Margaret Saunders' Meanderings

Snowdrops are my favourite flower and each year I eagerly await their arrival. Perce-neige is their French name, meaning snow piercer; the German is **Schneeglöckchen**, little snow bells and the Swiss name is **Amselblumli** or blackbird flower, because they bloom as the amsel, the blackbird, starts to sing. They are also sometimes known as Candlemas Bells, as they flower around 2 February which is Candlemas Day.


In the ruined remains of Sibton Park's ornamental garden around the Winter lake are many snowdrops, as there are in the grounds of Sibton Park itself. Snowdrops boast many varieties and at least three appear here: a single and a double

variety, plus another slightly later flowering single. Their pointed leaves can push through snow and their sap contains an antifreeze. Long held as a symbol of hope, they hold the promise of warmer days to come.

Gently treading, so as not to destroy any of the plants, I walk and wonder at their demure beauty, so simple and yet so sophisticated. Lifting the shy drooping heads of the singles, I see delicate green markings on the three inner petals, the fine lines leading in towards the stamen. Their outer edges show a notch, highlighted in green. Double blooms are more complicated and 'double' is rather an underestimate of the number of inner petals, all with similar green lines leading to separated stamens. The flowers do not need pollinating, but they do act as an early

pollen and nectar source for bumblebees that are out and about on the occasional mild day. As a herald of Spring, what could be more beautiful and at first glance, understated?

In amongst these delights, Winter aconites open their yellow star-like flowers to the sunshine, which filters through the bare branches, making their petals glow gold and shiny. They are part of the buttercup family but






Whilst admiring these treasures, my eye catches sight of something bright red which I thought was a sweet wrapper. But no, it is a fungus, with a few others around too. It's colour is stunning and almost unreal, it's inner 'ear' vibrant red/cerise and the outer a pale pink. Commonly

known as the scarlet elf cup, it grows on decaying sticks in damp places, usually so I feel privileged to have spotted it. Walking along Longage Hill, opposite the

buried under the leaf litter,



Lyminge School grounds have a bank of snowdrops, easily seen from the path across Tayne Field and were in full bloom early in January. Snowdrops have also been planted either side of the gate that leads from Brady Road towards Sibton Park.



Snowdrops are good flowers to share. Most authorities suggest that the bulbs are divided every three or so years and whilst the foliage is still green. My late father-in-law shared some of his snowdrops with me about forty years ago and



I too have divided them over the years and shared them with family and friends. Scotland is the furthest afield they have travelled, arriving the next day by first class post.

Nearby, catkins dangle from hazel trees, steadily lengthening as the days pass, gradually releasing their pollen whenever the wind stirs the air. Hazel has been coppiced for four thousand years and was used in wattle and daub walls for houses and for making wattle fencing, where the canes were, and still are, woven into a lattice pattern.

As we gradually move through February to March, the birds are getting more vociferous at each end of the day, as they begin to find a mate and gather material to make their nests.

Slow walking and keeping one's eyes open certainly pays off when out and about, as there is so much of interest hidden around our feet.

Thoughts from the Church - March 2024

This month we celebrate Mothering Sunday on the 10th, as always, on the 4th Sunday in Lent. Years ago it was also called Midlenting Sunday or Refreshment Sunday. At that time rigorous Lenten fasting and self-denial were the norm, thus it was considered good to have a break, a bit of a feast, or celebration, in mid-Lent. That grew into a custom where people, particularly those in domestic service, or working away in towns, were given the day off to go home and visit their mothers, and maybe indulge in some hearty eating whilst there.

This event today is more often called Mother's Day and looking at the traditional title it occurred to me that "mothering" is an interesting word. We hardly ever use it except for this occasion, and of course it derives from the verb "to mother".

The corresponding verb "to father", or fathering as the male equivalent, tends to mean something a bit different.

The gender references can be confusing, and they have a lot to do with historical stereotypes. Yet anyone can fulfill a mothering role. Regardless of gender. Regardless of biological connection. And regardless of age difference. Some children are mothered by family members other than their parents, and some children provide mothering care for their disabled parents.

At the foot of the cross the disciple John, and Jesus' mother Mary, were commended to the care of one another. Jesus told Mary to now regard His much-loved disciple John as her son. That gave her someone to love and cherish as her own once he had gone. But He also told John to now accept Mary as his own mother, so in turn he now had a mothering role in looking after her. What a wonderful example of God's understanding of our human needs. The recognition of the gap they both needed to fill once He had left their earthly lives.

It is right that we celebrate mothers in all their wonderful, wise, generous and, let's be honest, sometimes madly infuriating manifestations. But let's not forget, too, that anyone who offers mothering to someone else, in any way, is precious to God for their sacrifice of love for others. So perhaps it's time to return to the traditional notion of Mothering Sunday, but with the modern twist of using it to celebrate anyone, regardless of gender, family relationship, age, or formal status, who bestows nurturing care on one whom they love.

District Councillors' Update - March 2024

Police & Crime Panel – At the Meeting on 6 February, it was agreed to support the PCC's proposal to increase the police precept of the council tax by £13 a year or 5.34% for an average Band D property (£1.08 a month or 35p per day). This will maintain the record number of police officers (over 4,000) in the county as well as supporting the New Neighbourhood Policing Model, which is seeing officers deployed to local communities and schools, the PCC has secured funding from the Home Office to deliver extra visible policing in antisocial behaviour and drug hotspots, to help drive crime down. However, even with this increase the Police budget still needs to find £7.3 million of savings!



FHDC Budget – The Budget Meeting will take place on 28 February 2024 and the Council part of the precept is proposed to increase by 2.99%, (the maximum allowed). Full budget details can be seen on the website, but unfortunately, include cuts of over £2 million in staff and £1.5 million in services. Princes Parade – The Leader of the Council has made a decision (subject to call-in) to take down the current hoarding and replace with 1.2m stock fencing at a cost of £70,000 with a further £20,000 allocated for contingency and £10,000 allocated for maintenance! Otterpool Park LLP will cover the cost of removing the current hoarding and store it on the Otterpool site for future use.

F&HDC, in its response to KCC's consultation, has asked that the potential sale of the eight windmills it owns and maintains, including the Davison Mill in Stelling Minnis, be delayed to enable local groups to potentially raise money to buy the historic landmarks and maintain them into the future. The Trustees of the Davison Mill have applied to have the windmill listed as an Asset of Community Value and should hear in the next few weeks if it has been agreed.

It is the time of year to start thinking about Asian Hornets again. The Asians Hornets have been hibernating for the winter and producing queens. Once the outside temperature hits 12 degrees for two or more consecutive days the queens will wake up, look for food and fly off to start a new nest. Please report any sightings at once either by using the Asian Hornet Watch App or by emailing alertnonnative@ceh.ac.uk.

Although the final details are yet to be published, it appears very likely F&HDC will be reporting a balanced budget. This has been achieved without drawing from reserves. Many councils in Kent and nationally are struggling to report a balanced budget and the members and staff have worked extraordinarily hard to achieve this remarkable fete.





What To Do in March

Well, the daylight hours are increasing as we head for the spring equinox (20th March) and the clocks going forward (31st March) launching us into spring! Equinox means equal day to night so after that the plants respond much better. Later sowings often catch up and you don't really gain much by sowing early. Then it is full steam ahead for us gardeners. Mind you don't get too enthusiastic with planting or sowing directly into the soil as it is still pretty cold. The soil needs to be above 10 degrees. Watch for weeds growing then you know other things will also grow.

So get things off to a start under cover. Seeds need warmth but not necessarily light to germinate so you can even stack trays up in a warm place. As soon as they have popped through move them to a warm well lit space. Sow under cover as for February plus peas for pods and beetroot. Then celery and celeriac (needs light to germinate) from mid-month. With warmth tomatoes – sow around mid-month for under cover cropping, melon at month's end. Sow outside garlic if not already, broad beans and after mid-month sow lettuce, spinach, peas, onion seeds and sets, salad onion, early brassicas, parsley, coriander, dill, parsnips and first early potatoes late March. Best to cover these with fleece to start with. Continue adding to your compost pile and why not start a wormery? The liquid you get from it is really effective and saves you money. Don't forget your pollinator flowers such as marigolds, alyssum and if you haven't already done so, sow some sweet peas.

Seed Boxes



We are pleased to announce that we have added metal boxes to each of the two Lyminge Library phone boxes, to enable people to share and swap seeds. Do have a look next time you're passing and add any excess seeds that you have, which could help a newbie to get started or a seasoned gardener to branch out.

Please note, the Seed Boxes are to act as a receptacle for packets/envelopes of spare seeds and should <u>not be removed.</u>



Allotment Mini-Plots

Thank you to everyone who has come forward to take on one of our allotment mini-plots. We have several new plot holders this year and wish them well with their growing journey. All the plots are now taken so we look forward to seeing them all producing great seasonal produce for their 'owners'.

Seasonal Produce: Cauliflower

This one is a bit of a cheat - cauliflowers are pretty much in season all year round, because helpfully they can be grown throughout the year. They also have extraordinary versatility in use too, so much so that it's tricky to decide what recipe to include for them. Can be a lovely raw snack, as well as delicious fried, roasted or steamed.

Growing depends a little on the time of year, but as with broccoli, they will need protection from hungry caterpillars and pigeons with netting. Usually planted out in late spring and early summer, the cauliflower can be sown repeatedly to provide an ongoing crop that will cover most of the year.

Cauliflower Polonaise (Riverford) www.riverford.co.uk/recipes/cauliflower-polonaise Ingredients

- Cauliflower or Romanesco florets
- 60g butter
- 2 hard boiled eggs, shelled
- 1 tbsp capers, chopped
- 2 tbsp fresh parsley, chopped
- 30g white breadcrumbs
- 120g butter

Method

Prep time: 10 min Cooking time: 15 min

Step 1 Cook the cauliflower lightly in boiling salted water for a few minutes. Make sure that there is still some bite in the cauliflower and it is well drained. Fry the florets in the 60g of butter until golden. Arrange in a warm serving dish.

Step 2 Grate the eggs and mix with parsley. Fry the crumbs in the butter until golden brown. Scatter the egg/parsley mix over the cauliflower with the capers. Pour the butter and crumb mix over the top.

Global Temperature Update: 2023 was hottest year on record

It has been widely reported that 2023 was the hottest year on record. For example, Carbon Brief (www.carbonbrief.org) explains that 2023 was the warmest year "by a large margin", at between 1.34 and 1.54°C above preindustrial levels across different datasets, and was the warmest year on record in 77 different countries. The year was also the warmest on record for ocean heat content, which increased notably between 2022 and 2023.

The Carbon Brief article also summarises additional consequences of our rising temperatures, including that cumulative ice loss from the world's glaciers and from the Greenland ice sheet reached a new record high in 2023, contributing to sea level rises which also reached record highs last year. They report that Arctic sea ice saw its sixth-lowest minimum extent on record, while Antarctic sea ice saw a new record low extent for almost the entire year, much of it by an exceptionally large margin.

Following our successful bee Walk & Talk last August (see July and September newsletters), the Bumblebee Conservation Trust team has kindly offered to run a beginners' bumblebee identification workshop for us this spring. It will take place on Wednesday 27th March from 9.30am to 3.30pm, based at the scout hut. They will bring a host of resources to teach participants how to identify our local bumblebees, and will have numerous resources available to purchase including identification books and leaflets. They will provide tea and biscuits but please bring your own lunch, and perhaps even your own comfy chair (most of the scout chairs are child-size...)





Can you tell an Asian Hornet from a Native Hornet? Please let us know if you see any

Kent saw a huge increase in the number of Asian hornet nests reported last year, we can all help keep an eye out for them this year, and report any sightings through official channels - there is an app available from the UK Centre for Ecology and Hydrology (CEH), links can be found on www.ahat.org.uk/ - but if you see one in the Parish please do let us know as well, to tony.king@lymingeparishcouncil.org.uk

Asian hornets are much darker than our native hornets, and a bit smaller. See www.ahat.org.uk/identification for tips on identification. Some people will try to trap Asian hornets, however it is important to make every effort to avoid killing other insects, for example by being very selective about the diameter of any entrance and escape holes, and by checking daily. An alternative way of monitoring for hornets is to set up a wick station. Basically a jar with a small hole in the lid you can tightly fit some wick material through. You use a sweet liquid lure (sugar water) or pheromone in the jar and you position it somewhere highly visible where you can regularly observe it for signs of visiting hornets. Photographing and reporting hornets will help us understand them better, and will facilitate control measures such as nest removal where appropriate.





LYMINGE THEN AND NOW

Our monthly look at how Lyminge has changed over the years, with thanks to Lyminge Historical Society.





The two views above show the inside of the parish church taken around 130 years apart. The view on the left dates probably to the 1890s when Canon Jenkins was still Rector. The small organ in the north aisle was replaced in 1896 by the current organ celebrating Canon Jenkins' 40 years of service in Lyminge, so the photo must have been taken before then. The visible architecture has not changed between the two photographs, but almost everything else we can see has.

A major refurbishment in 1898-1900, replaced the floor, repaired and replaced many roof timbers, and took out the old pews. The pews we see today, made by local men reputedly out of oak from Broome Park, were installed over a period of years early in the 20th Century. Heating in the 1890s was provided by small stoves; one with its long flue can be seen in the nave and there was another in the chancel. Today there is gas-fired central heating. There was no artificial light in the 1890s; oil lamps were only installed around 1900 and electric light did not arrive until 1932. The large open space around the font visible at the rear of the nave in the 1890s looks very different from today. This area is now filled with pews, and the font is in the north aisle, where it was moved in the 1930s. But a plan to reorder the back of the church has recently been approved so the open space will soon be restored. The font will be relocated once again so that it will be close to its former position. The parish church is almost 1,000 years old, but it remains a living building and it has been subject to constant change over the centuries to meet the needs of the community it serves.
