Margaret Saunders' Meanderings

Bright colour is what I am seeking on this afternoon walk at the turn of the year, and I know that it will be hard to find. But after so many wet or dull damp days, grey skies and a muddy coloured landscape, I am determined to find some, however little.



I was expecting to see deep red hawthorn berries, but every tree has been stripped. This is unusual as they normally last well into the new year. The spindle berries too have disappeared as have the shiny red berries of black bryony. So it is rosehips that provide the first splash of colour, but more importantly, these will provide birds with much needed food until the Spring brings its own food sources.

Red and orange leaves in a hedgerow catch my eye, their colours vibrant against the background, having survived the frosts, snow and wind thanks to their sheltered position. Crossing over the Skeete Valley I discover some more coloured leaves, tucked in amongst the hedge which borders the narrow footpath. Ivy and coniferous trees do have colour, but the low light levels at this time of year only serve to darken the green to such an extent that it is difficult to think of them as being colourful.

Tall, dried grass covers the next field with the occasional dried remains of hogweed standing proud, whose magnificent seedheads never fail to attract me, so much more beautiful than the flowers from which they come. Ragwort stand out but their dark brown profiles do not hold the

fascination of the starburst stalks of hogweed. Turning left onto Skeete Road, I am expecting to see the ruby red-black bryony berries, which last month were so vibrant but now are conspicuously absent. In a garden hedge small pink berries are clinging on, either waiting to be eaten or for time and the weather to release them from their stalks. I take the footpath which links through to Woodland Road. The leaf litter offers little colour as it begins to rot in the endless cycle of soil enrichment. However, the underside of a large leaf shows silvery white against the murky brown, its veins showing clearly, surrounded by pale yellow and brown hawthorn leaves. Nearby white mould lines the smooth underside of a trunk from a chopped down tree. Although white is not strictly a colour, these two items stand out and catch my eye.

My next vibrant colour is moss covered wood 'flowing' from the base of a tree like green lava, reaching down towards the path. Moss is well worth close inspection as the leaves



form interesting patterns, not unlike the Jack Frost patterns we used to find on windowpanes. A tall copper beech hedge edges the path, its leaf colour providing the reason for its name, almost glowing in the afternoon light. A strong breeze through the branches makes the dried leaves rustle. On the opposite side of the footpath, a swathe of



daffodils are already standing tall, in places flower buds full and fat. What a sight these will provide once they begin to open.

Dogwood shows deep cherry red in the field margins. As the branches of this tree are very straight and tough, they were traditionally used to make arrows, butcher's skewers and herding poles. Mixed amongst this red are hazels, their catkins well-formed and in places beginning to lengthen and wriggle in the wind. Balls of dark purple ivy seeds hang down like Christmas tree decorations and snowberries stand out in the dark hedge.

Although not cold, the days have been wet and windy, with few glimpses of sunshine, so it will be a relief to leave this dreary time of year behind and look forward to Spring.

District Councillors' Update - February 2023

Your District Council will debate and set its budget for 2023/24 at a meeting of the Full Council on 22 February. The meeting will be webcast and the council papers will be available online. Our £19m budget provides the maintenance of our prize winning parks and gardens, housing services including help for the homeless, street cleansing, your kerbside waste collection and dealing with planning applications.

Council tax bills are sent out by the District Council but they cover all the other bodies that are allowed to charge a precept (tax). The largest share goes to Kent County Council which pays for social care, waste disposal, roads, school



places etc. The rest of your council tax goes to Kent Police, Kent Fire & Rescue Service and Lyminge Parish Council. There are several council tax (and other) benefit schemes including a hardship fund for those whose circumstances don't fit other eligibility criteria and who are struggling financially. Information is on the council website where there's also a live chat facility or you can telephone Customer Services on 01303 853000. For those without digital access there's the Customer Access Point (CAP) at the Civic Centre where computers are available for self-service and staff on hand to assist if needed.

The utility companies also have schemes to help people who can't afford their bills. Southern Water is one of these and you can contact them at payless@southernwater.co.uk or: 0800 027 0363 (Monday to Friday, 9am to 5pm) Another scheme run by the council is the Home Essential Fund. There's funding available for boiler replacement or servicing and, particularly relevant to our area, oil boilers needing to be replaced or tuned up and checked for efficiency, top-up of oil or gas bottles. Application forms will be on the Council website shortly, however please advise us if you know a family who may benefit from this scheme as we are keen that residents in this ward do not miss out because funding on this particular project is only available until the end of March 2023. Other projects, under this heading will follow in the next financial year - we'll keep you updated.

On 27 January the District Council arranged an online engagement event with the Home Office about the Government's use of temporary accommodation in our district (Napier Barracks and hotels) for those seeking asylum in the UK. The meeting was chaired by David Monk, the Leader of District Council and included Roger Gough, Leader of KCC and Folkestone & Hythe MP Damian Collins. Representatives from the Home Office and Kent Police were also invited. The meeting was shown live on the council's Youtube channel and a recording should be available shortly if not already posted.



Services and activities available.

Information and Advice is available to those by telephone, centre-based visits and home visits. We have a team of expert Information and Advice Officers who can help to maximise income by completing benefit checks to ensure individuals are receiving all they are entitled to. Our team are there to support individuals complete forms, using the right terminology for a more positive outcome. This service is free and available by appointment or drop into one of our many Dementia Cafés.

The Dementia Co-ordination team will work with and support those affected by dementia, including family and carers. The Dementia Co-ordinators will be there to help from pre-diagnosis, to support people to get a diagnosis, to access support services and provide the guidance they need to live as independently as possible within their communities. Free and available by appointment.

Dementia Cafés offer a safe place to socialise, meet others, ask questions and learn more about dementia and local services, whilst enjoying a hot drink and a slice of cake. Free, groups held at various locations throughout the month.

MCST (Maintenance cognitive stimulation therapy) is a 12 week programme that meet weekly for 1 hour 30 minutes for people living with mild dementia. Group members take part in meaningful and stimulating activities, proven to help maintain memory and mental functioning. The group provide a fun, supportive environment where people can build new friendships. £60 Mondays or Thursdays (moving to Friday from January) 10.30am -12noon.

COGS (Cognitive Stimulation Therapy) is a weekly 4 hour programme for people living with moderate dementia. COGS is a small group intervention for people who are experiencing difficulties with their memory. It works by providing ideas for people to help themselves maintain their cognitive abilities, including group discussions and activities. A 12 week programme, £20.00 per week on Tuesdays 10.30am - 2.30pm, (Thursday starting in January).

Daybreak services offer activity-based day care in a safe and secure environment for people living with moderate to late-stage dementia who need a little more support or have additional needs. As well as providing a meaningful day for participants, it can provide a day of respite for family or carers. Monday – Friday 9.30am – 3pm £35.35.







LYMINGE PARISH COUNCIL February 2023 Newsletter

LYMINGE PLAYPARKS GRAND OPENING

The wind and rain did not deter a great turnout for the grand opening of the new playparks on a very wet Friday in January, with the Pre-school and Primary school turning out in force. A great cheer went up as the ribbon was cut by Rob Baldwin from the Parish Council (see P27).

The Parks are a great new asset to the children of the village and school, and a culmination of a huge amount of work from a number of different groups and individuals coming together to make it happen, especially Lyminge Youth Action spearheaded by Tara Anderson.

The PlayPark on Tayne Field has quite literally been covered in children every day after school no matter the weather, and a particular hit on Fridays with many parents delighted that it's drawing attention away from the stream and the mud!

PENTLAND DEVELOPMENT ON ETCHINGHILL GOLF COURSE

Residents will be aware that the planned developments either side of the golf course that were due to start last summer did not proceed. The Parish Council has been in regular communication with Pentland in the intervening period, and as some may now be aware, the company decided to postpone the start of construction work in order to seek consent on a revised plan for a larger number of smaller size houses. At the time of writing, Pentland is planning a public meeting to outline their new plans, so that everyone has a chance to see what is intended. The revised application for the Etchinghill site has already been submitted (ref 22/2091/FH on the FHDC Planning Portal). The revised application in respect of the site by the New Lyminge Surgery is understood to be imminent.

Our discussions with Pentland have focused on how the development can proceed without causing major disruption to our community. We are advised that the new plan for the site by New Lyminge Surgery should not involve the road closure that was envisaged last summer. Revised planning consent has not yet been obtained, so it is not certain that the development will proceed as requested.

However, as consent was granted for the previous scheme, at the current time, the expectation is that the changes are likely to be approved, allowing development to begin in the Autumn of this year. This would be during the financial year ending 31 March 2024, and consequently we would receive the first payment of Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) during this period.

CIL is a statutory payment required to be paid by a developer to the local community affected, based on the floor area of the houses to be built. As we did in the current year when the development was expected to begin in the summer of 2022, the Council has budgeted for this receipt, and that is why it is included in the Council budget for 2023/24. The levy has to be used on capital projects and is earmarked principally to overhaul the running track and skatepark on Jubilee Field, although no commitments will be made for this project to proceed until the receipt is certain. At the current time, the precise amount is still subject to some negotiation, but it is expected to exceed £100,000.

COMMUNITY TRANSPORT GRANT

KCC have funding to encourage and support communities to set up and maintain <u>community</u> <u>transport schemes</u> that are tailored to their local needs. Community-led groups or organisations can apply for a community transport grant to either set up a new scheme or support an existing one. Applications are currently open until 12 February 2023.

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

In very simple terms, a neighbourhood plan is:

- A document that sets out planning policies for the neighbourhood area – planning policies are used to decide whether to approve planning applications.
- Written by the local community, the people who know and love the area, rather than the Local Planning Authority.
- A powerful tool to ensure the community gets the right types of development, in the right place.

Thank you to everyone who attended one of our sessions last year, and also to those who put their names down to help develop a plan.

We have been identifying sources of funding to support the plan's development, and in the next month we shall be putting a plan of action together and contacting those who are keen to be involved. More information about Neighbourhood Plans can be found at <u>neighbourhoodplanning.org</u>

Things to Do in the Garden in February...

Some of Charles's tips for things to do in the garden in February include:

- Sow under cover broad beans, spinach, lettuce, peas for shoots, onion, salad onion, early varieties of cabbage, calabrese, kohlrabi, cauliflower, turnips, radish, bulb/Florence fennel, parsley, coriander, dill.
- With warmth, aubergine, pepper and chilli sow these by the end of March.
- Sow outside garlic if not already sown.
- And...fruit. Continue to plant bare-rooted fruit trees and bushes as long as the ground isn't frozen or waterlogged.
- Add a layer of well-rotted manure or multi-purpose compost around the base of your fruit trees and bushes to give them a boost before growth begins in earnest.
- Avoid pruning plum trees in winter as this can allow the destructive silver leaf disease to strike.
- If your allotment has a dedicated fruit area, consider erecting a fruit cage to protect it from birds. Now is the best time to do it while there are no leaves to damage.
- It's not too late to force rhubarb, making your early crops extra sweet.
- Pot on a few young strawberry plants to grow in the cold greenhouse. They will crop earlier than their garden counterparts.

Getting to Grips with "Kent Plan Bee" at a Parish Council Level

An article by Parish Councillor Tony King was published in the January edition of the newsletter of the Kent Association of Local Councils (KALC). An extract is below, while the full article can be provided on request to tony.king@lymingeparishcouncil.org.uk.

Kent County Council launched its pollinator action plan in 2021 named "Kent Plan Bee", acknowledging that pollinators are vital to our food, economy and environment, and aiming to improve the habitat and the food sources of these insects and to reverse their rapid decline. Lyminge Parish Council has taken this call to help pollinators on board, by promoting local action and by adapting our management of three local community green spaces.

There are several guiding principles that help guide our decision-making processes when trying to improve our management of these green spaces. We recognise that the climate, biodiversity and pollinator "crises" are all interlinked, and that the impacts are



significant for people globally and locally. We understand our limitations and that we work at a relatively small scale, but we believe that "every little helps", and we are driven to a large extent by the motto "If not us, who? If not now, when?" We realise that our management strategies for our community green spaces can be improved for benefits to biodiversity and pollinators and for people. We implement simple strategies that follow well-proven land management techniques, particularly by encouraging wildflowers by thoughtful mowing regimes, coupled with occasional seeding of yellow rattle and other appropriate native flowers and bulbs. We recognise that pollinators need trees too, so we have encouraged tree-planting of native species where appropriate. We recognise the value of participatory monitoring of our results, although again this is simple and relative to the scale and significance of this work. Finally we are very pleased to benefit from the contributions of local experts and volunteers, so thanks to everyone who has been involved one way or another.

It is important to explain our management strategies to local residents, which we do particularly through regular contributions to the monthly Parish newsletter. Recent contributions include explaining the rationale for the various cutting regimes, reporting the results of a participatory bioblitz (when for example over 150 species of moths

were recorded in just one evening with the help of the Kent Moth Group), explaining the role of yellow rattle flowers in suppressing vigorous grasses and therefore allowing other wild flowers to flourish, and reporting on the annual presence of the fairly localised red bartsia bee on one of our community green spaces, a species that collects pollen exclusively from red bartsia flowers and that is appearing in good numbers under the new management of the site.

We are very pleased with the results of our more thoughtful management regimes so far, and I take this opportunity to thank former Councillor Owen Standen and professional ecologist Dan Bennett who inspired this change in approach. Some of the challenges we have faced include that a "Cut and Collect" is more expensive than basic cuts, that whilst the timing of cuts is important our contractors don't necessarily have time to cut at the ideal time, and that despite our colourful maps indicating where and where not



to cut the mower operators tend to "cut more not less". We are also challenged by public opinion, some people think our green spaces are "too messy" whilst others claim they are "too neat and tidy" - clearly we can't please everyone all of the time, we need to recognise that we don't need to. We do need to be brave in our decision-making, but we need to be informed and open and remind ourselves of our strategic guiding principles when making decisions. From a personal perspective as a Parish Councillor, we need to remember that Parish Councillors are all volunteers, we do this in our "spare time" which is a challenge in itself. We have to constantly remind ourselves of arguably the most important of the guiding principles mentioned above: "If not us, who? If not now, when?"

Protecting the neighbourhoods of Kent and Medway

Rural and Wildlife Crime has a large impact on local communities and often goes unreported to the Police. It is thought part of this issue is that these crimes are largely unknown when compared to other commonly known crimes, here is a short list to help identify what these crimes are:

Wildlife crimes: poaching, coursing, persecution of badgers, birds and bats, egg theft and collection, collection of trade in protected species and animal products, not registering animals that require a licence, taking protected plants, use of poisons, snares or explosives to kill or injure animals, animal cruelty, hunting with dogs, introducing invasive species, killing or capturing, damaging or destroying the habitat of any protected animal.

Rural crimes: theft of farming or agricultural equipment or fuel, damage to agricultural property, tack theft, theft of lead from churches, damage to ancient monuments, illegal metal detecting, livestock worrying.



LYMINGE THEN AND NOW

This is the third of a regular feature provided by the Lyminge Historical Society in which we hope to learn a little more about our historic community. Pairs of photographs will show how some well-known local views have changed, or perhaps how they have not changed very much, over the past 100 years or so.



Out & About..



The views above show the corner of Church Road and the High Street in Lyminge. The older photo dating to around 1904 shows that the view has not changed much, although the forge on the right hand corner closest to the camera was demolished in the blast from the flying bomb that also destroyed the Methodist Church. The old School opposite was demolished in the late 1980s, and replaced with housing, while the school itself was relocated to Tayne Field.



Almost every year, since our inception in 2000, **Ethelburga Quilters** have been making heart-shaped cushions for people who have had breast surgery. It isn't just women who sadly get breast cancer, men do too; so we always make sure to produce some in masculine colours as well. The most often used position for the cushion is with the 'dip' in the heart placed in the armpit, so that the arm is raised away from the wound. But placed across the chest, they also provide cushioning against a car seat belt.

It is difficult to say how many we have made over the years, but we do try to make at least 100 each January. This year we surpassed our target and made over 140 cushions! Most of the members were present on Saturday 14th January, supplemented by non-quilting friends (on 'stuffing and stitching up' duties!). The hall at Etchinghill was a hive of activity.

The cushions are made with good quality (patchwork or dressmaking) cotton fabric for ease of laundering and are stuffed with the polyester filling from brand-new cheap pillows (expensive pillows aren't quite as 'fit for purpose'!). This year we used the proceeds of a fabric sale to purchase 22 double packs of pillows and have a few left over for next year. We finish each cushion with a label that says, **'Made with love by Ethelburga Quilters'** alongside the Lyminge logo.

The pillows have been donated to the East Kent Hospitals University Foundation Trust.
