## **CHRISTMAS IN LYMINGE**

## **Margaret Saunders' Meanderings**

Not a promising day for a walk but I went out all the same. We have passed the astronomical equinox and there seems to be a change in the air and light, signifying that we are now moving into shorter days and longer nights as the sun moves over the equator and into the southern hemisphere. With no individual cloud shapes visible, the sky is a uniform grey, drizzle alternates with light rain and the air is still.

A magpie takes off from a nearby field, its piebald colours flashing black and white as it flies. Raindrops hang from the wire fence behind a thick swag of scarlet black briony berries and delicate drops have formed on the black seeds of bedstraw, its Summer perfume long gone. Feathery fronds of old man's beard hold minute droplets. Everything is gently dripping. I hear and see no insects on this damp day, although bees were foraging in my garden yesterday. Stillness and quiet surround me, with only the occasional caws of crows audible.



I am walking along a narrow bridle path off Skeete Road overhung by dense vegetation which allows

little sunshine to penetrate even in the height of Summer, but today, when light levels are low, there is a sombre feel to this part of my walk. Dry leaves litter the footpath, having fallen prematurely during July and August's prolonged heat, only dampened here and there where the overhead foliage is allowing the drizzle through.

Drips drop from the overhanging leaves and make erratic but constant plops when they land, the different surfaces making the plops vary in timbre. With every

slight puff of breeze, there is a sudden increase in plops, making leaves in the undergrowth jerk with the weight of the drops as they land. Moss and lichen cover dead twigs and branches and an underworld of different fungi, supported by the rotting trunk of a sawn off fallen tree, have sprung up in the damp conditions. As I crouch to photograph them, I catch the smell of decay. Flower buds adorn the prolific ivy, mimicking the Coronovirus shape



with its protein spikes, now so familiar to us all. Beads of rain lie on a fallen feather, remaining in globules on the greasy barbs. Roots from a tree have lifted out of the soil but the tree has stayed upright as it rests on its neighbours. Spoil, thickly flecked with chalk, spills out from a burrow in the bank.

I return across a field where the tall grass is brown from its Summer baking. Ragwort sits high amongst this grass, mostly brown and dead, but the occasional plant still sports some yellow flowers, as does the occasional St John's Wort. The sweet smell of woodsmoke drifts lazily in the damp air. Black and brown cattle on a distant hillside, heads down grazing as they move steadily across the field. Down along another dark narrow footpath and then out into the open across a field of stubble, green wheat from spilt seeds at harvest time growing between the stubble stalks, responding to the

moisture of recent rain. Even where the stubble has been ploughed in elsewhere, the



Berries of many varieties brighten the last leg of the walk and in places, leaves are beginning to turn to their Autumn colours. Rain is steadily falling now and reluctantly I put up my hood, which I know will deaden the sounds, however quiet, of nature. Close hedges of ivy line the route, their flowers giving off their strange perfume. Bees foraging on ivy, sometimes even in early November, produce a granular honey with a flavour redolent of this distinctive perfume. But for now, warmth and a cup of tea beckon me homewards.

## District Councillors' Update - November 2022

The District Council's 'Cost of Living Summit' was held on 20 September with over 60 people attending from different organisations involved in helping those in need. A booklet will now be produced to bring together the details of who can help. In the meantime do look at the District and County Council websites which have many useful links. Residents may also be interested in the Hythe Pantry – for a £5 a week subscription, those in need can receive £20/£25 worth of food a week. It's held at Our Lady of Good Counsel, 2 Lower Blackhouse Hill, Hythe.



We're pleased to report that the Benefits Team at the District Council has been named Team of the Year at the recent Institute of Revenues Rating and Valuation

Performance Awards. The Council was also highly commended on the Excellence in Social Inclusion category. The work to engage with and help harder-to-reach groups such as armed forces veterans was singled out by the jury making the awards. It's good to know the staff dealing with vulnerable people are considered so highly.

There's still time to respond to the consultation about the District Council's updated Statement of Community Involvement. This sets out how people can get involved in decisions about plan-making and planning applications in the district. You'll find it at <a href="mailto:consult.folkestone-hythe.gov.uk">consult.folkestone-hythe.gov.uk</a> It's open until 5pm on Monday 14 November.

The District Council has been awarded a grant from the Government's Rural England Prosperity Fund for the next two years and we'll share details of this scheme when they become available.

We too have grants to give. Every year each ward councillor in the district can allocate community grants totaling £3,000. In the past we've funded village halls, youth groups, sports clubs and more. There's a complete list on the district council website of all our previous awards. If you have a project you think deserves funding please let us know.

Do watch out for events at Westenhanger Castle which is owned by the District Council and which will be the centrepiece of the new town planned at Otterpool Park. These events are normally free to attend and staged in the school holidays; some are for families and some are of general interest. You can find details on the Otterpool Park website <a href="www.otterpool.org">www.otterpool.org</a> in the news section. We have asked for more notice so we can share the information in the village newsletters but they are usually advertised just a couple of weeks in advance which doesn't meet the production deadlines for monthly newsletters. ## Doctors' NewsNotes

Our two GP surgeries, Church Road and New Lyminge Surgery, are sponsoring an initiative to improve communications to our residents about key topics within healthcare.

## PCN (Primary Care Network) is coming to a surgery near YOU!!

Folkestone, Hythe and Rural PCN was established in May 2021 to enable the health service to work in smarter ways and help alleviate some of the congestion found in surgeries. Our PCN is a collaboration of 7 practices - Church Road, New Lyminge, Oaklands, White House, Sun Lane, Harbour Medical Practice and Hawkinge Medical Practice spread across Hythe, Lyminge, Cheriton and Hawkinge. It has a patient size of about 49,000.

As part of being a PCN funding is given to recruit additional staff such as Physiotherapists, Paramedics, Pharmacists, Mental Health Workers, Occupational Therapy, Social Prescribing Link Worker and Minor Illness Nurse Practitioners. The teams will be running clinics that are spread across the 7 practices.

The value of the PCN is that it provides a significant increase in appointment capacity and starts with a triage process to identify where patients may benefit from another registered Health Professional other than a GP.

Two recent examples of how this works are recorded in these two following emails:

"I contacted my GP regarding an operation I had recently had. I noticed the wound did not look like it was healing properly. I was given an appointment at another local surgery through their hub system. I was seen very quickly and efficiently, putting my mind at ease with good communication. Matthew Clark"

"Following a recent call to my GP for a sore throat, I was offered an appointment at the surgery hub, based at another surgery site and saw a lovely nurse practitioner. She reviewed my symptoms and confirmed I had tonsilitis, medication was sorted out and feedback to my GP. A very effective service for symptoms that do not require GP input. Janet"

More about the PCN will follow shortly.



## **Lyminge Speedwatch Team**

Did you know that there has been a **Speedwatch** team operating in Lyminge Parish since 2012, although the recent pandemic necessarily caused a temporary halt to their activities?

It is hoped that the roadside monitoring of vehicles within the Parish can now be restarted in the early Spring of 2023.

**Speedwatch** is made up of a number of volunteers who can choose how many and which sessions they wish to undertake from a proposed rota. Each session usually lasts for just over one hour.

There is now an urgent need to increase the number of volunteers within the team; time and moving away from Lyminge have taken their toll on some of those original volunteers.

The Parish Council has confirmed its continued support of *Speedwatch* by recently agreeing to meet the cost of recalibrating our equipment (to ensure the accuracy of the data collected). However, this could be a waste of Parish funds (your taxes) if regular roadside sessions cannot be restarted because of an insufficient number of volunteers. Without another seven or eight villagers joining the team it may not be possible to run regular roadside sessions and this important safety scheme over which we have control will be lost.

**Speedwatch** does not lead to prosecutions and you will not be required to 'give evidence'. The roadside recordings are passed to the Police by the Team Coordinator and may lead to a letter being sent to the registered owner of the vehicle or, for persistent repeat speedsters, a visit from a police officer.

## Update on the Lyminge Parish Neighbourhood Plan

We have two updates for you about the Neighbourhood plan. Firstly, at the end of September our request to be a designated area for a Neighbourhood Plan went to Folkestone Council for approval and we were successful in our application. This means that we can now proceed with drafting the plan.

Secondly, we have completed the initial community engagement sessions. We would like to thank everyone who came to talk to us over the 6 sessions between 24th September and 8th October. We had over 60 members of the community come and see us, and it was great to meet you all and also have the chance to get your thoughts on the Neighbourhood plan and the wider parish. Without exception we all really enjoyed the sessions and the positive attitude towards the plan and area was really heartening. Over the course of the sessions, we collected 331 bits of feedback including 171 flags stuck in our poor map. On top of this we collected 73 ideas of things we can change, on themes like the roads, types of houses and ideas on the environment, which will help us no end. On the 19th October we also received some great feedback from Lyminge scouts, which we will incorporate as well.

Soon we will finish the summary and we will come back with more detail and the groups we will be setting up to draft the plan. Thanks again for all your support.



## New Playpark Facilities

Many people will be aware that over the summer we had to remove the toddler play equipment in Jubilee Field because it had reached the end of its useful life. We have also been planning for some time to replace the existing equipment on Tayne Field, and we have worked closely with Lyminge Youth Action to develop a scheme that will create a fabulous new playpark for a much greater age range.



LYA has done fantastic work raising money and securing grants, and the scheme could not have proceeded without their efforts. But the scheme for redeveloping both play areas is an expensive project. The Parish Council considers that

both these play areas are valuable assets for our community, and we should do all we can to keep them operational. We have therefore decided to utilise existing Council reserves to cover the balance of funding required to allow a complete redevelopment of both play areas to commence.

By the time you read this, work will have begun on both sites, and this will continue through November. We hope that both the new play areas will be ready for use before Christmas.

## **Etchinghill Noticeboard**

During October, the Parish Council authorised the refurbishment of the wooden noticeboard by the Etchinghill Village Hall, to bring it back to its former glory. We are very pleased with the work undertaken and that we could preserve rather than replace it.

The council would like to express its sincere thanks to Heather Dunsford for many years of service as a councillor, including her consistent efforts to compile the diverse information presented in these newsletter pages. Heather stepped down recently from her council position and we wish her well for the future.

Council voted to co-opt some of the applicants at the Full Council meeting in September and is looking forward to welcoming the new councillors and to working together to realise our commitment to protecting and improving the area of Lyminge Parish.

## What's in season in November

Artichoke, Beetroot, Cabbage (Savoy, Spring Green, Red and White), Carrots, Cauliflower, Celeriac, Butternut Squash, Brussels Sprouts

## What to sow and plant in November

Sow outside broad beans and early peas. Hardier varieties of Spring Onion (Performer)

On a sunny window ledge sow salad leaves especially Mizuna, Mustard, Spinach and Chillies

Plant outside (in your new no dig bed!) bare-rooted fruit trees - apples, pears, cherries and plums. Soft fruits such as raspberries, blackcurrants, gooseberries, not forgetting the ever popular rhubarb crowns, all in lots of well rotted manure.

## No Dig

You may already know that **Thoughtful Food** encourages No Dig gardening and may have read advice on this before but November is an excellent time of year to create a no dig bed and you can sow/plant broad beans and garlic straight

away. It's also great encouragement for getting outside in the elements and resist the temptation to snuggle away indoors.

No dig allows you to work in harmony with your soil for healthy plants and bumper crops, without huge effort. With the no dig method, soil drains well, holds warmth and moisture, and retains its organic matter and carbon. You can pop in seeds and plants at any time, with no mud. Best of all is that weeds are few. You have more time for creative gardening and to make compost.

Your work is at the surface only.

When starting out, the first step is to smother existing weeds – After that, and just once a year, spread 2–3 cm / 1 in of any type of compost on beds, and a similar depth of wood chip on paths.

This feeds soil organisms, which maintain aeration and drainage. Their excretions hold nutrients in stable forms that are not water-soluble. More information can be found on Charles Dowding's website.

## The Secret Life in a Beech Hedge

Many of us have beech hedges around our gardens. Did you know that the caterpillars of numerous species of small moths live inside beech leaves, feeding within a mine inside of the leaf, fairly protected from external predators? November is a great time to spot these leaf-miners, and they are actually so common on beech that it is hard not to find any if you have a quick look. Some species produce blotch mines, which basically look like blisters on the upper or underside of the leaf, others live in long sinuous gallery mines that start narrow and get broader as the caterpillar grows. Each species has a slightly different way of mining the leaf, so it is fairly easy to identify the species from the form of the mine, taking into consideration where on the leaf the mine starts (ie where the adult moth laid the egg), and details such as how the frass (posh word for poo) is arranged within the mine. If you hold the leaf up to the light you can see the frass and also the caterpillar if it is still present.



# Something Simple We Can Do - be considerate to our hedges

Of course beech is not the only hedge plant that supports leaf-mining insects, including moths, flies and beetles - almost all native plants support a selection of leaf-mining species. And whilst these leaf-mining insects are fairly protected within their mines, there are plenty of tiny wasps that specialise in finding them and laying their own eggs on or in the leaf-mining larvae, which produce wasp larvae which live inside the leaf-mining larvae. I believe there may even be some wasps that live inside the wasps living inside the leaf-miners living inside the leaves. It is clear that hedges are home to large food-webs of life that most of us are hardly aware of, and so it is good to bear this in mind when we trim our hedges. There will never be a perfect time to trim that avoids destroying something, but by choosing appropriate timings of our trimming, by keeping the trimming to the minimum necessary, by staggering trimming so a hedge is not all cut at the same time, and by leaving some parts of a hedge untrimmed each year, we will reduce the impact of our trimming on the diverse community of insects living in the hedge, a community which of course is a major part of the foundation of the food-chains that lead up through our larger insects, birds and bats.
