# **Margaret Saunders' Meanderings**

A few days ago the forecast for today had been for wet and somewhat windy weather, so when I saw the dawn beginning to fill the clear eastern sky, deep yellow and gold gradually fading and fusing with royal blue and turquoise, I was grateful, as I was meeting a friend for a walk through Folkestone and down to the harbour. And how apt it was that amongst the twenty-four vivid vapour trails I counted, two had crossed diagonally in the deeper blue sky, making a Saltire – the friend I was meeting was Scottish!

We alight from the bus in Sandgate Road and walk down through the pedestrianised precinct, which has a sad and melancholy air now that Debenhams and other shops are closed and empty. Bearing right at the bottom where the old Guildhall stands, we take the Old High Street, steep, shaded, narrow and cobbled – a reminder of Folkestone's medieval past. The shops here are very different from those we passed a few minutes earlier as this is the Creative Quarter. Paintings, pottery, jewellery, craft works all fill the shop front windows, waiting for the weather to warm up and tourists to arrive, with money to spend and time to fill. Steep Street Coffee House is a book café and bakery, its walls lined with books for browsing and for sale.



Out into the sunshine and back into the present, we approach the harbour area with its winter wind-battered palm trees and low eruptions of water from the pavement fountain, the sun saving the scene from its out-of-season drabness. We cross Beach Street, where in November 1940, two parachute mines exploded, killing 14, injuring 60 with 50 shops and houses partly or wholly demolished, thus re-shaping the area entirely.



Moving on, we stroll along the harbour arm, which has been re-imagined and re-purposed in a successful attempt to attract visitors. It was originally built by Thomas Telford and opened in 1807. Today we can enjoy the views and the bare bones of the arm, as it is devoid of tourists. The water within the harbour is deep blue and calm, a boat moored here and there and a small painted wooden house in the middle. A fishing boat is attracting a host of seagulls, flying and floating all around, beneath a backdrop of the cliffs, a Martello Tower, the arches at the back of Sunny Sands, and the famous Warren just around the headland.

Descending the damp dark steps we are now almost at sea level with Sir Antony Gormley's Another Time sculpture standing in the disused loading bay in front of us, silhouetted against the bright blue of the sea. A variety of eateries run along one side of the arm, waiting for warmer days to bring them back to life. The elegant pale granite pier head lighthouse, a Grade II listed building and now a champagne bar, stands at the end of the harbour arm, its revolving light continuing to alert ships to the presence of the outer pier.

Returning on the western side we walk along the restored station platform, with flower beds laid out along the track. Folkestone Harbour Branch Station

was once part of the world's first international rail-sea-rail link and was opened in 1850.





During WWI over eight million troops passed through this station and in 1940 every boat in Folkestone took part in the Dunkirk evacuation, bringing troops back to board trains here. A sculpture by Paloma Varga Weisz entitled Rug People sits in the middle of the 'track' depicting five intertwining heads and representing, amongst others, the 120,000 refugees who arrived here from Europe in WWI and the soldiers who travelled through here, on their way to Europe to fight, and the wounded on their way back.

We continue past fishermen casting lines over the wall and past the Signal Box café where we take the Board Walk formed of sleepers set into the shingle and make our way towards the Loss Cliff

shingle and make our way towards the Leas Cliff Lift Café for a late lunch. The walk takes us in front

of the new luxury flats, built on the beach and almost completed, with the Pent House apartments for sale at over one million pounds. These might be the safest to buy with sea levels predicted to steadily rise over the coming decades. We sit and relax in the bay window of the quaint café, basking in the warmth of the afternoon sun, watching ships pass, ranging from huge rectangular container ships, to small local fishing boats.

Time to make our way back to catch the bus in Sandgate, so we stroll through the Coastal Park, up and down on undulating paths with glimpses of the quiet sea through the gaps between the salt-toughened trees, leaning landwards from the constant westerly winds. White foaming wavefalls mark the division between land and sea. We have walked, strolled, and walked again on this peaceful day, amongst places spanning the centuries. I wonder what Folkestone will look like in another hundred years?

## District Councillors' Update - April 2024

**Otterpool Park** – There is a lot of work being undertaken on this project but there is no confirmation yet of a strategic partner. The inevitable delay in delivery of the project means that the District Council will find it difficult to meet its housing target.

**My Community Voice – Home Page - My Community Voice Kent** - is a messaging service that helps Kent and Medway residents, businesses, and community groups to keep in touch with their local policing teams. The service sends updates about your local



area directly from the police officers themselves. It is more than just a messaging service; it allows you to reply to the alerts the Police send you, share information and tell them about the issues affecting you. It also keeps you informed of current scams.

Folkestone – what an accolade for our town to be crowned the best place to live in the south east of England by the Sunday Times. The judges talk about our "eye-catching culture-led regeneration". They praised our "artists' studios, the cool shops on the Old High Street and the Harbour Arm". The judges also noted the town's "impressive schools, state-of-the-art sports facilities and high-speed trains to London".

Levelling-up Fund – In January 2023, under the previous administration, the Department of Levelling Up, Housing and Communities announced the Council's funding bid was successful and £19.8m was awarded. Our plan - A Brighter Future - will breathe new life into Folkestone and radically improve the complicated road network, making it much easier for residents and visitors to access the town centre: preliminary grounds investigations are due to begin later this month and all work completed by March 2025. **Finances** - At the meeting of the Full Council on 28th February, a fully costed and balanced budget for 2024/25 was approved. As expected, the Council Tax will increase, the F&HDC proportion of it is increasing by 2.99%. Other precepts will be determined by KCC, Kent Police and Crime Commissioner, Kent Fire and Rescue Service and Town/Parish Councils. The budget includes £18 million to be spent on front line services such as waste collection, quality social housing and other community based services. The Housing Revenue Account budget was also approved and unfortunately rents will be increasing by 7.7%. This is in line with the Government's recommendations. The extra money will enable the council to continue with the maintenance of its properties and allow us to build more social housing in the District. I know that these increases come at a very bad time with the ongoing cost of living crisis. Please check the Council's website for details of help and support that can be provided if you are affected by this.

**Consultation on The Folkestone** – A Brighter Future Phase 3 project is open until 2nd April. Details of this phase can be found at <u>www.folkestone-hythe.gov.uk/luf-public-engagement-Mar24</u>. Your views are important to the development. The scheme is being updated after each of the previous consultations based on feedback from the public.

**Boundaries** - As I have reported previously, the constituency boundaries for the next General Election have changed. North Downs West will now come under the Ashford constituency for General Elections only. For all other elections and administration, you will still be in Folkestone and Hythe District Council and Kent County Council.

Landslides - There have been several landslides along the Folkestone part of the coast and the Road of Remembrance remains shut. F&HDC have completed the works they are responsible for: all shrubs and sycamore trees were removed, and 12 evergreen oak trees were coppiced to form a low hedge. We are now awaiting a drone survey to be carried out along the escarpment and an assessment will be made to see if any other works need to be carried out. The road remains closed whilst KCC arranges clearance of the fallen trees. KCC is unable to commence work until they know that it is safe for their operatives to access the road.

A most exciting discovery has emerged from the specialist conservation work that is underway at **Spicer's Farm**. The Parish Council looked in detail at planning applications ref 23/2062/FH and 23/2070/FH, learning that part of the farmhouse could be the remnants of the oldest inhabited building in the parish. LPC are keen to engage with the Lyminge Historical Society and the owners of Spicer's Farm to find out more about the history of the site. LPC submitted supporting comments in respect of the applications, which seek to replace modern buildings on the footprint of the original farmstead.

The parish council recently took on **Meriden Park** from FHDC and upon inspection it was closed, for safety reasons. LPC are working alongside parishioners to design the replacement park and this presents an exciting opportunity. We have spoken to several residents who have amazing ideas and as such, a working group was formed, further ideas were submitted and now it is time to have another meeting where we can start to really map out our initial ideas. If you would like to be involved in the process please get in touch! Our next working group get together is on Tuesday 9th April, from 6pm at the Coach and Horses in Lyminge. 

Hopefully the weather has improved and you are all itching to get in the garden. Below are jobs that should keep you busy.

**Sow Undercover** - as for March (except it's getting late for celeriac, sow asap not covering because it needs light to germinate), leeks, leaf beet, beetroot (all varieties), chard at month's end, tomatoes for outdoor growing.

With warmth and around mid-month, cucumber, courgette, squash inc. pumpkin, sweetcorn

**Sow Outside** - all potatoes, broad beans, lettuce, spinach, peas, salad onion, early and autumn brassicas, parsley, leeks, leaf beet, carrots

## **Companions and Partners**

- Instead of doing block planting of your vegetables, try interspersing them with herbs and flowers that will help deter pests and encourage pollinators.
- Let's return to the mixed planting and sowing of the medieval monastic gardens and the cottage gardens which were so present pre-World War 2 and the onslaught of intensive farming and use of insecticides.
- Some flower examples: French marigolds, calendula, sweet peas, sunflowers, nasturtiums, nicotiana, alliums, asters, buddleja, cosmos.
- Flowers for early pollinators: snowdrops, aconites, hellebores, crocus, cer-nthe, dandelions (1).
- Herbs for helping: (The list is long! Refer to Jekka McVicars books on herbs). In the meantime caraway, lavender, rosemary, basil; hyssop, thyme, oregano, all the sage family.
- Some vegetables are good or bad partners! For example don't grow your beans next to the onions and garlic but do grow your tomatoes with French marigolds and basil!

## It's Wild Garlic Time Again



#### Potato and wild garlic soup:

Cook the potatoes in water with a bit of salt until potatoes are tender, then stir in a couple of handfuls of chopped wild garlic. Blend the soup until smooth and serve hot. Very easy and delicious!



#### Wild garlic pesto:

Another really good way of taking advantage of the wild garlic crop is to make wild garlic pesto.

Simply put a couple of handfuls of washed wild garlic leaves into a blender or use a wand blender. The ratios of these ingredients are entirely down to you. Add some nuts, you could use, pine nuts, hazel nuts, walnuts. Some garlic. A glug of oil. Salt and pepper. Cut some Parmesan into reasonable chunks. Blend together and use where you would use basil pesto, stirred into pasta, as a sauce for pizza. You could also use it with fish, chicken and it goes well with lots of vegetables. Try stirring it into boiled potatoes. If you make a few batches for freezing, you will have a supply to add where and when.

# Our Wild Acre - Returning For A Fourth Year!

In 2021 we launched the Our Wild Acre project, which was a challenge aiming to create a new acre of wildlife-friendly habitat across the Parish. Over the past three years numerous households have signed up, committing over 500 m<sup>2</sup> of gardens and other private lands to be left untouched and therefore gently rewilded for the duration of the growing season, as a

refuge for wildlife and for us all to enjoy. The project is returning by popular demand for a fourth year. If you can commit a patch of your garden or land, or a window

# Chalk Stream Monitoring And Awareness Afternoon: Saturday 11th May

Come and join local experts and volunteers for an afternoon of stream-dipping and monitoring of the Nailbourne on Tayne Field, on Saturday 11th May from 2pm, until about 3 or 3.30pm. Bring your wellies and help us evaluate the health of the stream by identifying the wildlife living amongst the stones, watercress and other micro-habitats of the stream. We will also have experts on chalk stream management who can try to answer any questions you have about chalk streams in general and point you in the direction of available resources if you are responsible for managing chalk streams anywhere along the Elham Valley.

Chalk streams are one of the rarest habitats in the world, with only 260 true chalk streams known globally, most of which (85%) are in England. They are so special that some people refer to them as "England's rainforests" or "England's Great Barrier Reef". We are so lucky to have the Nailbourne running through our parish, and we have a great responsibility to conserve and manage our chalk streams in a sensitive, informed and appropriate manner.

In October 2021 a new "chalk streams strategy" was published by the UK government with various partners, which can be easily found online. Recognising that chalk streams and their associated underground aquifers are important for people and biodiversity, the strategy is for everyone who has responsibility for, or uses, chalk streams. In June 2023 the first "Implementation Plan" related to the strategy was published, again easily available online. When the strategy was launched, the Chair of Natural England, Tony Juniper, explained "These habitats are subject to a complex range of pressures, from pollution arising from road runoff, agriculture and sewage, to low flow resulting from abstraction for public water supply and physical damage to the water courses", and expected the strategy to result in the "joined-up partnership action needed to address these pressures, protecting and restoring chalk streams for future generations to enjoy".



#### LYMINGE THEN AND NOW

Our monthly look at how Lyminge has changed over the years, with thanks to Lyminge Historical Society.





The view on the left is easily recognisable as Canterbury Road extending from the Coffee Cabin to Berkeley Villas. It probably dates to around 1920. At that time, the large building in the middle of the picture was owned by the well-known local builder John James Clayson, who lived with his family above a hardware shop and builders merchant that provided a retail outlet for the business. In the 1960s, this shop was occupied by the Midland Bank, the name by which HSBC was then known in the UK. The shed visible to the right was part of an extensive yard for Clayson's building business with multiple storage sheds that extended back from the street frontage with further access off North Lyminge Lane.

To the right of the picture the distinctive gable of the Coffee Cabin with its wavy edge decoration is just visible in both pictures. Ex-Royal Marine and sometime butler Alfred Matthews ran a business from these premises with his wife Florence, and lived behind the shop at Sunny Cottage. Alfred was recorded as a greengrocer in 1918, but by 1921 the shop was operating as a newsagent and tobacconist, as it continued to do into the 1990s. For a period before the Second World War, Alfred also traded as a motor mechanic, and there were petrol pumps on the pavement outside the shop.
