## 'Elham Valley Ukraine Support Group'

The 'Elham Valley Ukraine Support Group' has been set up to help sponsors who have registered under the government 'Homes for Ukraine' scheme to link up to Ukrainian refugees. By facilitating such things as initial and ongoing queries, video calls between the two parties and helping with visa applications, we have so far helped match seventeen households within the Elham Valley.

We are working in conjunction with the several local hubs that have also been set up and are compiling a list of local volunteers to help with a wide variety of things, such as transport, car sharing and any form of social activities, such as play dates for little ones, outings, coffee mornings and meet & greet days - the possibilities are endless. We also need people who are able to offer English lessons and act as translators. We are delighted that offers of employment, treatments and other services have already been pledged. As we live in a rural area and public transport isn't always available when required, and so a directory of willing helpers is being compiled who

could drive our local Ukrainian visitors to attend job interviews, shopping, doctors, dentists or car share on shopping trips, days out, etc.

Our group feel very fortunate to live in such a beautiful, peaceful place as the Elham Valley, and in return we feel that we are very privileged to be able to help ease the traumatic experiences these people have had to endure in any little way we are able.

We still have a need for more host families. PLEASE contact us, as any offer of help - no matter how large or small - will be really appreciated.

#### **Margaret Saunders' Meanderings**

Dandelions dot the field I am walking in, their colour strong and cheery. This flower is seen by most people as a weed that is troublesome to remove from lawns. It also goes under the names of Irish daisy, wild endive, faceclock, swine's snout, and blowball. The name dandelion comes from the French, 'dents de lion', meaning lion's teeth, referring to the jagged shape of the long leaves.

To most gardeners, the dandelion is a stubborn weed which is very difficult to eradicate permanently, partly due to its long and strong roots. Unless the whole root is removed, it will re-grow with as much vigour as previously, and this is one of its strengths. Another strength is its method of seed dispersal. We all know the fun children have, and ourselves too, if truth be known, in blowing the dandelion 'clocks', arriving at the time by counting each puff. When left to nature, these seeds, designed to be airborne, can be carried for miles in strong winds, ending up in new environments, where they can germinate and flourish - they need very little soil in which to get a purchase. Its flower is reminiscent of the sun and its seed head that of the moon. Whole areas of fields in Spring can be full of its cheerful blooms, almost shouting for joy with the vibrancy of its yellow flowers, followed shortly by the quieter silvery

Dandelions have other strengths too - medicinal. It is reputed to lower cholesterol, act as both a laxative and diuretic (a French name is 'pis-en-lit'!), and work as a skin healer. It is also rich in Vitamins A, B, C and folic acid and contains iron, copper, calcium, potassium and manganese. The young leaves are edible and add a certain piquancy to salads, so, we should be eating dandelions in order to benefit from all the goodness they contain, rather than pulling them up. Their cheerful appearance, especially when seen in large quantities, might also be said to act as a visual 'pick-me-up', uplifting to the mind and spirit.

white 'clocks', their soft spheres catching the sunlight on bright days.

Bordering one side of this field is a mixed hedge comprising hawthorn, holly, horse chestnut, hazel, beech, blackthorn and hawthorn, all at different stages of Spring growth. It is the horse chestnut's sticky buds which attract me today,

rich, red and shiny that will gradually open into beautiful palmate leaves, followed by dramatic flowers.

A wren flies up in front of me, onto the trunk of a mature tree which is entwined with thick and woody ivy stems. Skittering up the trunk, its milk chocolate colouring makes it difficult for me to keep it in my sights. It is nest building time, and birds are busy collecting material to build a vast variety of dwellings suitable for rearing their young.

With this in mind, please ensure you have your cameras ready to capture ...that quirky shot, ....that special smile, ...the unique time and situation.



#### District Councillors' Update - May 2022

Here's a quick summary of work under way in our district to support those fleeing Ukraine and seeking to settle in the district:





- A Council web page www.folkestone-hythe.gov.uk/community/support-for-Ukraine provides updated information on support available for those taking part in the Homes for Ukraine programme. Welcome Packs with advice and guidance for hosts and families is being translated into Ukrainian and Russian.
- A dedicated telephone number (01303 853600) and email address (Ukraine@folkestone-hythe.gov.uk) have been set-up to manage enquiries which come to the Council. (This is in addition to KCC's dedicated contact number 03000 412424.)
- The three Community Hubs in Hythe, Folkestone and New Romney which we used during lockdown have been reestablished as local contact points to support both hosts and guests, offering initial support and signposting to other services as required. We are working closely with KCC and the Hubs will also be a base for KCC Support Workers who will provide local bespoke support for each household.
- A Folkestone & Hythe Ukraine Community Support Network has been started and this includes key local stakeholders, voluntary groups, charities and the Council. The aim of the group is to ensure that key role played by the voluntary sector and our communities across the district is co-ordinated and good practice shared.

On 30 March the Full Council debated the final iteration of our Core Strategy which sets out where development (homes, employment sites, retail and leisure) should be sited. We're pleased to report that it was agreed and our district now has significant protection from speculative development.

The Council has recently issued a District Wide Carbon Plan which is intended to involve the whole district in carbon reduction. Full details are on the website and it is hoped individuals and communities from across the district will get involved.

Susan attended Postling Parish Council on 29 March and briefly joined the Etchinghill Litterpick on 09 April to do the official photos. Both Jenny and Susan attended two of the preview events for F51 the world class indoor skatepark venue. As well as skateboarding it also offers wall climbing, bouldering, BMXing and boxing. It's a truly remarkable building filled with art (one of the walls is by Banksy) and is being run by the Sports Trust (Sir Roger de Haan's sports charity). Why is it called F51? #### **CLARIFICATION AND CORRECTION**

In the April Newsletter there was a brief outline of the Parish Council's role in the village.

The Council would firstly like to clarify the reference to "being responsible for running the structure of the parish". Lyminge Parish Council is indeed responsible for a number of structures within the village, such as St Eadburg's Well, the Bus Shelters and Notice Boards. Also some of the open spaces such as Jubilee Field, part of the Tayne Field, Rhodes Minis Allotments and Lyminge Village Hall Car Park. However, the Parish Council is not responsible for a number of other facilities such as the Toilets, the Station Road Car Park and Street Lighting which come under Folkestone and Hythe District Council (FHDC). If you are in any doubt about where such responsibilities lie, please contact the Clerk for further clarification.

Secondly, Lyminge Parish Council do not have authority to approve planning applications; that is the responsibility of FHDC. The Parish Council do, however, see all planning applications and have the opportunity to comment, object or support any of these proposals.

## LYMINGE PARISH COUNCIL

#### May 2022 Newsletter

Forthcoming Council and Committee Agendas are displayed on the Council notice boards on Tayne Field and the entrance to the Village Hall car park, Etchinghill. Agendas and minutes are published on the Council's website: <a href="www.lymingeparishcouncil.org.uk">www.lymingeparishcouncil.org.uk</a> and Facebook page. We invite you to read the minutes online or on the noticeboards which may provide the information you are seeking regarding a particular item, but correspondence is always welcome from parishioners and can be sent to the Clerk at the addresses given at the bottom of this page.

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING v ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING – both these meetings are normally held in May, but what is the difference?

Like any other organisation, the Parish Council needs to hold an annual meeting to carry out those things that are only done once a year, such as electing a Chairman, appointing committees and appointing representatives to other local bodies. This is known as the Annual General Meeting. Members of the public can attend but cannot speak at this meeting.

The Annual Parish Meeting is a meeting of all electors within the parish and any elector can speak on any matter of local interest. If present, the Chair of the Parish Council must by law chair the Annual Parish Meeting, but it is not a meeting of the Parish Council. The meeting may discuss parish affairs, and may pass resolutions, but these are not on the whole binding on the Parish Council. The meeting gives a chance for electors to make the Parish Council aware of matters of concern. This meeting will have its own minutes which are kept separately from the meeting minutes of the Parish Council.

In Lyminge we also treat the Annual Parish Meeting as an opportunity for parishioners to hear what the council has accomplished during the last year. Village groups and organisations are also invited to submit a short report on the year's activities and any plans for the future.

**SPEEDWATCH** - a new coordinator is urgently needed in order to start up the Speedwatch again this year. Additional volunteers are also required. If you think you could help either as the coordinator or as a member of the team, please contact the Clerk who will forward your details to the Speedwatch Team.

**PARKING ON YELLOW LINES** – There continues to be a problem with motorists parking inconsiderately on yellow lines around the village, in particular near the shop and near the pharmacy. We would remind everyone that you should not park on double yellow lines at any time and that you should not park on single lines in the village between 8.30am and 6.30pm.

**QUEEN'S JUBILEE** - Council are pleased to confirm that grants have been awarded to a number of groups to help fund the costs of proposed events to celebrate the Queen's Jubilee.

**EV CHARGING POINTS** – You may have seen that work has been taking place in Station Road Car Park, to install Electric Vehicle Charging Points. These are part of a joint project between KCC, FHDC and Connected Kerb. We are advised the charging points should be commissioned by the end of April and the 4 parking bays behind the feeder pillar will be for EV charging only.

#### QUEEN'S GREEN CANOPY TREES PLANTED

As explained in previous newsletters, the Parish Council has supported the participation of our villages in the Queen's Green Canopy initiative to mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee. In Lyminge seven rowan trees were planted on Tayne Field with support from the Lyminge Association, Lyminge Gardener's Society, Lyminge Cantores, Lyminge Historical Society and Lyminge Climate Action.

Rowan is a small native tree that has white flowers in spring and red berries in autumn, and as such is great for bees, birds and other local wildlife. According to the Woodland Trust, "bane of witches, diviner of the future and producer of jam, rowan is an elegant tree with a mystical history".

In Etchinghill seven flowering cherries were planted on St Mary's field with support from Folkestone and Hythe District Council, Etchinghill Residents Association and Etchinghill Village Hall. Two flowering almonds and two purple-leaf "Pissardi" cherry plums comprise the back row, whilst the front row consists of three slightly later-flowering "Okame" cherries. In Rhodes Minnis seven fruit and nut trees were planted on the Recreation Ground, comprising two eating apples (Spartan and Sunset), a pear (Concorde), a cherry (Stella), a plum (Marjories Seedling), an almond (Ingrid) and a walnut (Buccaneer). All these trees have been registered on the Queen's Green Canopy online map, as have the 106 trees planted around Lyminge kindly by Lyminge Scouts, provided by The

Conservation Volunteers (TCV) and Kent Men of Trees. Thanks to everyone who helped with the planting of all these trees.

RHODES MINNIS RECREATION GROUND MANAGEMENT PLAN -- In Rhodes Minnis the 7 Queen's Green Canopy trees are contributing to a new management plan to improve the biodiversity value of the Recreation Ground whilst also providing a variety of edible fruit and nut trees for the benefit of the local community. To this end two Kent cobnut bushes were planted alongside the QGC fruit and nut trees, five rowans were planted in the north-west corner of the field (great for biodiversity and for making jellies and jams), and some damson seedlings were added into the hedge along the road to the allotments.

We hope to add a few more edible fruit and nut trees around the edges of the field in due course, and we will try to modify the mowing regime of the field to encourage more wildflowers to flourish (following a similar strategy to that implemented for Court Lodge Green in Lyminge).

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN - What is a Neighbourhood Plan? - Lyminge Parish council have decided to embark on a major development with and on behalf of the local community. We wish to develop a Neighbourhood Plan that will take the next few years to develop with you all, but we believe there will be many important benefits for the community.

A Neighbourhood Plan puts in place planning policy for a neighbourhood area to guide future development. It is about the use and development of land and allows local community representatives to have a say in proposed future developments. It also deals with a wide range of social, economic and environmental issues (such as housing, employment, design, heritage and transport) and will be used by us, your parish council, to help us make the best decisions for the community. Why do we want a Neighbourhood Plan? - A Neighbourhood Plan is important and offers you, the residents of the Parish, a number of advantages:

- It is community led which means that local community organisations, like your Parish Council, will engage with the community to make sure the plan genuinely represents the range of wants and needs in our local area
- A Neighbourhood Plan gives the community more influence in planning considerations and as it is a statutory document all planning decisions must take it into account
- A Neighbourhood Plan is focused on the needs of our specific neighbourhood and allows the local community to specify what they expect from development. This might include things like urban design, allocation of affordable housing and other developments
- The initial discussion, that we will undertake this year, will establish a range of relationships and conversations, which may not otherwise take place, and may potentially influence the activities of other local organisations
- The Neighbourhood Plan allows the community to develop criteria and an approach to choose sites to be allocated for different kinds of development. At the same time there is the option to identify and designate green spaces valued by the community as Local Green Space, which should be protected from inappropriate development
- Should future developments be allowed the neighbourhood plan will mean that a larger contribution must be made to the Parish; this contribution can then be invested back into community projects

What is happening next? - This is only a very basic description of the neighbourhood plan, and we want to start talking to all of you as soon as possible. Firstly, we are looking for volunteers to support us in the development of the plan. If you are interested and comfortable to share your details with the team leading on this, then please contact:

Secondly, we will be looking to set up four community events over the summer. We will keep you informed as to when these will be happening, and it would be great to see as many people as possible there so we can all discuss the plan and get authority to continue on your behalf.

## "It's now or never" - latest IPCC report

It's never easy to summarise a report covering 2,913 pages, but it appears that "It's now or never" is the take-home message of the latest report from the IPCC (the United Nations Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change). There are plenty of alarming warnings in there,

but to quote one of the more positive statements regarding the report, according to the IPCC chair Hoesung Lee, "The decisions we make now can secure a liveable future. We have the tools and know-how required to limit warming". Other positives include that the costs of solar and wind energy, as well as batteries, dropped by up to 85 per cent over the past decade, and that moving towards more "sustainable healthy diets" will be beneficial for public health and for the environment. The long anticipated Parish bioblitz is planned for Saturday 18th June, possibly with activities extending throughout the weekend. County wildlife experts from the Kent Field Club will be joining us, as will representatives of other county conservation organisations. We will also be trying to establish a baseline of the state of our local wildlife, to help monitor changes over time due to factors such as climate change but also the impacts of the more thoughtful management of our local green spaces. Obvious sites for surveying include Court Lodge Green and Tayne Field in Lyminge and the Recreation Ground in Rhodes Minnis. 

**Etchinghill resident Emma Spiller** has been preparing to take on a 100km trek of the Pembrokeshire (Wales) coastline on behalf of breast cancer prevention charity '**CoppaFeel.**' After losing her beloved cousin to the disease at the age of thirty five in 2018, and following the restrictions of the lockdown periods Emma was keen to take on a challenge that would raise both funds and awareness for a charity that was dear to her heart. The charity trek involves 6 nights of camping, and 5 long days of trekking 20km with an average elevation of 800m, reaching some of the most stunning Welsh beaches, and remote coves along this rugged stretch of coastline.

Selected from over a thousand applications, Emma will be one of 120 trekkers taking on the challenge, most of whom have been either directly or indirectly affected by the disease. Author Giovanna Fletcher will be leading the trek in her capacity of charity patron, alongside 5 celebrity team captains yet to be named. The main benefits of signing up to this huge challenge

so far have been meeting the other trekkers who are dotted around the UK, and the adventures exploring the numerous local walks offered in and around Tolsford Hill and along the old rail lines.






