Doctors' NewsNotes

Our two GP surgeries are sponsoring an initiative to improve communications to our residents about key topics within healthcare. This initiative, to be routinely included within our Lyminge Newsletter, aims to provide accurate information for the community that may previously only have been picked up when patients visit the surgeries.

Flu Vaccines

If you are eligible for a Flu Vaccine then you will be receiving communications from your Surgery over the next month inviting you to book at one of the flu clinics that are being held. Please support your Surgery by booking your vaccine there.

Autumn Covid boosters

The Department of Health published the next phase of the Covid vaccination campaign. The 'Autumn Boosters' will provide an additional Covid vaccination to the following groups of patients –

- Residents in a care home for older adults and staff working in care homes for older adults
- Front-line health and social care workers
- All adults aged 50 and over
- Those aged 5 to 49 years in a clinical risk group, including pregnant women
- Those aged 5 to 49 years who are household contacts of people with immunosuppression
- Those aged 16 to 49 years who are carers

Patients who fall within the groups above will receive an invite directly from the Department of Health requesting that you book your vaccination on the central booking site. Oaklands Health Centre alongside other locations will be available to book from there.

Individual surgeries will not be sending invites direct to patients. Invites will ALL be completed centrally by the Department of Health.

Please DO NOT contact individual surgeries. There is NO facility to review information or to book appointments. This needs to be done online https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/coronavirus-vaccination/ book-coronavirus-vaccination/ or by calling 119.

District Councillors' Update - October 2022

We were saddened by the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth and in common with other public bodies your District Council postponed meetings in public and all but our emergency services were paused for the day of her funeral. In the midst of the mourning, your District Council also took part in the proclamation of Charles III with the council's chairman being given a copy of the proclamation in Maidstone by the High Sheriff of Kent on 11 September at 1pm which he then read at a 3pm ceremony at the Civic Centre in Folkestone. Susan was at the ceremony which covered the whole of Kent at 1pm and



Jenny attended the local proclamation for our district at 3pm. We know there have been many local events to mark the Queen's passing including church services and we've also been able to attend some of these as well.

By the time this newsletter appears the District Council will have held a summit on the rising cost of living. The aim is to ensure the council is working effectively in partnership with local organisations and the voluntary sector to assist those residents who face challenges around food, warmth and energy during the winter months. Voluntary organisations across Folkestone & Hythe have been invited including Kent Police, Citizens Advice and representatives from the health and education sectors.

If you or someone you know is struggling financially then do please ask for help. There are multiple schemes to help the most vulnerable and both the District Council and County Council websites have very helpful pages with information on benefits, possible financial support and advice.

We've been writing about the District Council's plans for a new Garden Town at Otterpool Park (next to Westenhanger station and between Stanford, Lympne and Sellindge) since it was first proposed in 2016. The new town is intended to take the majority of the new homes needed in our district over the next 20 years (and more) rather than add several hundred homes to each village and thousands to each town over the same period. One of the advantages of creating a new town is that new facilities such as health, schools, recreation etc. can be created at the same time. The location has good existing transport connections to both the M20 and the rail network and roads, footpaths, bridleways and cycleways will be improved as part of the development. The first phase of Otterpool Park is at last at outline planning stage with further amendments and information now available to view on the council website. The statutory public consultation runs till 5pm on Monday 10 October. Comments can be sent via the Planning Portal or by email to <u>otterpool.applications@folkestone-hythe.gov.uk</u>

"NOMADLAND" (12), MONDAY 17TH OCTOBER.

Drama, starring Frances McDormand, David Strathairn and Linda May. Based on the 2017 non-fiction book Nomadland: 'Surviving America in the Twenty-First Century', by Jessica Bruder, this awardwinning film tells the story of Fern (Frances McDormand), a woman in her sixties who loses her job after the economic collapse of a company town in Nevada. Fern packs her van and sets off on the road exploring a life outside of conventional society, living as a van-dwelling modern-day nomad.

TAYNE FIELD MANAGEMENT PLAN

It has been three years since we last published our management plan for Tayne Field, so time for a reminder. The map on the next page shows the approximate locations of the borders to be left unmown during the summer months to increase the sward height and to allow plants to flower, and the areas where native trees and shrubs are being encouraged through planting and natural regeneration. Thanks again to all the volunteers who have helped turn this plan into a reality over the past three years.

You may also have noticed that one of the large weeping willow trees bordering the Nailbourne has died. We are considering what to plant to replace it. Another weeping willow is an option although it might be better to replace with a native tree species such as crack willow or black poplar. More to follow on this in due course.



Grass buffer strip	Cessation of regular summer mowing to increase sward height and encourage flowering plants. This will provide a buffer strip to the Nailbourne, and habitat for insects, reptiles and amphibians. Prominent areas may be cut annually in autumn; some areas should be left uncut to provide a winter refuge and only cut on a rotation of 2-3 years.
Tree and scrub planting	Mixed native tree and shrub planting using 'whips' as appropriate to conditions to gap up existing tree screen and provide variety of habitat types. This will encourage bird nesting and invertebrates. Indicative positions shown but species composition and location will be determined by local conditions.

Surplus Saturday

Surplus Saturday on 3rd September was a bit of a mixed bag. Thoughtful Food organises this annually, usually in September and gives the opportunity to share produce grown in the village. Sharing this produce helps to reduce food waste whilst enabling more people to enjoy seasonal fresh produce from the locality, garden to fork! It was the first time the event had been held on Tayne Field which was the perfect venue.

There have been many reports of some crops doing well this year and others being really disappointing. Not surprisingly, crops that like dry hot weather revelled in the sunshine, figs, plums and tomatoes have been amazing. Whilst other fruits and vegetables struggled (although some of you out there may have different stories!) Runner beans and courgettes needed some rain or lots of watering and some of us were just

overwhelmed by the task of daily, or in some cases twice daily, regime. There was also a sense of garden fatigue as many of us struggled in the intense heat and hid away in the shade. But there was produce to give away and hopefully those who dropped by enjoyed what they took and found fun ways to cook it.

District Food Network

Thoughtful Food has aligned itself with other organisations in the Folkestone district whose main focus is food or where food plays an important role in its activities. Many of you will have heard of the Rainbow Centre and Age UK which plays an important role in easing food poverty but you may not have heard of:

The Rainbow Centre aims to open a Local Pantry in Our Lady of Good Counsel Catholic Church in Hythe on 3rd October. Users of the Pantry will pay £5 each time they visit and for this will be able to purchase about £25.00 worth of food including meat, dairy and fresh vegetables and fruit.

What's in Season in October

Pears. Use crisp and firm pears for poaching or making a tart, and Bartletts for making pear butter (see below under Slow Cookers). Apples, Figs. Quince.

Pumpkin, Kabocha, and Butternut Squash, Spaghetti Squash and Delicata Squash. Parsnips, Celery Root, Rutabagas, Beets, Fingerling Potatoes.

Vegetables to plant in October

Beets, broccoli, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, collards, garlic, kale, kohlrabi, lettuce, onion (seed & sets), radishes, spinach, strawberries and turnips.

Slow Cookers

It might be a good idea to invest in a slow cooker as the demand for these will be high this winter as fuel prices bite. They are actually brilliant, using very little electricity and can be used to cook cheaper ingredients in an

extremely nutritious way. You do have to be a bit organised, perhaps preparing a meal the night before, putting it in the fridge, popping it into the slow cooker in the morning, but there is nothing like coming home to the smell and warmth of a dinner that has virtually cooked itself and they are not just for casseroles. Something simple we can do - let our ivy flower!

Our native ivy is one of the most critical resources for much of our local wildlife, providing year-round shelter, late-season flowers, and winter berries. The flowers are especially important for many pollinating insects, including ivy bees which collect pollen almost exclusively from ivy. Ivy is important every year, but this year even more so with the summer drought having led to a severe lack of other wild flowers this autumn. Allowing your ivy patches to flower is therefore a very effective way of helping our local environment. If your ivy does need cutting back then try to leave most of it until late winter, following flowering and fruiting - but of course taking care not to wait too late and risk disturbing early spring nesting birds.
