The Queen's Platinum Jubilee 2022 is set to run over the long weekend, Thursday 2nd to Sunday 5th June, which happens to coincide with the Spring Bank Holiday and half term.

Margaret Saunders' Meanderings

Broad brushstrokes of watery white clouds paint the pale blue sky and the air is bracing. The field I am in runs parallel to Longage Hill and faces south. Fresh molehills are dotted along and either side of the footpath, indicating a soil rich with worms. It is too early in the year for flowers but there is plenty of evidence of last year's ragwort, their rusty coloured seedheads still standing. Fresh green graces the fields from winter sown crops that are beginning to put on growth. Here and there are spent maize cobs from a distant field, brought by bird or rabbit perhaps. A blackthorn tree in a hedge is already beginning to show swelling blossom buds and the occasional leaf buds of elder have started to open but the rest of the hedgerow and trees are still stark and bare. These are signs of early Spring and are welcome after the short dull days of Winter.



With the sun gaining in strength, and shadows showing evidence of shortening, in this sheltered field its rays are beginning to warm me. I pass two fallen ash trees, their demise having taken place probably some decades ago. One is a pure tangle of trunk, branches and twigs, all having steadily decayed, with new slender branches growing upwards from the base of the tree, which remains at right angles to the ground where it was uprooted. This jumble will be providing rich sources of food and housing for myriads of insects. The second tree has split from the main trunk and its long thick branches, mostly

lying parallel to the ground, show some evidence of continuing growth. Insects have bored into the now soft interior of the original trunk and black fungal growths, hard and shiny, are attached to the outer

bark, year round. These are commonly known as King Alfred's cakes (*Daldinia concentrica*). They can be used as tinder and archaeological evidence has been found in Spain showing that they were used for firelighting over 7,000 years ago. The fungus does not harm a tree, it is a 'saprotroph', which means it decays already dead plant material. On close inspection of the smooth barkless branches, small whorls decorate an otherwise plain surface, and one or two tiny insects can be seen moving quite quickly over the wood.

Amongst the branches, and very much alive, a great tit flits, singing its well known 'teacherteacher' song. Life and death living side by side, death giving the means for new life to rise from the ashes, literally.



Bob Webb 1923 - 2021

Bob sadly passed away on Christmas Day 2021 after a short illness. He had lived in Lyminge for just over 98 years. Bob was one of six children and was born in Wesley Terrace. He went to Lyminge Primary School until the age of 13 then went to work for The Lyminge Newsagent (where the cafe is now). There he delivered newspapers, worked in the shop as well as serving petrol at the pumps which were on the pavement outside.

After 2 years, Bob joined local firm JJ Clayson as an apprentice painter and decorator. He wasn't there long when at 18, he was called up to the Army to go and fight in The Second World War. Bob served as a gunner in The Royal Artillery and saw action in Italy at The Battle of Montecasino among many others, and was taken to many places including Egypt, Israel and Yugoslavia.

When the war was over, Bob left the Army and re-joined JJ Clayson and remained there until they ceased trading. He then went to work for Hythe builders Charlier & Son where he was the painting and decorating manager until he retired aged 67. He then taught painting and decorating part-time at South Kent College until he finally called it a day aged 70.

During his working life, Bob became a Master Decorator and was a very talented signwriter. He painted many of the village shop fronts, church signs as well as the church clock and his handiwork can still be seen on some house name boards in the village.

Bob was married to Olive for 63 years until she passed away in 2009 following a stroke. They had 2 children, Bryan who lives in Broadstairs and Sandra who still lives in the village and one grandson, Nick who lives in Hong Kong.

In his younger days, Bob was a talented footballer, playing for Folkestone and Dover as well as other local teams. Ever the sportsman, Bob took up golf when he retired and continued playing into his 90s. Not one to sit still, he was also a keen gardener and had an allotment behind the Methodist Church for many years.

Since Bob's death, Sandra found that he had written his life story when he was 90. At the end he wrote the following words: 'By Bob, four score years and ten - what a wonderful life'.

Bob was well known in the village and had a very happy and sunny nature. He will be sadly missed by his family and friends but they are comforted to know that he lived a very full and happy life in the village that he loved.

Sandra and the family would like to thank everyone who attended Bob's funeral and for the messages of condolence that have been received.

District Councillors' Update - March 2022



A reminder that the District Council has been given a Government Grant to help households that are struggling to afford essential food and utility bills and have no other available support. This Household Support Fund is available until 31 March for families with or without children and (subject to fund availability) it is open to anyone living in the district aged 16 or over in a vulnerable household. Full details can be found at https://www.folkestone-hythe.gov.uk/household-support-fund

The District Council has also been administering Government grants to help businesses

and organisations impacted by Covid and there have been special grants for projects supporting vulnerable residents. There are many schemes in place to help those in financial difficulty and a good place to ask for advice is Kent Together. Go to www.kent.gov.uk/kenttogether or call 03000 41 92 92.

We're pleased to report that the District Council is taking part in two Environmental schemes led by Susan in her KCC role. Solar Together is a collective buying scheme for solar panels and batteries open to all Kent householders, businesses and community buildings. For more information see https://solartogether.co.uk/folkestone-and-hythe/home

The other scheme is the EV600 network where KCC has partnered with Connected Kerb and councils across Kent to provide 600 Electric Vehicle Charging Points in council owned car parks. The ones in our district should be in operation by the time this newsletter appears.

Thank you to those of you who gave their views on the District Council's budget. The consultation on this closed on 01 February and we set our budget on for 2022/23 at a meeting of the full council on 23 February. The District Council will then issue the council tax bill on behalf of all the bodies entitled to set council tax – these include your Parish Council, the District Council, Kent Police and Kent Fire & Rescue Service.

You may be aware that the Great British Spring Clean takes place 25 March – 10 April but did you know that there are people who are looking after our environment year round? Across our district over 200 individuals regularly collect the litter others so carelessly leave in their wake. We're also grateful for the volunteers who turn out for community litterpicks in Lyminge and Etchinghill.

The District Council will be holding a public consultation from 24 February to 04 May on its Dog Control Public Space Protection Orders. These set out where dogs must be on a lead or are banned completely. If you have views on this do take the opportunity to respond to the consultation.

NEW CLERK - We are very pleased to announce that Sarah Harrison has been appointed as Clerk to Lyminge Parish Council with effect from 1st February 2022. Cherri Norman is continuing as our Responsible Financial Office and we would like to thank her for her past hard work as Clerk.

A few words from Sarah to introduce herself: Hello, my name is Sarah Harrison and I am delighted to be appointed the new Lyminge Parish Clerk. My husband, daughter and I moved from Ashford nearly 5 years ago and absolutely love living here. After Ava was born, we decided we wanted her to grow up in a village setting, attend a small primary school and for us to all be part of a community. We love our daily dog walks and the wonderful people we have met.

I am excited to see what new things will come to the village from the re-vamp of the play parks to embracing and nurturing more wildlife in the area and getting to know more people - Sarah Harrison, Clerk to Lyminge Parish Council

PRECEPT FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR ENDING 31st MARCH 2023 - Each year in January, the Parish Council has to decide what money we will need in the following financial year, beginning in April, firstly to manage the things for which we are responsible in law, secondly to maintain the assets that we look after on behalf of the parish, and thirdly to deliver improvements in facilities where we think this will be beneficial. The amount we need to do all these things is known as the Parish Precept, and this is collected for us by Folkestone and Hythe District Council through the Council Tax that is paid by every household. Compared to the amounts you pay to Kent County Council and to the District Council, the proportion of your total Council Tax received by the Parish Council is very small. You can see how much it is on the Council Tax bill you receive each year from the District Council. But though it is a relatively small amount, the Precept is used by the Parish Council specifically for the benefit of local people, so you receive a very direct payback.

Within the Parish, there are many different interest groups. We try to spread the money we have available over as wide a range of activities as possible. Not everyone receives an equal benefit from each pound spent, but overall, the intention is to use the money we have to make the Parish a better place to live. Better facilities and an improved environment enhance the quality of life. So each year, we seek to undertake one or more capital projects aimed at delivering improvements. In the year that is just ending, we have funded major environmental works in Court Lodge Green ("the Bumpy Field"). These works are still in progress, but when they are complete, the area around the pond, should be greatly enhanced for wildlife. Further environmental works were carried out during the year on Tayne Field and in Well Field. In addition, the well house over St Eadburg's Well, which was built in 1898, was extensively repaired so that the structure will continue to stand into the future. We have plans for other capital projects in the coming year.

In a normal year, the majority of the annual Precept is spent on maintaining existing facilities. The amount we spend on such things goes up each year through inflation and we have to cover this cost. Next year, recurring maintenance will account for some 62%, just under two thirds, of the Precept. The rest will be allocated to one-off projects. In addition to the Precept, if planning permission is granted for the two housing developments on the Golf Course site, the Council can also expect to receive money from the developer. This is a statutory levy quantified by the size of the development. Our budgeting for 2022/23 is taking this into account, although we cannot treat this money as certain until the development actually begins.

Our plans for the next financial year therefore include a number of projects. We hope we will be able to carry them all through, but at the moment this is not certain because the Golf Course development has still not received planning consent. This note is to give you a better understanding of what is planned so you know why we have set the Parish Precept at the level we have:

• We are providing funding designed to support a range of activities to take place to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee in June. Work is currently in hand to identify the activities, who will run them and what this will cost, so we can allocate the funds appropriately.

- Last year, we committed to providing a sum each year to cover small scale environmental projects in addition to large scale work such as that carried out in the Bumpy Field. We have renewed this commitment in 2022/23 and this will enable work to be carried out in a range of locations right across the parish in accordance with the plan created by our Natural Environment Working Group.
- The running track in Jubilee Field was installed many years ago, and the surface has now deteriorated badly. We plan to renew and upgrade the surface to make it easier to maintain in future, and to create a much better all-weather facility.
- The skate park in Jubilee Field needs upgrading and we have allocated a substantial proportion of the funding we believe is required to carry this work through. We intend to explore grant opportunities to cover the balance needed for this work to proceed.
- The existing children's play facilities in Jubilee Field have deteriorated to the point where they need to be replaced entirely. We plan to undertake this work with some of the money we will receive as a consequence of the Golf Course development.
- Plans have been in hand for some years to replace the existing play facilities on Tayne Field with an expanded range of equipment in two zones, one aimed at younger children and the other at an older age group. There will also be seating integrated into the design that will make it easier for families to spend time together. We have been working closely with Lyminge Youth Action on the delivery of this project. LYA themselves have done great work already securing grants and donations. In order to undertake this work, we will combine this money already collected by LYA with some funding from the Precept for 2022/23 and will also utilise the bulk of the levy we will receive as a result of the Golf Course development.

of this work represents significant Much improvement and upgrading of existing facilities that have reached the end of their useful life. These are all facilities that we believe contribute significantly to the quality of life in the parish, and as a Council we are committed to ensuring that they continue to be available for residents. In this respect, with so much work that needs to be done, we are fortunate that we will receive a substantial six figure sum as a result of the statutory levy on the new development on the Golf Course, but even that is not enough to cover everything that needs to be done. We will raise the balance of funding needed through the Precept for 2022/23. The increase for a Band D property will amount to 32.8p per week. Overall, this will deliver an extra sum amounting to a little over £20,000. This will be ploughed back into the community immediately through the projects outlined above.

In the wake of the Covid Pandemic, we have all come to appreciate the benefits of social activity out of doors. As a Council we believe that the projects we are planning for 2022/23 will deliver substantial benefits for everyone and will do much to make our community an even more attractive place to live. Through the Precept, we spread the cost across all households. In this way, we believe the Precept still represents exceptional value for money, and it remains the most effective way to deliver benefits for the community as a whole. - *Rob Baldwin, Chair, Finance and Admin Committee*

QUEEN'S GREEN CONOPY TREE PLANTING -

The Queen's Green Canopy (QGC) is a unique tree planting initiative created to mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee in 2022 which invites people from across the United Kingdom to "Plant a Tree for the Jubilee". With a focus on planting sustainably, the QGC will encourage planting of trees to create a legacy in honour of The Queen's leadership of the Nation, which will benefit future generations. (See https://queensgreencanopy.org/).

Lyminge Parish Council has agreed to support the planting of QGC trees in each of Lyminge, Etchinghill and Rhodes Minnis. The proposal for Lyminge is to plant seven rowan trees on Tayne Field, the exact location yet to be decided. In Etchinghill the proposal is to plant seven flowering cherry trees on the FHDC-owned field in front of the village hall, and in Rhodes Minnis it is to plant fruit and nut trees on the LPC-owned field beside the allotments. Planting is hoped to be organised before the end of March, to give the trees the best chance of Official QGC establishing. commemorative plaques are likely to be placed at each set of planted trees.

Local organisations are invited to contribute to the costs of one or more trees, or equally to make alternative arrangements for participating in the QGC initiative. Anyone who would like to participate or to provide feedback is welcome to contact us via the clerk.

Gardening for Pollinators

Pollination is at the heart of plant reproduction and therefore is crucial for food production and a host of ecosystem services, from flood control to nutrient cycling to our own aesthetic experiences. Wild insect species, especially bees, butterflies, hoverflies, wasps, moths

etc., are thought to be responsible for twice as much agricultural pollination in Britain as are managed honey bees. And yet wild pollinators are struggling, nationally and globally. I have been observing our local pollinators within the parish for a few years now, and have seen first-hand the way gardens and other green spaces can help pollinators and consequently help maintain our food supply and other aspects of our lives. We have a great variety of pollinators in Lyminge Parish, including at least 75 different species of bee (most of which are solitary bees, rather than the better known social bumblebees and honey bees), 50 hoverflies, 50 wasps, 25 butterflies and 500 moths. But how can we help pollinators in our own gardens?

Creating wild areas is important, including diverse habitats such as ponds, compost heaps, decaying wood, or bee-hotels, as is having hedges of native





many hoverfly larvae, and so on. Additional resources required by our pollinators include mud for mason bees to seal their nests, certain types of leaves for leafcutter bees to do the same, and undisturbed sheltered sites for some adult bumblebees, wasps, butterflies and hoverflies to hibernate over winter.

Early flowering willows are important for pollinators



flowering plants. In general, whilst many of our non-native garden flowers can be used by generalist pollinators, to help the more specialised native pollinators you really need native flowers, and you need to think about seasons. Early season flowers can be particularly rare so make sure you have some of them - dandelions are very good, lesser celandine, red campion, ground ivy, wild primrose, English bluebells, goat willow, grey willow, cherry plum, and then many of the slightly later flowering spring blossom trees such as apples, cherries etc. Cow parsley is very good for mini-mining bees in April/May. Mid season there are plenty of flowers around, ragwort is a favourite of native pollinators, while red clover, bird's-foot trefoil, hedge woundwort, ox-eye daisy, wild carrot, yarrow, hogweed, knapweed, dogwood, and field maple, are all great for bees and other pollinators. Late season the best are probably bramble, late-flowering Asteraceaes (Autumn hawkbit for example), and ivy. There are several native wild-flower seed-mixes available commercially that include a selection of these flowers, plus I'd suggest some of those spring-flowering shrubs/trees. A flowering lawn is great as well transforming a grass mono-culture to a diverse habitat of native grasses, clovers, trefoils, self-heals etc., beautiful and great for pollinators!

Providing flowers for pollinators is only part of the story though. In simple terms, pollinators need food, shelter and breeding sites. Most pollinators in the UK are

adult insects, but before they become pollinators they tend to have even more diverse needs food plants for caterpillars, wellstocked food larders for bee grubs, moist or wet habitats for

Letters To The Editor..... Station Road Notice Board

I am greatly disappointment that the Parish Council have decided to remove the community advertising space from the notice board in the Station Road Carpark. This advertising space has always been available on the back of the Council boards for our large number of groups during the 18 years I have been in the village. I was concerned last year when they replaced the wooden one for a metal fully lockable unit, but they assured me the rear would be left unlocked for the public use. Below is the reply I received from a Parish Councillor when I questioned why the board was locked after they had installed two walking posters created by the Elham Valley Walkers Group in conjunction with the Council which takes up two thirds of the space leaving one third clear.

"The situation is that we planned the new noticeboard arrangement on the basis that the new visitor poster would be displayed on one side and the other side would be available for other things, which could include village event notices. Then we received the offer from EVWG of the new posters which seemed too good an opportunity to turn down, but the new posters do take up space. The reality is that even though there is some space left, it would not look good to add village notices in the small amount of unused space. So we will most likely look to fill this with other walking related material. This means there is no space in the Station Rd car park for village notices except in the Lyminge Association board.

At the moment, LPC is offering two noticeboards in the village to advertise village activities. There are no plans to install another board, but we will see what the demand for another is. It is a question of demand."

Let us show the Council that there is a demand for free to use Notice Board at the Station Road car park area in addition to the other two boards around the village by sending a letter from each of the groups to the Parish Council; their email and postal address is on the Council's green pages.

I am not against advertising our area to visitors or the walkers that the area receives but that should not be at the expense of the resident's assets.

Thanks to the Lyminge Historical Society, they are to allow groups to place their posters on the back of their metal Diamond Jubilee Board using the magnets which they will supply.

Reply from Rob Baldwin, Chair, Finance and Administration Committee, Lyminge Parish Council

Richard Chubb's letter to the Editor quotes our initial response to him concerning why the rear of the Parish Council Noticeboard in the Station Road Car Park is no longer available to advertise village activities. Over the past 12 months, in partnership with community groups, the Council has put a lot of effort into developing and supporting new publicly available information about our parish. We believe that the display across the noticeboards in the car park is useful to both residents and visitors alike and makes good use of the space. We think this is beneficial for our community, and provides a good welcome to encourage visitors to stop and explore.

It is difficult at the present time to gauge the need for noticeboard space to take notices about village activities, not least because the Covid Pandemic has disrupted the normal routine. When we put up the new material in the car park in the middle of January, there was one notice advertising a village activity and one promoting a commercial activity. By contrast, the noticeboards on Tayne Field and at the end of the High Street have remained well-used throughout the pandemic. This is simply our observation.

As Richard says at the end of his letter, the Committee of Lyminge Historical Society has now agreed that magnets will be provided so that the rear of the LHS board can be used for notices going forward. This will be helpful in assessing whether there is a need for public noticeboard space in the car park. The Parish Council is not averse to putting up a new noticeboard in this area, or indeed elsewhere in the parish, if there is a need. But at the moment, this need remains to be demonstrated.
