## **Margaret Saunders' Meanderings**



Sibton's silhouettes are to be the subject of my walk today. It is a still day with the sky washed in a steel grey, no individual cloud visible, merely all over cover with no variation. Not a particularly enticing day for a walk so I had nothing much in mind that I thought would catch my attention. But trees always fascinate me, whatever the season: bare in the Winter months; buds swelling and bursting in Spring; full leaf in a multitude of shades of green in Summer and the gradual and glorious colour changes that Autumn brings.

What first catches my eye however, are some very tall hogweed seedheads, like dark starbursts against the sky. I look for more. Some are thin and mean but others still have seeds attached which give their silhouettes more solidity. As I walk, I look closely either side of the path and see frizzy little leaves which are the remains of nettles; what I think are bedstraw stems with tiny stalks and a few black seeds, little bigger than a full-stop; ragwort, shrivelled and dark brown, but nonetheless attractive in its starkness. All vegetation is pared back, but closer inspection is rewarded by showing a different attraction to that of their glorious former selves. I pick a selection which I will put into small vases and glass bottles on my return for a late Winter nature table of seed silhouettes, to remind me of nature's continuing beauty, whatever the season.

I walk past a huge and majestic old tree and decide to spend some time looking at it more closely. It's vertical ridged bark, textured and grooved, tells me it is an oak, which is confirmed when I look at the ground around the tree, still covered in oak leaves in various stages of decomposition, their distinctive shape making them easy to identify. According to the Woodland Trust, oaks can provide a wildlife haven for up to 2,300 species and



jays help their proliferation by dropping around 3,000 acorns as they fly with overfull beaks. These acorns stand the best chance of growing when they are dropped into bramble patches, as there is less risk they will be eaten by squirrels and other creatures. Years ago a branch must have been cut off or have fallen and the grain of the outer ring of bark has formed a raised circle, in the centre of which is the

remaining wood of the branch and its growth rings can clearly be seen. Fissures have appeared and I wonder how many of the 2,300 creatures have made this their home and food source. Looking up into the tree, the huge boughs form a tangle of wood as they have twisted and grown away from the solid trunk. Unseen, oak roots need to be strong, growing deep and covering a circumference equal to its branch span. This outer ring is known as the drip line, where

drips fall from the leaves when it rains and the fine roots, which are the furthest away from the tree, take in the water and nutrients that then feed the tree.

Seven sycamores, forming a ring, attract my attention next. Their silhouettes make a pleasing group, almost symmetrical and as with the oak tree, the leaves beneath the tree help with identification. Many of these leaves have tar spot, a fungal disease which appears as black spots. The distinctive winged fruits of the sycamore are called samaras, sounding a bit like an Indian food delicacy!



Lime, or linden trees, form a row along the edge of a field. They are a symmetrical shape, neat and tidy - round at the bottom and becoming more tapered at the top. Their fruit, consisting of small balls with pointed tips,



have a wing to help them spread in the wind. Much of the linden tree can be used for medicinal purposes and it is the national tree of the Czech Republic, Slovakia and Slovenia. Unter den Linden is a boulevard in Berlin which is lined with linden trees, as it's name suggests.

A group of three beech trees snuggle together, one of which is a copper beech. I love to observe these three trees over the seasons, especially when Autumn turns their leaves into a burning brightness of copper and gold - a veritable biblical burning bush.

Much more delicate than all of the above trees is the silver birch whose silhouette is fine and fragile looking. It's slender silver trunk supports equally slim branches which grow straight and at an angle of roughly 45°, ending in fine drooping twigs.

Looking out across a broad landscape before returning home, I see a variety of tree shapes, some single and others as part of hedgerows which have grown mature. Many are grand silhouettes, whereas others are a jumble of trunk, branches and twigs, but all have a unique purpose to fulfil.

## District Councillors' Update - April 2023

Every household should have now received a copy of Your District Today with news about the work of Folkestone & Hythe District Council. If you've not received a copy it is available online or you can contact us for a copy.

Jenny attended the rescheduled meeting of Lyminge Parish Council on 06 February and made our District Council report. This included the good news that Veolia, the company that collects your kerbside waste on behalf of the District Council, has cut its carbon emissions by 5% over the last two years. They've optimised their routes to reduce fuel consumption, installed electric



bin lifts on the waste collection vehicles, switched to LED lights and more efficient heating at their depot.

Another waste initiative is the Don't Let Your Recycling Go to Waste campaign to help residents put their waste in the right bin for recycling and avoid "wish-cycling", which is when something is put in a recycling bin in the hope it can be recycled. You can see tips and Frequently Asked Questions about recycling at <a href="https://www.folkestone-hythe.gov.uk/recycling-waste-bins/contaminationcampaign/1">www.folkestone-hythe.gov.uk/recycling-waste-bins/contaminationcampaign/1</a>

Over 70% of Folkestone & Hythe District residents have signed up to MyAccount to access services, receive reminders about waste collections and pay their council tax online. Last month saw the launch of Housing Online where council tenants can view and update information about their property. They can also view balances and statements, book a repair, make payments and set up a Direct Debit. Online services provide 24/7 access and are increasingly popular. They bring an extra benefit by free-ing up time at our Contact Centre for staff to deal with people who don't have digital access. MyAccount is also a quick and easy way to report issues.

UK Power Networks has given £27,300 towards the District Council warm spaces at New Romney, Hythe, Folkestone and the Nepalese Community Centre in Folkestone. The money will help with the costs of running the warm spaces and fuel vouchers and wheatgerm packs to those most in need. The warm spaces are open to everyone in the district and provide not just somewhere to be warm but company and activities.

The District Council has won £205,000 of Government funding to install three Changing Places toilets. Specialist equipment includes ceiling hoists and changing tables. The need for such toilets was raised by residents during the Folkestone Place Plan engagement sessions and they'll be sited at the Lower Leas Coastal Park, Folca (the former Debenhams store) both in Folkestone and at the Coastal Destination project in Littlestone. This should enable more severely disabled people to enjoy visits to these places.

We expect the outline planning application of Otterpool Park Garden Town to go to the Planning Committee on 04 April. Otterpool Park Garden Town was first proposed in 2016 and it's taken a long time to reach this point. It's intended to provide new homes of all sizes and tenures (self build, joint ownership, council homes, housing associations, starter homes, family homes, homes designed for the elderly) complete with its own facilities such as schools, doctors' surgery, shops and green spaces. We think this is the best way to provide the majority of the new homes our district needs rather than growing every existing village and town. Do check the Otterpool Park website for details of events – there is a programme of learning and other events for the year like the storytelling competition that attracted over 40 entries internationally and Jenny was fortunate to be a judge and present the prize

We held our budget meeting on Wednesday 22 February: the Folkestone & Hythe District Council portion of council tax equates to about 16% of the total bill (including local Parish precepts). An increase of 2.97% (equivalent to less than 20p a week for an average Band D property) was agreed for 2023/24. Some projects will need to be put on hold or scaled back but services to our residents should not be affected. 

## PARISH COUNCIL ELECTION ON 4 MAY 2023

Many people will be aware that there is an election coming up in May. At the time of writing, the Notice of Election is due to be published on 17 March, and this should now be available on the Folkestone and Hythe District Council website. All the councillor positions on the parish council are up for election. If an existing councillor wishes to stand again, they must submit a nomination like every other candidate.

#### WHO CAN BE A COUNCILLOR?

The role is voluntary (ie it is not paid) and does not require any formal qualifications. Eligibility to stand as a Parish Councillor in Lyminge is determined by a number of legal requirements that you can check here:

If you follow this link, you can find out more about the role and the election process, and also download the nomination papers you need if you decide to stand. YOU MUST SUBMIT YOUR NOMINATION IN PERSON AT THE CIVIC CENTRE, CASTLE HILL AVENUE, FOLKESTONE CT20 2QY BY 4PM ON TUESDAY 4 APRIL 2023.

The Parish Council elections are run for the parish by Folkestone and Hythe District Council. Further information on the electoral process in our district is available here:

#### VOTING ON ELECTION DAY

There will be a ballot for Parish Councillors only if the number of nominations exceeds the number of vacant positions. Lyminge Ward has 10 councillor positions and Etchinghill Ward has 3 councillor positions. In recent years, it has been rare for a ballot to take place for the Parish Council, and if this happens again, then any candidate nominated by the due date will be automatically elected.

Even if there is no ballot for the Parish Council, there will still be a ballot for the District Council on 4 May.

#### **VOTER PHOTO-ID**

All electors need to be aware that new rules have been introduced requiring voter photo-ID at the polling station.

Valid forms of photo-ID include a passport, photo driving licence and older person's bus pass. You can check the full list of acceptable photo-ID at the link above. If you have no ID on this list, you can apply free-ofcharge for a Voter Authority Certificate, which will allow you to vote on polling day. You must bring acceptable photo-ID, which includes a Voter Authority Certificate, to the polling station on 4 May in order to cast your vote. So check today if you need to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate, and if you do, apply without delay to ensure you have a vote on Polling Day.

## PUBLICITY IN THE PRE-ELECTION PERIOD

The Pre-Election Period is a formal period that runs from 27 March to Polling Day. It used to be known as Purdah. It is a period when councils need to be extremely careful about the activities they undertake and the information they publish. These rules

are designed to prevent any activity, particularly communications from the Council, that might be thought to influence the outcome of the elections.

The Parish Council is concerned not to fall foul of the Pre-Election Period rules, and therefore the focus of our pages in the Newsletter this month is on the forthcoming Election. We are sorry not to be able to give reports on a number of activities that have taken place in the run-up to the Pre-Election Period and that we know are of concern to many residents. ### When and What To Sow

Most of us will be starting to feel that spring is on the way. Be mindful of the weather but hopefully the earth is starting to warm up. A soil thermometer is a fail safe way of checking the soil temperature and they are an inexpensive piece of gardening equipment. Hopefully by April much of the main spring sowings will be under way. And there is much to be sown!

• Outside (depending on weather and soil conditions)

Root crops including the first sowings of beetroot, turnips, carrots & parsnips

Mangetout & podding peas & broad beans - although these often do better started in pots/trays

The first sowings of summer salads including lettuces, endive, cress, rocket, radishes

Brassica crops for eating this summer & also through into the winter – kale, summer and (early) winter cabbages, Brussels sprouts, purple sprouting broccoli, calabrese and cauliflowers

Swiss chard & leaf beet

Leeks

Radishes and spring onions

#### In trays or pots

If you have slug or weed problems, then you may find all of the brassica crops, leeks and salads do better started in trays/modules and then planted out when they are better able to withstand them.

Similarly broad beans and peas may have to be started indoors if you have trouble with mice

• In trays or pots somewhere warm (germinator/warm airing cupboard etc). Bear in mind that they will need somewhere warm & light to grow on

Tomatoes, peppers and aubergines, ideally by the end of March.

Celery/celeriac (again need heat to germinate)

Courgettes, squashes, cucumbers and melons (but not too early, or they will get too large before the weather is good enough for them to go outside)

## In a polytunnel or greenhouse

Summer salads

French beans for an early crop

Herbs including basil, coriander & parsley

## **Creamy Leek and Potato Soup**

This easy 4 ingredient soup is creamy and luxurious without using cream.

You will need 4 leeks, 4 medium potatoes, around 800 ml of veg stock, I tbl olive oil.

Simply fry the cleaned and chopped leeks in a little olive oil for around 5 minutes in a heavy bottomed pan. Remove a couple of dessert spoonfuls of the leeks to use as garnish.

Add the potatoes that you have peeled or scrubbed (its up to you) and thinly sliced. Keep them moving in the pan for around 5 minutes before adding the vegetable stock to cover.

Bring to the boil then simmer for around 20 minutes until potatoes are soft.

Use hand blender to liquidise or use a standing blender and do it in batches.

Add more stock if needed. Season to taste (you can add herbs if you like), add the reserved leeks for garnish, and Eat!

## **Gardening in Climate Change**

## Elise Moss

Private gardens represent 5% of the land in the UK which is a vast area. We can help make a difference by reversing the decline in biodiversity and help us get through future extreme weather events by managing our gardens a bit differently. I don't claim to be any expert, just a beginner who wishes to share some helpful tips I've picked up along the way! I've recently attended a Kent Wildlife Trust online training course called "Gardening in Climate Change" which has inspired me to write this article.

## **Drought**

There are some easy steps to make your garden drought resistant.

- Leave your grass a bit longer, which will also act as a refuge for insects and other wildlife. And, no need to water it. It will come back!
- Plant more trees and bushes to create shade- which you'll be glad to have in these hotter summers to come.
- Collect water! As many water butts as you can. You'll be amazed how much water you can collect from a shed roof.
   Ideally, think about putting as close as you can to where you think you might need it most. Your vegetable patch for example. I struggled to buy a water butt during the summer as they kept being out of stock. I wasn't the only one to have the same idea. So maybe do it now.

## **Floods**

One of the best tools to fight floods is to use our gardens to "absorb" the rain. Plants have got this great ability to absorb rain in periods of high precipitation and release it during drier weather.

- Avoid paving or concreting. Even if you have a concreted area, you can have plants in pots or raised beds.
- Again, plant trees and shrubs if you can. They will absorb more rain than grass. Even if you a have a small patch of grass
  at the front of your house, planting small trees and shrubs will make a difference.
- Don't leave bare ground. Maybe create a mini meadow and an uncut patch of grass.

## Wind

How many fences did we lose during the high winds last year? Planting hedges instead of erecting fences has many benefits. It will protect from the winds, but not break in high winds like a fence. It will provide habitats for wildlife and help restore our lost diversity. You might find it's less maintenance and less costly in the long run.

## In summary, plant, plant, plant.

## Report from public meeting with representatives of Pentland Homes regarding the building of 49 new homes in Lyminge - Date: 8 March 2023

Meeting requested by Lyminge Parish Council and representing Pentland Homes were Paul Kitchingham, Peter Reed, Jason Lewis and Matthew Woodhead.

Pentland Homes answered questions from the public.

#### **Houses for Lyminge**

The original planning permission, given last year, was for 30 homes. Pentland considered these plans weren't viable so new plans for 47 homes, consisting of mixed housing and 2 self-build detached homes, will be put forward to Folkestone and Hythe District Council.

The village of Lyminge is considered under-developed; Pentland feel that building 49 homes would save future green fields development. They also consider there are benefits which would include a higher CIL payment by them.

Each home will be built to a high standard with underfloor heating and EV charging points.

Social Housing: Ten units will be built for social housing. The homes will be offered on a tiered system where locals will be prioritised.

There were concerns that Pentland Homes would continue building between Lyminge and Etchinghill until they are joined together. Pentland stated that this wasn't so as the golf club belongs to a charitable organisation and is protected.

#### Drainage

The development can't discharge their excess surface water onto neighbouring land. Within the plans are two holding areas for wastewater to be collected to stop this happening.

There will be two open ponds to collect the rain from a heavy downpour, to give it time to soak away. There was a discussion whether the ponds should be dry (as the design) or wet in style.

There would be an underground storage system of containers (attenuation crates) to collect foul waste which would be pumped into the village's drainage system at low volume times. The foul drainage system will join the village system in the Greenbanks area. Pipework will be installed mostly in the verge. Temporary closures and steel plate covers will ensure uninterrupted access to the Surgery and Greenbanks.

#### **Highways**

Pentlands have had a transport assessment completed, including traffic counts, and the authorities deem it acceptable. There was a great deal of discussion around traffic and parking. A speed limit survey was also commissioned for KCC highways and was approved. The 30mph sign will be moved forward to cover the new road.

The development includes 115 parking spaces and 10 garages. This allows parking for 2 cars per household plus 17 visitor spaces.

There is no air quality map as developers are not required to provide one. Most roadway within the estate is for shared usage by vehicles and pedestrians. Roads with separate pathways are at the entrance area. The hedges will also be trimmed and there will be improved access to the golf course.

The new homes are within walking distance to bus stops and this could provide the bus service with extra customers and in the long run help keep those services.

KCC promote a no street lighting policy, but it isn't known if it applies to this development.

#### Pressures on infrastructure

Concerns regarding the pressure of extra children for Lyminge school were acknowledged.

There were concerns about how the surgery next to the development would cope with the extra patients.

Any needs should be addressed by KCC as the CIL money is for providing extra needs that the development might put on the community.

#### **Biodiversity**


The planting schedule has yet to be agreed. Consultants are employed to advise on these matters – including impact on the River Stour. Natural England vet the reports and approve.

A landscape scheme will be submitted to FHDC.

#### **Timescale**

The two self builds have been approved and sold. These owners will start building their homes this summer; therefore an access road will be built for their use. For the rest of the development, plans are going in immediately, and Pentland would like to begin building in the autumn.

#### LYMINGE THEN AND NOW

This is the fifth of a regular feature provided by the Lyminge Historical Society in which we hope to learn a little more about our historic community. Pairs of photographs will show how some well-known local views have changed, or perhaps how they have not changed very much, over the past 100 years or so.





Old Robus is instantly recognisable in the picture on the left that dates to around 1902. At this time it was still Robus Farm, although later it was bought by a doctor, and Lyminge Surgery was built in the garden. Standing in the road is William Carswell, wheelwright and undertaker who lived in South Cottage just behind the photographer on what was then known as Elham Road. His son Albert is sitting on the wall at the right hand end. Next to Albert is possibly Louis Head who lived on Nash Hill. Next to him are Ernest and Sidney Halls whose father was gardener at Lindon Hall, just round the bend in the road on the left, as it still is today.


