Margaret Saunders' Meanderings

This month's meanderings are, as the French would say, vignettes - some petites promenades, rather than one purposeful walk.

Rain before seven, gone by eleven the weather saying goes and today it has proved to be true. Grey skies and rain looked set-in for the day but by eleven o'clock, the clouds had cleared and a mostly blue sky allowed the sun to brighten the day. In these short Winter days, sunshine is at a premium: it not only brightens the home but gives life to the countryside, especially as there are colourful leaves still clinging on to the branches of trees. Recent wind has scattered bright yellow leaves from a sycamore tree spilling them out across the pavement and onto the road by the green



space at the bottom of Ethelburga Drive. Ornamental cherry trees have pools of red and yellow leaves, their size and weight ensuring they stay around the tree base. Bright red berries from various shrubs and trees shine out against their dark green foliage, the colours at opposite ends of the spectrum perfectly complementing each other.

Unseasonably mild weather means that many flowers are still in bloom. I pass purple pansies, colourful fuchsias, a couple of brave lavender flowers, dandelions, roses, and I even had a small cluster of apple blossom on my apple tree, tricked into thinking it was Spring! Winter jasmine, appropriately blooming at this time of year, is a joy with its star-like yellow flowers.

The family of four partridges continue to roam the Silverlands estate foraging for food in gardens and under hedges, sometimes settling for a rest and preen under the end of my beech hedge. Another time, one of them indulges in a dust bath in a slight dip in the pavement. Today a pheasant appears, strutting arrogantly, whereas the partridges' waddling gait is more hurried and humble. These birds certainly give a festive feel, as befits the season. A few mornings later, it is cold and frosty and the partridges are back. They have settled under the apple tree - the next best thing when no pear tree is available - fluffed up against the cold.

car and then onto the wall. I try for a photo but miss the opportunity as by the time I am in a good position, they have moved on to another garden.


Locking the village hall car park at Rhodes Minnis one evening, after a fundraising event, I stand still and enjoy the peace and quiet that nature is affording me after a busy but enjoyable day. It has been a perfectly clear day and now it is turning gradually into a perfectly clear night. Wind rustles through the beech hedge; the gate gently squeaks as it moves; the moon, two days from its fullness, and accompanied by a bright star, shines across the countryside, its light falling on the sheep in the field in front of me, turning them into slow moving spectral shapes in the crepuscular light. Turning to the north west, the light is draining from the sky, bright blue fading into soft yellow. Silhouetted against this last light are the pine trees of Lyminge Forest, their pointed tops standing sentinel.



Beech mast, dark brown and already damp and decomposing in the shade of the footpath alongside the Methodist Church. Elder tree trunks, twisted and textured, some elegantly decorated by nature with spiralling ivy trails steadily

climbing skywards. As I walk across Tayne Field a squirrel runs along the path before me, in its characteristic undulating gait. Pausing, I sit on the bench in the watery sunshine, and try to imagine the life of the Anglo-Saxons 1,400 years ago on this very spot. The area before me would have been a hub of activity especially at this time of year when they would have decked the hall in celebration of the Nativity.

Moving into the 21st century, I am in 'Christmas City', as my six year old godson calls the lights in Mount Pleasant. Rain and a blustery wind means that I am struggling with my umbrella. However, it is well worth it as I enter a wonderland of light. Dangling lights sway and joggle in the wind,



time to do justice to all of the scenes. Unsurprisingly I am the only one here tonight, until I begin to retrace my steps as a car pulls up full of excited children. I pause again at my personal favourite - the shepherds, sheep and angel, recalling the true meaning of Christmas. How lucky we are to have such a wonderful display on our very own village doorstep. Thank you Mount Pleasant and thank you to all those who give donations to such worthy causes.

If we get another cold snap, as we did at the beginning of December, with a surprise fall of snow overnight, maybe my next walk will be a white one.



FILM NIGHT - MONDAY 15th JANUARY 2024 at the VILLAGE HALL - DOORS OPEN 7PM for 7.30PM START - "THE GREAT ESCAPER" 12 - Drama. Starring Michael Caine, Glenda Jackson and John Standing. Set in 2014, Bernie and Rene live in a care home in Hove. Bernie decides to attend the 70th anniversary of the D-Day landings in Normandy and, despite missing out on a place on the official trips, he gets a bus from Hove to Dover where he travels by ferry to France. Based on a true story that made national news, the film tells the story of the people he meets and places he goes. Entry fee is £6 pp and includes a glass of wine, tea or coffee with biscuits and entry into a free raffle. New members are welcome, simply register and pay on the night - no need to book.

ERA AGM HELD 3RD DECEMBER 2023: a very interesting and productive meeting supported by 18 residents. The key posts and committee remain unchanged. The 4 main topics raised in the public Open Forum were:

- 1) Consideration of parking restrictions near the junction of Canterbury Road and Chapel Walk due to indiscriminate parking near the junction, particularly on the pavements, which are causing difficulties for locals.
- 2) Improvement/maintenance to the play area at St Marys Close (gate to be locked temporarily for safety reasons until work is complete).
- 3) Consideration of an adult outdoor gym on St Marys Field.
- 4) Maintenance to the emergency access area from St Marys Close into Westfield Lane (missing signage is causing indiscriminate parking and there are damaged/unlocked posts). The ERA is grateful to Lyminge Parish Council's support in helping to resolve these matters.

With reference to the **PLAY PARK**, Councillor Roger Joyce adds: "The idea of 'what to do' with the Play Park in St Mary's has been the subject of some debate. Having discussed the matter with the Village Hall Committee, and with residents at the ERA AGM, it is almost certain that the current play area will be updated with new equipment and safety flooring in its current position. In what form is to be debated and decided by the Lyminge Parish Council, but ideas about the play area and possible adult gym from residents are welcome (particularly from young users!)".

The LPC has also asked the ERA for suggestions for any improvements that can be made in Etchinghill, so that these can be considered for inclusion in the budget as and when Community Infrastructure Levy monies are received from developments that are currently underway.

District Councillors' Update - January 2024

Where has 2023 gone? It certainly has been a challenging year for many residents. And perhaps it is good to be reminded that there are a number of 'Cost of Living' Schemes run by the Council to support people who are struggling – see Help and support with the cost of living - Folkestone & Hythe District Council (folkestone-hythe.gov.uk)



Rural England Prosperity Fund - just a reminder that this fund is now open and

expression of interests can be made via the website Rural England Prosperity Fund - Folkestone Works I have been encouraging Village Halls and Community Centre's in North Downs West to consider applying to this fund for energy efficiency improvements, ie solar panels.

Dungeness Nuclear Industry - I put forward a motion to Full Council on 29 November to support the nuclear industry at Dungeness. As well as providing around 1,000 current jobs at the nuclear sites there's a real prospect of securing more employment and carbon free energy from small modular reactors at Dungeness. The Greens, Labour and LibDems amended the motion to obliterate any reference to Dungeness or Nuclear. Otterpool Park LLP- There has been no further update on seeking a strategic partner to bring in additional finance to the project. However, the leader in answering a question at full Council, said that the original charter and planning terms of reference would be adhered to. He also said that the intention was to keep control of the project! Last week, the appointment of Gary Ridgewell was announced as the new Managing Director to replace Andy Jarrett. I welcome this appointment and wish him every success in taking the project forward. I would like to record thanks to Andy for his commitment and leadership since the inception of the project and wish him well for the future.

I do hope you all had a good Christmas.

A new interim Managing Director, Gary Ridgwell, has been appointed at Otterpool Park LLP. Gary was previously the Construction Director at Otterpool Park LLP for the past two years and knows the development intimately.

Sadly, because of the unavailability of the Red Arrows next August, the Folkestone Air Show has had to be cancelled. The Air Show will be kept under review and alternative events are being considered.

Largely due to the recent heavy rain, areas of Romney Marsh have suffered considerable flooding from sewerage. The environment agency have downgraded the quality of bathing water at Dungerness, Littlestone, St Mary's Bay and Dymchurch. Meetings have been held with the Leader of the Council to try and extract a solution from Southern Water.

I am pleased to report that Councillor Stephen Scoffham's motion to support the Kent Downs application to secure cross channel UNESCO global Geopark status for the Kent Downs national landscape together with the neighbouring protected landscape in France was unanimously supported.



No, the village hall is still owned by the village hall charity which still remains separate from the council. There will be separate finances and separate meetings.

Yes, it is actually happening more and more through the country. People are struggling to get volunteers and as such village halls and community groups in general are struggling. We just have to look at this through a positive lens and remember that the Village Hall is an incredible community asset.

Happy New Year to you all, whether you are seasoned gardeners, beginners or you have made a new year's resolution to try growing some produce this year.

Jobs for January

Sit in front of the fire checking your seeds, reading up on your favourite gardening ideas, eating chocolate and resting! But...if you HAVE to move from your nice warm chair here are a few things you might like to think about!

- Prune apple and pear trees and if you haven't already your blackcurrant and redcurrant and gooseberries. All these plants are dormant (asleep maybe like we should be until March!) so chopping them about a bit before February is fine.
- Clean your greenhouse glass -on a nice sunny sharp day! Not when it's freezing - that could be difficult!
- Sort and organise your pots or get a new life!
- Put food out for the birds. Break ice regularly on their water sources.
- Sow a few sweet peas but protect them from the mice.
- Cut old leaves off hellebores to allow the flower buds to be seen
- Mulch your beds with rotted horse manure or home made compost. This will set you up really well for the new season.
- Buy seed potatoes Earlies crop 12 weeks sowing, 2nd earlies a bit later and main crop later still. Varieties such as Rocket or Swift and Foremost are good Earlies. Charlotte and Maris Peer are good second early. Put your seed potatoes in egg boxes with the sprouting eyes upwards and put them somewhere light and cool to grow stubby strong buds. Don't let them be too warm and dark or else the buds will be white and legy and weak.
- You can cover your vege beds if they don't contain winter vege. Use old sheets or blankets or if you have black plastic lying around then recycle it and place it over the beds. Watch out though for hibernating snails under plastic, in pots and under cardboard!
- Check your compost heaps / daleks and turn it to give more air.



- Don't listen to anyone who says you can sow seeds in January! They need heat! Much better to wait until late February. In fact around Valentine's Day the day is long enough to provide enough light to hardy seeds.
- So....watch out for some sowing advice next month. In the meantime check out Real Seeds and Vital Seeds organic collections.

We have found a home for our community seed box. Look out for February's Newsletter where you will find out more.

LYMINGE THEN AND NOW

Our monthly look at how Lyminge has changed over the years, with thanks to Lyminge Historical Society.





The old view on the left this month is a little different from previous offerings as it is taken from a watercolour painting. It shows the cottage we now know as *Lollipops*, on Canterbury Road opposite North Lyminge Lane, but which 100 years ago was known as *The Shanty* and in 1841 as *Chapel Houses*. We know it was standing in 1760 because it features on a map of the lands belonging to the Rector of Lyminge. It seems to have been built as an almshouse for the use of the poor of the parish. In 1841 it was occupied by Thomas and Ann Raines and their 6 children aged 11 to 1. Thomas was an agricultural labourer. The view in the painting is consistent with the map of 1760 and is no later than 1835 when the chapel in Wesley Terrace (on the left in the photograph) was built. So the painting could be 200 or more years old when Yew Tree Cross at the top of the hill to the right of centre would have been visible from this point, as depicted by the artist.

The painting seems to have been in Hythe in the 1980s, but was auctioned in East Sussex in 2023 and then sold on eBay. If anyone has any information about this painting or the artist who appears to be ER Lais or Luis, please contact the Editor of *Lyminge a history* at <u>robertbaldwin@cantab.net</u>.
