Margaret Saunders' Meanderings

We are suddenly in a warm run of days as we leave Summer and approach Autumn, with temperatures up in the high twenties. Setting off towards New Barn in the latter part of the afternoon, the breeze is strong but warm. Passing the village pond I notice ripe plump blackberries, which I hope will still be there on my return. Climbing the steep hill towards the Remembrance trees, I will be glad to reach the shady path, the ancient track that links Lyminge to New Barn and beyond. Bright red hawthorn berries, already ripe, shine in the sunlight, a rich feast for the birds when the weather turns cold. Rapidly ripening rosehips push out from the path margins, some already red, others pale green or orange. Early ivy flowers are formed, which will provide late pollen for foraging bees in the next couple of months.

Taking a well worn path through the foliage, I am now on the east side of the footpath along the field margin, which runs close and parallel to the main track. Harvesting has taken place and the stubble has yet to be ploughed in. Ridges of straw run in rows along and across the field, the stalks glistening in the late

afternoon light. Underneath

these and crosshatching the field, thin lines pattern ground, left behind by the plough. Underfoot, every now and then empty cobnut shells show evidence of squirrel activity; fresh fallen greener nuts waiting for their next foray. Stalks of cuckoo pint, also known as lords-and-ladies and Adam and Eve, are beginning to show in the hedgerow, their toxic bright red berries conspicuous amongst the browns and greens prevalent at this time of year. Elderberries hang in huge clusters, ready for birds to glean and humans to gather. Field maple tree seeds are changing colour from green to a pinky

orange, as they too begin to ripen, their symmetrical 'wings' designed to carry their seeds far and wide in the Autumn winds.

The white pom-pom seedheads of sow thistle shine in the slanting sun next to the spiky heads of burdock, the small hooks of the latter having evolved to attach themselves to the fleece of passing sheep or fur of other animals as a means of dispersal. Other names for burdock include sticklebacks, sticky Jack and sticky Bobs. The Wildlife Trust states that 'The flower heads of Greater burdock form the basis of the traditional 'Burry Man' parade in Edinburgh - dressed head to toe in burs, he walks about the town'.

A few fallen leaves, dry, brown and brittle, scrunch underfoot; a beech tree, laden

with mast - pig's heaven - absorbs the post meridian sun; a scattering of red poppies, their colour gradually fading; old man's beard flowers, pale yellow and star-like are just

beginning to open. I walk alongside the field that circles the village hall. Milk chocolate coloured and as yet unharvested flax covers the hillside, the occasional pale purple petal clinging to the plants. Small white feathers are caught amongst the flax globes, fluttering in the breeze. Descending along the path, the church bells suddenly ring out – it is Monday and bell ringing

practice has begun. Near the village hall, a bank of convolvulus climbs up the trees, their bold white trumpet flowers all facing the light source. Between bell peals I catch the sound of a wren, it's song high pitched but strong.

Back to the village pond to pick those juicy blackberries. The pond bed is dry and a mass of vegetation is growing around the banks, including great hairy willow-herb with its pink and cream flowers, also known as Codlins-

and-cream, codlins being the name of a cooking apple.

The strong breeze has made photography a little difficult, as close shots require the subject to remain still. Patience was rewarded however, but stung ankles was the price paid for some of the photos as I tried to get that little bit closer.

District Councillors' Update - October 2023

Planning – I have received a number of enquiries on planning issues throughout the Ward recently and have visited a number of sites. If you have an issue with a planning application please do contact me.

A great Community event at Lyminge Church on 1 September. Lovely music from Will Wright and The Undecided – first time I have danced in a church! Well done to all involved. Earlier in the day I visited the Charity Shop at Lyminge Age UK Centre and we discussed a Ward Grant to help with external signage.

Waste service - A report by East Kent Audit Partnership has identified that some aspects of the District's street cleansing service need to improve, particularly in relation to town centres and busier areas of the district. This has resulted in a number of improvements being recommended in a report being considered by the Audit & Governance Committee.

Otterpool Park –On 8 September, I joined the Design Team for Phase 1b (Barrow Hill Sellindge) on a tour of the area surrounding the site and pointed out some of the characteristics and issues for the Villages. I joined the morning session of the Planning Day on 9 September.

Do sign up to 'My Community Voice' - a messaging service that helps Kent and Medway residents, businesses, and community groups to keep in touch with their local policing teams. The service sends updates about your local area directly from the police officers themselves: it allows you to reply to the alerts sent to you, share information and tell Officers about the issues affecting you.

Stagecoach has implemented a set of wide ranging and savage cuts to local bus services across the district. These cuts in services have caused a great deal of stress and disruption for people in the district. Please check the Stagecoach website (https://www.stagecoachbus.com/timetables) for up-to-date timetables.

F&HDC were awarded £570k Rural Prosperity Fund to be used between 2023 and 2025. When the details are confirmed, on what the grant can be used for and how to apply, they will be placed on the Folkestone Works website (https://folkestone.works/).

FHDC Councillors who represent the North Downs wards recently held a meeting to discuss the issues facing those communities and how the District Council can best support them. A number of topics were discussed and we are hoping to arrange a forum to explore these important issues further. The Parish Council quarterly Joint meetings held with the District Council take place online and the next meeting is on 16th November. The meeting can be viewed via the live stream on YouTube: bit.ly/YouTubeMeetings

The review of the Otterpool Park project is continuing. The Governance report has been received and the recommendations are being implemented. The Financial report has been received and the recommendations are being discussed. The third element, Management Review, is ongoing.

F&HDC are predicting a £4.5million deficit for next year and there is likely to be a reduction in services to save money. Consultations are ongoing, all front-line services and statutory services will be fully protected. I'll provide further updates when available.

We also had goodie boxes to take away, and the service was excellent.


On 25th October we look forward to a talk on the *Deal*, *Walmer and Kingsdown Lifeboats*.

On Friday 15th September, Cllrs Arnold, Joyce and Norman met with Peter Reed and Paul Kitchingham of Pentland Homes. The agenda for the meeting was centred around the development with the aim of gaining clarity on some of the questions more commonly asked by our residents.

Pentland Homes have engaged in a lot of discussion with the FHDC planning department resulting in many amendments to their original planning application.

All relevant legal documentation and specialist checks have been adhered to and, at present, the proposed number of dwellings for the site is 45 (This is 15 more than the original approved application 20/1397/FH). The 45 includes 10 affordable dwellings (up from 6 in the original planning application) and two self-build plots.



Pentland Homes have suggested that they will be requesting an additional local connection criterion so that before the affordable homes are offered to the wider district, anyone eligible, who has a local connection to Lyminge Parish will be given priority. Pentland Homes have iterated their desire to be transparent and have agreed to regular 'catch-ups' with LPC to keep us and the parish aware of any developments. The planning application is due before FHDC planning committee at the start of October in which a final decision will be made.

Pumpkin Butter

Ingredients

- 1 (3-pound) pumpkin, stemmed, halved lengthwise, and seeded
 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1 tablespoon vegetable oil
- 1/4 cup apple cider
- 1/3 cup light brown sugar
- 3 tablespoons honey
- 1 teaspoon apple cider vinegar
- 3/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon

- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/4 teaspoon grated fresh nutmeg
- pinch of ground pepper

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F. Brush cut sides of pumpkin halves with oil. Arrange pumpkin halves, cut side down, on a large rimmed baking sheet lined with parchment paper. Bake in preheated oven until very tender when pierced with a fork, about 50 minutes. Remove from oven, and let cool slightly, about 10 minutes.
- 2. Scoop flesh from cooled pumpkin; transfer to bowl of a food processor. Discard pumpkin shell. Add apple cider; process until smooth, about 1 minute, stopping to scrape down sides of bowl as needed. Add brown sugar, honey, vinegar, cinnamon, ginger, salt, nutmeg, and cloves; process until smooth, about 20 seconds, stopping to scrape down sides as needed.
- 3. Transfer pumpkin mixture to a saucepan; bring to a simmer over a medium heat, stirring occasionally. Reduce heat to low; cook, stirring occasionally with a rubber spatula to ensure bottom of saucepan does not scorch and sides of saucepan stay clean, until mixture is reduced by one-third and turns slightly darker in colour, about 25 minutes. Remove from heat; let cool to room temperature, about 30 minutes.





Berkeley Earth Global Temperature Update

It may not have felt like it here, but globally August was the hottest August since records began, according to an update from Berkeley Earth, clocking in at 1.68°C above pre-industrial temperatures – a full 0.3°C above the previous record. They went on to say that 2023 is now "virtually certain (>99%)" to be the hottest year on record. See https://berkeleyearth.org/

Record Red Admiral Butterflies - a Sign of Our Changing Climate

We reported last month that Red Admirals were the most commonly reported butterfly in Lyminge Parish during the Big Butterfly Count. Butterfly Conservation have now published the full results, with Red Admiral also top of the country-wide list. This is an increase of 338% on last year's Count and the first time the species has taken the top-spot. Why the big increase? The Red Admiral is a migratory species that breeds primarily in warmer regions of the world including southern Europe and north Africa. Migrating individuals usually arrive in the UK in spring or autumn, but our changing climate is creating more opportunities for the species to breed and reside here in the UK.



Sadly some other of our favourite garden butterflies aren't doing so

well. The most notable is probably the Small Tortoiseshell, probably the commonest non-white garden butterfly in my childhood, now not making the "big six" most reported species and with a 30% decline recorded over 13 years of the Big Butterfly Count.

One of the take-home messages from Butterfly Conservation was that everyone can help make more space



for butterflies. Rather like our very own "Our Wild Acre" initiative, Butterfly Conservation commented that "Whether it's leaving a patch of long grass in your garden or planting a small selection of nectar rich plants on a balcony, the opportunities are vast and everyone can make a difference... We can build a UK-wide network of spaces for butterflies to feed, breed and shelter. By creating a Wild Space everyone can make a difference and help butterflies and moths thrive. Butterfly Conservation has free resources and guidance on creating a Wild Space available, including accessible, tailored, simple advice for anyone to have a go." Ivy Flowers - an Autumn Life-Line for Pollinators

Ivy flowers may not appear particularly striking to our eyes, but take a look at or just listen to a patch of ivy in bloom and it becomes quickly apparent that the flowers are alive with insect pollinators. One of the most abundant is the ivy bee, with stunning cream-coloured bands on its otherwise dark abdomen, which collects pollen almost exclusively from ivy flowers. Other bees, hoverflies, wasps and butterflies will also be spotted, including the impressive hornet-mimicking hoverfly which often gets mistaken for a hornet but is far more common here than hornets are. There is no doubt that flowering ivy is one of the most important plants for our pollinators during late autumn and into early winter. As such it is worth being considerate when cutting ivy back,



wherever possible leave it until the flowers are finished, or even better once the berries are finished, which are a significant food source for birds over winter. Late winter or very early spring is perhaps the best time, as ivy is then a very popular nesting choice for many birds.

LYMINGE THEN AND NOW

Our monthly look at how Lyminge has changed over the years, with thanks to Lyminge Historical Society.





This house stands just beyond the top of Longage Hill, opposite the bus stop at Rhodes Minnis on the main road running from Sibton towards West Wood. The carpark opposite (not visible in the picture) is a clue to its former life as a pub. In around 1912 when the photo on the left was taken, this was a Rigden's pub, known as The Prince of Wales. The landlord was William Roberts and he ran the pub with his wife Harriet, who is probably depicted in the photo with their 5 year old daughter Hilda. By this stage, the pub had been operating for around 40 years old. In the wake of the announcement of the engagement of Prince Charles (now King Charles) to Lady Diana Spencer in February 1981, it became briefly The Prince of Wales and Lady Diana, and then The Prince and Princess of Wales, but after they were divorced in 1994, it changed name yet again becoming The Battle of Britain before it closed shortly afterwards. The house today presents a Kent tile-hung façade that looks authentic and original. It is therefore interesting to note that over a hundred years ago, it was covered in painted weatherboarding, so while it looks old, this is not the appearance it had when it was built.
