

Update on Temporary Road Closure at Broad Street, Lyminge

For many of our residents, this newsletter is the only way they can keep in touch with what is happening in our community. Below is a synopsis of the digital update that was published on-line just after the printed version had gone to press last month. This has been further updated with all the news to date.

Notification copied from Facebook and the progress made since the last newsletter

- A request has been made to KCC under the Freedom of Information relating to the granting of the permit.





Margaret Saunders' Meanderings

11 July 2022

Today has been hot so it was early evening when I decided to go out, hoping to find some shady footpaths. I pass the village pond, steadily dwindling in the heat, remembering the Spring when it was full and ducks swam contentedly. Brambles push through the fence, laden with unripe berries, swelling despite the dry weather and bees are busy visiting the many flowers that have grown around the pond. Walking up the footpath through the centre of Court Lodge Green, I smell the honeyed perfume of the bedstraw before I see



it, hidden amongst the tall grasses and hogweed. Reaching the top of the field by the bench, I barely recognise the plantation of twenty-eight trees in memory of those men of the village who fell in the First World War. Usually the grass that surrounds these trees is green and neatly cut, but as part of the village's green plan, the wild flowers have been left to grow unabated, with only small circles of mown grass around each tree. They have grown so tall that the trees look almost dwarfed in comparison. What a wonderful field full of wildlife this is providing.

Continuing my walk I enter the welcome shade of the covered path, the sunlight barely penetrating the canopy of leaves. I stroll along the dry well trodden track as it weaves its way and wonder about those who have walked this route in the past and ask myself who would have been the very

first people to travel along here, when and for what purpose. It certainly is unlikely to have been for pleasure, which is the purpose of my walk today. As the line of trees on my left ends a view opens up and I look eastwards over the field of wheat to the far side of the valley, bathed in the golden light this time of day brings. Shade is still being provided by the bank of trees to the west and the warm dusty smell of ripening summer wheat fills my nostrils, as it turns from green to harvest gold. Rising from an ear of wheat, a red admiral glides for a short while before alighting on another ear. Further along I take the right fork, choosing the old overgrown path rather than the new one along the edge of the field. Here the path is sunken with the constant tread of feet over millennia.



Crossing the main road at New Barn my feet crunch over the recently cut

grass, dried and brown. I re-cross the road at the bend and start up Loughborough Lane. Birdsong is absent as the heat of the day remains and the birds conserve their energy – there is little water to be found for refreshment. A field of flax has flowered and the seeds are steadily ripening. With the sun behind me, I turn right along the footpath back towards Lyminge. Pigeons rise in a flapping flock from amongst the wheat where they have been gorging on the fallen grains. I hear the first birdsong as skylarks fly high, chirruping their delightful song, one finally descending in a dive into the field of cut hay. To the north, pairs of tractor 'tram' lines are carved into the wheat at regular intervals, crisp and straight, turning at the end of each run, showing methodical and accurate working. The hedgerow offers a little shade as the path veers to the left. Tiny snails have attached themselves to the dried grasses and I stop to inspect them at close quarters, marvelling at their distinctive whorls and surprised at the variety of patterns. A bug, which I can't identify, feeds on some burdock. Old man's beard is beginning to flower with star-like blossoms, the buds small spheres on the ends of straight stalks. *Herbe aux gueux* is the French name for this plant meaning the beggar's or rascal's herb. This is a reference to its use by beggars who used its acrid sap to irritate their skin to give it an ulcerated look in order to gain sympathy. Standing head and shoulders above me is a teasel, a faint purple tingeing the tips of its spines

and nearby a walnut tree, with its huge branch spread and luxurious green leaves, bearing round greencased fruit – an open invitation to squirrels in the Autumn months.

As I return down the Green towards the pond, the bell of the church clock chimes seven times, bringing to mind Millet's painting of the Angelus, depicting a man and a woman pausing from their toil in the fields to say the special prayer. This bell still sounds in rural France in the morning, noon and evening, although now it is rung automatically, rather than manually, as in the past.

Dactars' NewsNates

Our two GP surgeries are sponsoring an initiative to improve communications to our residents about key topics within healthcare. This initiative, to be routinely included within our Lyminge Newsletter, aims to provide accurate information for the community that may previously only have been picked up when patients visit the surgeries.

Autumn Covid boosters

The Department of Health published the next phase of the Covid vaccination campaign. The 'Autumn Boosters' will provide an additional Covid vaccination to the following groups of patients -

- Residents in a care home for older adults and staff working in care homes for older adults
- Front-line health and social care workers
- All adults aged 50 and over
- Those aged 5 to 49 years in a clinical risk group, including pregnant women
- Those aged 5 to 49 years who are household contacts of people with immunosuppression
- Those aged 16 to 49 years who are carers

Patients who fall within the groups above will receive an invite directly from the Department of Health requesting that you book your vaccination on the central booking site. Oaklands Health Centre alongside other locations will be available to book from there.

Individual surgeries will not be sending invites direct to patients. Invites will ALL be completed centrally by the Department of Health.

Please DO NOT contact individual surgeries. There is NO facility to review information or to book appointments. This needs to be done online https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/coronavirus-vaccination/ book-coronavirus-vaccination/or by calling 119.

District Councillors' Update - September 2022

As some of you know I fell ill with Covid at the beginning of July and was out of action for several weeks. I am still not completely recovered but have started to resume normal life. Last month's newsletter entry was written by Jenny but she's now on holiday so this month is a solo effort from me.

I have asked the Streetworks team at Kent Highways for a statement on the latest position on Broad Street for this newsletter and they sent me this on 16 August:



"Until Pentland Homes and their contractor make contact to discuss future works, we are

unable to give any further update. Please be assured that when they do approach this team to book road space, all the points raised by members of the public, the parish and other interested parties will be included in our discussions prior to a permit being granted.

These discussions will include the requirement for Pentland Homes to keep their durations to an absolute minimum where closures are concerned; that extended working hours are included, that the timing is planned to cause the least amount of disruption, and that any temporary traffic lights be manually controlled.

We will also be asking for proof of properties being notified by letter, the parish council having accepted the programme of works, and that a public meeting has been held with affected businesses."


Another vexed issue has been the disruption caused to our roads by the Cross Channel traffic. Council Leaders from across Kent (including Folkestone & Hythe) have written to Grant Shapps MP the Secretary of State for Transport to call for a long term solution to the problems caused to residents and businesses by gridlocked traffic. Congestion at the Port of Dover and the Eurotunnel terminal at Folkestone increasingly impacts on our local road network and is well beyond the resources of local government to resolve.

The District Council has received funding from the Government to help low income pensioners and families with children. The priority will be help with energy bills, food and water bills but there is some discretion to meet other essential costs in exceptional cases. There's also advice for low income home owners on energy efficiency measures. The third element of this funding is being used to boost skills in the local green economy.

Further help will be available through the Government's Shared Prosperity Fund as your District Council has made a successful bid for £1 million to be used over the next three years to support vulnerable residents cope with the cost of living. This involves funding for the Community Hubs that were so successful during the Covid lockdowns, food banks, skills training such as how to cook on a low budget, reducing food waste, healthy eating etc. and direct financial help where appropriate.



NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN INITIAL ENGAGEMENT **EVENTS** As part of the development of the Neighbourhood plan it is really important that we speak to as many members of the community as we can. To that end we would like to run six engagement sessions throughout September to be able to get your views on what's good about the parish, where we have challenges and what we can do better. We will also be looking for volunteers to help us develop a Neighbourhood plan that works for you.

The dates are as follows:

- Lyminge (Tayne Centre) Saturday 10th September 9.30am -11.30am & Tuesday 27th September 6.30pm to 8.30pm
- Etchinghill (Village Hall) -Wednesday 14th September 6.30pm to 8.30pm & Saturday 24th September 9.30am -11.30am
- Rhodes Minnis (Village Hall) -Saturday 17th September 9.30am -11.30am & Friday 30th September 6.30pm to 8.30pm

You don't have to book - please just turn up. We look forward to seeing you.

Why do we want a Neighbourhood Plan? - In the May newsletter we provided information regarding why we believe having a Neighbourhood Plan is important and outlined a number of advantages this would bring to the parish. These include:

- It is community led which means that local organisations, like your Parish Council, will engage with the you to make sure the plan genuinely represents the range of wants and needs in our local area
- A Neighbourhood Plan gives the community more influence in planning considerations and as it is a statutory document all planning decisions must take it into account
- A Neighbourhood Plan is focused on the needs of our specific neighbourhood and allows the local community to specify what they expect from development. This might include things like urban design, allocation of affordable housing and other developments

- The initial discussion, that we will undertake this year, will establish a range of relationships and conversations, which may not otherwise take place, and may potentially influence the activities of other local organisations
- The Neighbourhood Plan allows the community to develop criteria and an approach to choose sites to be allocated for different kinds of development. At the same time there is the option to identify and designate green spaces valued by the community as Local Green Space, which should be protected from inappropriate development
- Should future developments be allowed the neighbourhood plan will mean that a larger contribution must be made to the Parish; this contribution can then be invested back into community projects

What is a Neighbourhood Plan? For anyone that did not see the original article, a Neighbourhood Plan puts in place planning policy for neighbourhood area to guide future development. It is about the use and development of land and allows local community representatives to have a say in proposed future developments. It also deals with a wide range of social, economic and environmental issues (such as housing, employment, design, heritage and transport) and will be used by us, your parish council, to help us make the best decisions for the community.

Runner Bean Ratatouille

A Seasonal Recipe for September

Ingredients

400g runner beans, topped, tailed and stringed

3 tbsp olive oil

1 onion, finely sliced

- 6 large tomatoes or 1x 400g tin tomatoes
- 1 tsp sugar 1 bay leaf 2 garlic cloves, crushed or finely chopped 3 sprigs thyme
- **Step 1** If using fresh tomatoes, peel them by cutting a cross in the skin at one end and plunging into a pan of boiling water for 1 minute, until the cut skin starts to peel back. Remove from the water, peel and roughly chop.
- **Step 2** Slice the runner beans diagonally into long strips about 1cm wide.
- **Step 3** Heat the oil in a heavy saucepan. Add the onions and sweat until translucent and beginning to soften.
- **Step 4** Add the beans, tomatoes, garlic, sugar and herbs.
- **Step 5** Cover and simmer for 30-40 minutes until the beans are soft and the sauce is thick if it is still thin, remove the pan lid and bubble until it reaches the right consistency.
- **Step 6** Serve warm or at room temperature.

Reflections On Our Dry Summer: Inspiration For The Parish Neighbourhood Plan

We mentioned last month that our Queen's Green Canopy trees, planted in March to celebrate Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee,

along with other trees planted over the past couple of years, are struggling with the lack of rain this year and needing our help to water them. Thanks to anyone who is helping in that regard. We have also surely all noticed how dry our ground is, and how it is affecting our local agricultural productivity amongst other things, plus of course we saw the hottest UK temperatures on record recently. The community engagement meetings coming up throughout September to kick-start our Parish Neighbourhood Plan give us an opportunity to find ways for us to try to place climate change mitigation measures into our strategic planning processes going forwards.



In early August the Lyminge Scouts visited the Science Museum in London

and one of the displays provided some inspiration for our Neighbourhood Planning: "Climate change is the most urgent challenge of our time. Carbon capture has the potential to slow down the impacts of global heating. However, the most critical action now is to rapidly reduce carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gas emissions globally from transport, homes, industry and agriculture, to limit the impacts of climate change on our future planet." (sciencemuseum.org.uk/ see-and-do/our-future-planet).

Some other inspiration came from the category descriptions of a photography competition (<u>https://epoty.org/categories-prizes/</u>): "Science tells us that if we continue on our current trajectory, one vision of 2050 will include more extremes such as droughts, wildfires, flooding, biodiversity loss and increased pressures on our food, water and energy supplies. But what if, by 2050, we are living compatibly with a low-carbon world? Nature and green spaces will be integrated seamlessly in our urban environments, people will enjoy their products from sustainable local community farms, and we are all breathing the cleanest air the planet has seen since the industrial revolution."

From the same source: "What can nature do when given a chance? When nature is restored, allowed to recover, or integrated with our urban environments it can help us address the most critical issues of our time, such as threats to our water security, natural disasters, and climate change. Nature-based-solutions are restoring ecosystems and simultaneously enhancing our communities and well-being."

Please do join in the Neighbourhood Plan community engagement meetings and between us we can try to make the changes we need.

Red Bartsia Bees Back On The Bumpy Field

The dry weather has also reduced the quantity of wild flowers this year, with implications for our pollinators. Never-the-less the Red Bartsia bees are out again on the bumpy field, collecting pollen exclusively from the semi-parasitic Red Bartsia flowers (see last September's newsletter for more details). Most of the flowers currently flowering on the field are located in the patches sown a few years ago, illustrating again the benefits from the improved management of the field by the Parish Council.


