needs to take proof of address) so they can be registered and they will receive their own card.

We are lucky to have our community library and we need to use it to keep it as a vibrant focal point and asset in our village. Books, both reference and fiction, books for homework/projects /research as well as dyslexia friendly books for juniors, can be taken out for 3 weeks at a time. Books can also be reserved from other libraries. It can be contacted by either phone: 03000 41 31 31 or email: LymingeLibrary@kent.gov.uk

Besides books, there are also computers, photocopying, and printing facilities together with a free wi-fi.

The Kent County Council website is very helpful, but nothing replaces being able to talk to a librarian!

#### Notes on using iRecord

Please try to submit your wildlife observations online using <u>iRecord.org.uk</u>, this will allow us to create summaries of the results of the bioblitz. There are two versions, an online version and an app that can be downloaded onto your phone. The phone app is great for adding real-time observations when you're out and about, with the app taking advantage of the GPS capacity of the phone to locate where you are making an observation. The online version is better for recording observations once you're back home with a computer, and for exploring and editing your records, and for viewing other people's records. All observations submitted to **iRecord** are automatically incorporated into national wildlife databases, available to experts for reviewing observations and for research and monitoring. Entering records is fairly self-explanatory, and if possible try to use location names that will be easily understood and useful for sorting records, for example by starting with the village name (eg. "Lyminge - Ethelburga Grove" or "Rhodes Minnis Recreation Ground"). Adding photos to observations is always helpful as well, but the main thing is to enjoy making any contributions you can.
