Margaret Saunders' Meanderings

My meanderings this month took me to Cornwall and my starting point is Porth Farm (National Trust) on the eastern tip of the Roseland Peninsular. Setting off on the South West Coastal Path with the sea on my left, I follow the narrow well worn path southwards, leaving Towan beach behind me, with the tide nearing its lowest point. Sheltered from the wind, it is warm although the sun is struggling behind a high haze of thin cloud. Out to sea the sky is a clear very pale blue, the clouds forming as the moisture laden air reaches the land. Low scrubby hedges protect walkers from the cliff edge, which although not sheer is far too steep for comfort and definitely not navigable. Sounds of the sea are clearly audible as I progress along the path.

Before long the hedge level lowers and I look down into a small cove, golden sand pristine and untouched by human feet, the small waves lapping in gently. Movement on the shore attracts my attention. Three oystercatchers are moving in and out of the edge of the foam, pushing their long red beaks deep into the sand, searching out mussels and limpets. I'm glad that I have my binoculars with me as otherwise I would have missed this treat. On black rocks, a little further out, equally black cormorants are lined up, waiting to





take off and skim the waves in search of their next meal of small eels or fish.

Moving on, I can no longer hear the sea as here it laps gently against the cliffs. Fields are cultivated close to the footpath, their freshly ploughed rich redbrown earth attracting seagulls, indicating a fertile soil. Ahead and slightly inland a herd of tan coloured cows fill a field and round bales of straw are stored in the lea of a hedgerow. Bracken has been singed brown by the constant salt laden winds and blackberry bushes bear shrivelled fruit, except in more sheltered spots where sweet berries make a welcome snack. Sloes are soft and ripe.

Another cove comes into view, equally inaccessible to humans by land, the sand covered with a thick layer of seaweed, its strong smell filling the air. Swathes of it cover a plateau of rock well above the sand. On another beach I


had seen seaweed growing out of the sand, its roots holding firm but this looks more like a huge seaweed deposit as the rock would not afford good rooting material.

I continue walking, the only sound is the wind in my face until I hear the sea again, and yet another cove hails into view. The motion of the waves has left a scalloped pattern of pale grey shingle mixed with darker seaweed, which no doubt changes with every ebb and flow of the tide. Somehow, people have been on this beach as evidenced by many footprints in the soft dry sand at the base of the cliff, plus a turquoise flag on a pole next to a tall carefully constructed cairn of round flat rocks, probably at least a foot in diameter, creating a tall column as the rocks are of a similar size and depth.



Back to the path and small golden coloured fungi in the shape of umbrellas or parasols edge the path for a few yards. Field mushrooms bubble up in the landward field, their white domes already nibbled in places by insects, one eaten to such an extent it looks very like a skull. Bright yellow blackberry leaves with red spots catch my eye, glowing amongst the dark green of the background scrub.

Realizing that the circular walk I had embarked upon was going to take too long to complete, due to my constant stopping to look at things, I decide to return along the way I had come, enjoying the reverse view. To my surprise far below I spot a small narrow cove I had missed on the outward walk, the hedge having obstructed my line of sight. Sheer black rock borders one side, sheltering the tiny beach where the waves continually rise and tumble. Long shapes draw my attention and focussing my binoculars I see twenty seals hauled up on the shore with three more frolicking in the deeper water. Near where I had set off on my walk, I had seen a noticeboard giving information about seals, asking people to stay away from them. The seals I was now watching had found the perfect spot, inaccessible to humans apart from by boat, giving them the security and freedom to take ownership of the beach without threat of disturbance - half submerged rocks



these wonderful creatures and grateful too that some places remain for them to find a safe haven.



Continuing back I pass another bay where a relatively recent rock fall has tumbled onto the shore, showing that even strong rock can crumble and that care needs to be taken when near the edge. Here the sea is mottled, ranging from turquoise to navy as underwater rocks and seaweed create patterns.

I finally return to Towan beach, my starting point. Before taking the path back to the car, I admire the rock formations which provide nooks and crannies for rockpools, housing waving fronds of deep pink and bright green seaweed and creatures that dart into the darkness of overhanging rocks. Limpets pepper the surfaces, looking very like ancient tents on a hilltop encampment. I have had a wonderful afternoon. in a sea environment so different from our own on the south Kent coast.





I was pleased to attend another project initiated by the previous administration with the launch of the mobile food van and the first anniversary of The Pantry in Hythe. The mobile food bank and pantry will initially visit Hawkinge, Lydd and two places in Folkestone but if there is a call for it in other areas, further stops can be added in the future. Some householders in Kent will be eligible to receive the latest £300 cost of living payment directly from the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) between 31 October and 19 November. You DO NOT need to apply or do anything else to claim the payment If you are eligible, you will automatically receive the money straight into your bank account. These types of events often provide an opportunity for criminals to contact you and state that you need to apply, and they will try to obtain your personal/financial data. If you get a phone call, email or text message like this, it is a SCAM.

A project to transform a brownfield site in Folkestone into a high-quality, housing-led development has received a £2.5m boost from central government. The successful application by the previous administration for Brownfield Land Release Fund money will go towards the remediation of the former Ship Street gasworks required to enable the construction of up to 150 homes. Having been derelict for more than 60 years, the project seeks to open up the site by providing energy-efficient and sustainable properties at a density consistent with its surroundings.

We have had some good news; Stagecoach have told us that, subject to the bus regulator's agreement, the number 10 route will be going to Lympne again!

From 1st November the new Parliamentary boundary lines that have been drawn up by the Boundary Commission, will be implemented for the next General Election. This means that North Downs East and North Downs West wards of the F&HDC area will now form part of the Ashford Constituency at Parliamentary elections. The District Wards and the County Council Divisions will remain the same.

A review of the polling districts, polling places and stations is being conducted and runs from 2nd October 2023 to 17th November. I mentioned the Rural England Prosperity Fund grant in my last report and I am pleased to tell you that details of the fund and how to apply have now been published. All the information regarding this fund can be found on the Folkestone Works website (https://folkestone.works/).

It was agreed at the last Overview and Scrutiny meeting that F&HDC could seek to find a Joint Venture partner for Otterpool Park to inject funding into the development.







Community Allotments

As the growing year has drawn to a close the community allotments at the Tayne centre are due for renewal. Emails have been sent to all the current holders so please do check your email and spam folders in case you haven't already seen the email. Currently there are four x 1 metre square plots available for next year. The plot is free to use but you are required to sign an agreement and abide by the rules for allotment maintenance. Thoughtful Food are very happy to give you advice on planting and what to grow.

What should I be doing now in my garden?

- Divide rhubarb then cover with a layer of well-rotted manure or compost to feed the crowns for next year.
- Collect as many deciduous tree fallen leaves as possible. If you have space just pile them up and cover them to exclude the light. Alternatively, fill large black sacks (an ideal way to recycle any!), punch a few holes in them. Tie the tops and leave in a tucked away place to rot down. When they are obviously rotting down you can add them bit by bit to your compost.
- Clear gutters and down-pipes leading to water butts or tanks. Make sure you have a water farming option for the dry weather next year. Every little helps!
- Finish collecting seeds from your plants make sure they are dry before storing them in little paper envelopes or small recycled plastic containers which are completely dry inside.
- Tidy up your pond maybe put a net over it to prevent the leaves filling up the pond although I have to confess I often never get round to this one!
- Plant any trees or shrubs while they are asleep
- If you haven't already started make compost or start a wormery. You don't need a huge area just a Dalek container or a home made pallet container which you put your garden trimmings and kitchen waste into you can also add small amounts of wood ash waste from a log fire (NOT any coal ash...), a layer of well rotted manure, a layer of sawdust, a layer of grass clippings, a layer of well rotted manure, bits of paper/cardboard. I cover mine with sheets of cardboard but lift that when I add stuff to it.

Leek Crumble

Ingredients (for 6 people) For the crumble:

- 110g bread crumbs
- 110g chopped hazelnuts
- 1 chopped garlic clove
- 25q flour
- 1tp basil
- 1tp rosemary
- 1tp oregano
- 50g butter

For the filling:

- 50g butter
- 4 leeks thinly cut
- 25g flour
- 275ml milk
- 2 tomatoes, peeled and thinly cut
- 2tp sage
- Salt, pepper

Method

Preheat the oven at 180°C

Mix the bread crumbs, hazelnuts, garlic and herbs. Add the butter, then the cheese.

Press the mixture at the bottom of a flan pan and cook for 20min until golden.

For the filling, melt the butter in a pan and fry the leeks for about 10min. Add the flour, then the milk and cook for 5min while stirring Add the tomatoes, sage, salt and pepper.

Spread the crumble on the mixture and bake for 20 min.

Global temperature update: 2023 is "virtually certain" to be Earth's hottest year

According to new analysis by Carbon Brief (www.carbonbrief.org) there is a greater than 99% chance that 2023 will be the hottest year on record. The analysis combined multiple temperature datasets to conclude it is "virtually

certain" that this year will be the hottest for millennia. After a cooler start to the year, the past four months have seen truly exceptional global temperatures, surpassing prior monthly records by large margins, according to the analysis. The details can be found on https://www.carbonbrief.org/analysis-greater-than-99-chance-2023-will-be-hottest-year-on-record/

In a separate Carbon Brief article, the recent mass deaths of river dolphins in the Amazon are likely to have been caused by the extreme heat and droughts impacting South America. Record-low river levels that are leaving boats stranded and cutting off food and water supplies to remote villages are being considered a "warning signal" that the rainforest is approaching a tipping point.

Electricals Recycling in Hythe

Thanks to local resident Katharine for this recommendation: "Have you heard of the recycling of electricals that takes place on Saturdays at **Open Door, 101, Hythe High Street**? This includes: household appliances, TVs/entertainment/toys, grooming, lighting and lamps, mains/battery powered tools, electrical leads or wiring, electric clocks and alarms, computers and laptops, phones and cameras. They don't take light bulbs/

fluorescent tubes, e-cigarettes, car batteries, any large items that don't fit in your wheelie bin. I have used this several times and been delighted to know that I'm not causing more land fill.

The collection is organised through Hythe Environmental Community Group and is run by Volunteers from 10am to 4pm. From Hythe they will be taken to a state-of-the-art facility in Sittingbourne and 75% of the material will be turned into something useful. It's good to hear of positive projects and though not Lyminge based it's good to spread the word."



FHDC Net Zero Toolkit

Folkestone and Hythe District Council has recently published a "Net Zero Carbon Toolkit", a "practical, easy to follow guide to help plan a net zero development project". For full details see https://www.folkestone-hythe.gov.uk/climate-change/net-zero-toolkit

According to the website, the Toolkit has been developed with joint funding from Homes England and is a non-statutory document but implementing the measures laid out in the new toolkit will help deliver net zero, environmentally friendly developments aligned to the targets, values and outcomes of the Council's cross-cutting priorities outlined in the Corporate Plan and Low Carbon Action Plan. It will also support the Council's future review of the Local Plan by acting as an evidence based document to support more ambitious climate change policies. It comprises the following:

Part One – Decarbonising buildings: Strategic objectives: It lays the foundations for the Toolkit documents by explaining legal climate change requirements and policy context. It also explains the "whys" for being ambitious with Net Zero Carbon new buildings.

Part Two – New buildings: Its main aim is to communicate how new developments that are consistent with climate change objectives can be designed and constructed. It covers both domestic and non-domestic developments and includes useful 'one pagers'.

Part Three – Retrofit: It seeks to communicate the importance of retrofit, explain which key improvements need to be made in a simple way. It also signposts useful guidance on retrofit.



LYMINGE THEN AND NOW

Our monthly look at how Lyminge has changed over the years, with thanks to Lyminge Historical Society.





It is not easy to tell that these two photographs are taken from roughly the same spot. The black and white photo shows the long Men's Block of the Elham Union Workhouse, located in Etchinghill, and next to it the Nurses' Home. The workhouse first opened its doors in 1836, providing centralised care for the poor of 20 local parishes, including Lyminge. The Men's Block was part of an extension in 1895 and the Nurses' Home was built in the early 20th Century shortly before this picture was taken. The workhouse was taken over by Kent County Council in 1930 and then by the National Health Service when it was formed in 1948 and operated as St Mary's Geriatric Hospital until it closed in 1990. The site was then cleared and redeveloped, the only surviving building being the chapel which was converted to residential use. Most of the site is now covered by the houses of Meriden Park, although it is the Village Hall that now occupies this view. The former cabbage field between the hospital and the main road is now a playing field.



Ist Lyminge Brownies spent the evening stream dipping in the Nailbourne with science teacher, Kate. We found water boatman, whirligig beetles, shrimps and lots of stickleback fish, all indicating that our stream is very healthy.
