

Margaret Saunders' Meanderings


Scarecrows enticed me to Elham for my walk this month. As we enter the village, the banks of houses along the road are brimming with grasses amongst which are oxeye daisies and poppies, making for a colourful wildflower border to the road. A scarecrow on the right welcomes us to the village and its collection of weather-themed scarecrows. Collecting a map from the Village Stores, I and my two young companions follow the route, visiting as many of these humanoid figures as possible. As we start our perambulation, a blackbird is singing loud and clear, undeterred by the rural effigies displayed in and around the village.

Starting along Park Lane, we encounter our first scarecrows - a Mum and baby sitting beside a paddling pool with a straw dog about to enter the pool. Cleverly put together, the scene is very realistic but more likely to encourage the birds than scare them away! A little further along is a wind-blown lady leading a dog, both of them lifted off their feet by the pull of her umbrella appropriately patterned with cats and dogs, blown inside out by an invisible gale. Cunningly mounted on poles, it makes for an impressive display. Backtracking we amble along The Row which runs at the back of Elham, parallel to and west of the main road. Here cottage gardens are teeming with colourful flowers, mainly in hues of pink, purple and mauve. Deep blue alkanet sprouts from the base of flint walls, which, themselves are covered with purple campanula. Fragrant shrubs spill over an old brick wall, the lines of bricks slightly uneven and bowing out in places, which only adds to its charm. Flint abounds in the construction of both walls and buildings, evidence of the predominance of chalk in the landscape. Glimpses of the tree clad western facing valley slopes appear between houses, the fields verdant after so much rain.

Ann's Cottage bears the date of 1744. On its door hangs a striking door knocker – the head of a man with chin-length hair, the red of the door making a beautiful background to this interesting piece of metalwork. Alongside this cottage, between it and Updown Cottage, a footpath sign drew us up the hill along a narrow recently strimmed path and out into a meadow at the top – somewhere to explore another time. Walking back down to The Row, we noticed a flint wall bordering Updown Cottage. In between the flints and along



the top of the wall have been cemented fragments of china and pottery sherds, making an attractive and interesting display. Included in these is the base of a green glass bottle, a brown teapot spout, patterned china, a ceramic head, pottery pot rims and a ceramic jar base. Puzzling on the provenance of these items I wonder if they were found in a nearby garden over the years. Further on, Well Cottage and Mill House give an indication of their history and former purpose. Red diamond plaques on the walls of houses state that they are Historic Buildings of Kent and of these there are many in Elham.





down Cullings Lane we pass Monk's Cottage and the back of the Abbot's Fireside, both indicating an ecclesiastical history. Four seated lions sit atop a wall and gate posts, standing sentinel over the back yard of the Abbot's Fireside. Three types of purple flowers have found footholds in the brick and flint walls, softening their look. Various roses have muddled themselves amongst these walls and borders, one with crumpled and crimped pale pink petals which exudes a heavenly perfume.

Three more scarecrows greet us at the bottom of the hill: one dressed in black with red boots, straw spilling from his arms and pocket and sporting an umbrella; one with a beautiful painted face and Autumn themed hair, equally spilling straw and the last, with a fox's face, sitting crossed legged on top of the portico of the Rose and Crown pub. This must be portraying a sunny Summer's day as he is wearing sunglasses and has flowers on his hat and chest. Walking back to the car we see a well-dressed lady

scarecrow lounging on a chair in the sunshine with a chocolate in her hand. On the table stands a gin bottle and a glass ready for its next refill. She is suffering from an injured foot which is propped up on a footstool. Maybe not enough water with her gin!

The imagination and skill of the scarecrow creators was a delight to behold, and I take my hat off to them all. It made for a most enjoyable stroll around the village.

District Councillors' Update - July 2024

General Election 4 July 2024 - A final reminder that The North Downs East and North Downs West wards now form part of the Ashford parliamentary constituency. This means that Kent will get an additional MP. The Ashford constituency comprises 26 Wards and has an electorate of 73,546. FHDC will administer the election for the North Downs. You must take photo ID if voting at a polling station – otherwise you will be unable to vote. Polling stations are open between 7am and 10pm on Thursday 4 July 2024. hythe.gov.uk/elections Results will be declared in the early hours of Friday 5 July and results will be published on the website.

Elham Valley Group of Churches – What a splendid service it was to welcome the new rector, the Rev Carol Bates on 10 June in the church of St Mary the Virgin in Elham. The church was packed, the singing spirited the organ playing excellent. The Elham Valley Group benefice includes Lyminge, Postling and Stanford Churches in our North Downs West Ward, and I look forward to working with our new rector in our community.

Stelling Minnis Salvage Yard - An unearthed piece of Folkestone's Victorian past has been returned to a sea view spot almost 137 years to the day since it was first laid. The 'Victoria Pleasure Pier Foundation Stone' is back in position at the end of the Lower Leas Coastal Park after it was spotted at a salvage yard in Stelling Minnis. Residents and visitors can now view this fascinating part of Folkestone's history on the green space close to where the original pier once stood at the end of the Lower Leas Coastal Park.

Planning – At a recent Planning Briefing for Members, we were advised that the Planning Department are dealing with over 80% of current planning applications within the eight week period, unless an extension has been agreed or it is a complex application. However, this does mean that applications must be submitted with all necessary information upon which the decision can be made. There are still some older applications that have yet to be assessed and Officers are working through these. I will update on this issue as it progresses.

There was a lively discussion at the recent **North Downs Forum** which was held in Elham Village Hall. Biodiversity, sustainability, the health and management of the Nailborne stream and land management were all discussed. The next North Downs Forum will be held in Stelling Minnis, date to be confirmed.

The new **Corporate Plan** working group has been convened. The Corporate Plan is the principal document that sets out the Council's strategic direction for the next five years. A draft document will be sent out for consultation at the end of the summer.

Interviews for the Independent Chair of the Otterpool Park LLP Board have been held and the post will shortly be filled.

Folke About Town, as part of the Folkestone – A Brighter Future project, will be happening through the summer months between June and September. There will be various street activities, a food festival, arts and crafts market, a sports day and a teenage market. The team are really keen to hear thoughts, ideas and suggestions on what other activities can be staged.

I am pleased to tell you that your District Council has recently announced their **Community projects grant funding** of £90,000. Each ward member has a budget of up to £3,000 to award to initiatives in their ward. Applications for 2024/25 are now being accepted. These grants can be vital to smaller, local organisations that have fewer opportunities to access grant funding from other sources so I would encourage eligible groups to contact me, and I can give you details of how to apply.



THE ORCHARD, SPICER'S LAND, CANTERBURY ROAD - After the recent closure for roadworks, to help prevent flooding on Canterbury Road by the golf course in Etchinghill, and following advice from Kent Highways, Bob Laslett the owner of the orchard, is creating a couple of small ponds at the bottom of his orchard on either side of the public footpath leading from the village. This is a measure to help stop or reduce the flooding to his barn and neighbour's garden. The creation of these ponds will not disturb any protected species or nesting birds. During construction there will be some minor disruption to a small part of the footpath which will be kept to a minimum. The benefit is that the ponds will be planted with aquatic plants making them an interesting feature for walkers passing through the orchards.



Letters To The Editor

Dear All.

We recently replied to the request for our cherished views of Lyminge. This was the view up the valley from various view points such as Silverlands, our house, Old Robus etc. The view is bordered by ancient buildings , Lyndon Hall , Old Robus and North and South Cottages (1870). We think it puts these buildings in context and is a view that has not changed much over hundreds of years, looking at a variety of mature trees with a backdrop of agriculture and in the distance the hills dotted with sheep and cows.

We noticed that the 5 acre field has been cut and a firm spent 2 days surveying the field. In 2015 a plan was put forward as part of the council's 5 year plan for 30 plus houses to be built on this field but was turned down. At the same time the golf club application for 36 houses (now to be 56) was passed along with the 30 plus on the nursery site in Etchinghill.

Apart from the need to keep the village as a village from an aesthetic and historical aspect, there remains the practical issues such as a single sewer pipe which is already overloaded!, an influx of people requiring health care, increased traffic, etc. The on-road parking is already limited and as we know from the golf club estate plans very little parking is provide on these new estates. I don't know if a new application is being made to build on the 5 acre field yet but I can see no advantage for Lyminge for any further development at this time.

Climate Action and the Neighbourhood Plan

Hedgehogs in the Parish

We have received several recent records from Lyminge which are all centred around High Street, Woodland Road, and James Close, suggesting a thriving population in this area. Bee Walks ready...

Following the discovery of rare Ruderal Bumblebees in the Parish from last year and again this year, as advertised in previous newsletters, we have now set up two local "bee walks" to regularly monitor our local bumblebee populations and consequently help inform local land management for pollinators. To participate you will need to sign up to https://beewalk.org.uk/ which is a national bee monitoring programme set up by the Bumblebee Conservation Trust. Once you are registered you can set up your own regular "bee walk", which needs to be approximately 1 to 2km long, or you can contact the Bee Walk team and ask them to add you to the team for monitoring the two walks we have set up in Lyminge. One is called "Lyminge Court Lodge"



Green and adjacent fields" and the other is "Lyminge Tayne Field and churchyard". Feel free to contact tony. king@lymingeparishcouncil.org.uk for further guidance or support.

To be able to monitor bumblebees effectively we need volunteers with a reasonable level of bumblebee identification knowledge - the Bumblebee Conservation Trust recently ran a Bumblebee Identification Workshop in Lyminge, so everyone who attended should now be able to identify the bumblebees most likely to occur in the



-Parish. The Bee Walk website also provides plenty of online resources for bee identification training. The 12 different bumblebee species currently known from Lyminge Parish are:

Frequently seen "big 8" species: Buff-tailed Bumblebee, White-tailed Bumblebee, Red-tailed Bumblebee, Small Garden Bumblebee, Early Bumblebee, Common Carder Bee, Tree Bumblebee, and Vestal Cuckoo Bee. Rather rarely seen species: Ruderal Bumblebee, Red-tailed Cuckoo Bee, Forest Cuckoo Bee, and Field Cuckoo Bee.

Contaminated Manure

If you have had distorted (the leaves all curl up) growth on your tomatoes or beans this might be an answer. Herbicide contaminated manure. You can check if the manure you have obtained free from a friendly horse owner or dairy farmer is free from 'nasties' by doing the following things:

- 1. Let it rot down for at least 6 months then..
- 2. Plant a broad bean seed in to a pot of the manure and let it grow. If it is distorted and all curly then the likelihood is that there is herbicide in the manure and it will cause your plants to be deformed and stunted. Bag it up and take to the tip! Their high heating process will solve the problem!




Caring For Your Tomatoes!



There are two types – cordon and bush varieties. Bush varieties are such as Tumbling Tom – used in baskets and pots. They produce one flush of fruit and don't need any attention – maybe except feeding occasionally. Cordon / standard types need staking and training, either up a string by just twisting the growing plant around the string or tied gently to a cane.

The main thing I get asked about tomato care is how to care for the cordon plant as it grows to prevent it becoming out of control with green growth and how to make the plant concentrate on forming good fruit on one main stem?

- 1. Remove all suckers and their leaves below the first flower cluster. Do this no matter what kind of tomato plant.
- 2. Pinch out extra growth on the LEAF joins. See picture. DO NOT PINCH OUT FLOWERING TRUSSES those will bear the tomatoes.
- 3. Remove yellow leaves. Yellow leaves are leaves that use up more sugar than they produce.
- 4. Top the plant. To get the best out of the last growth of the season, it is necessary to "top" the plant. Take out the top growing point once the plant has produced 5 fruit trusses or reached the top of the greenhouse!





Ultra-processed Food

Thoughtful Food would like to support you all, not only with growing tips but also in the mission to steer people away from using too much ultra-processed food. Over the next few months we will be giving you tried and tested hacks in how to plan and cook from scratch as pain free as possible. But first, what is ultra-processed food?

Ultra-processed food is constructed by industrial processes from ingredients that would not usually be found in a regular family kitchen. Packaged food with an extensive ingredient list that includes contents such as: Emulsifiers, humectants, stabilizers, xanthan gum, guar gum, lucus gum, flavouring, colourings (natural or not) and sweeteners (from corn syrup to aspartame plus many others). Ultra processed foods start with a staple crop like corn or soya, essentially these are disassembled into products such as starch, flours, protein isolates, fats and oils. These commodities can then be reassembled into structured food like products that can have specific textures and tastes manufactured into them in order to be packaged for taste, shelf life and profit. Chris van Tulleken is a well respected infectious diseases doctor an associate professor at UCL and works with the World Health Organization. His book 'Ultra Processed People' is a great book but he says, it is best read while munching on Pringles. At some point you may decide to discard the Pringles and substitute real food. Where to start though? How about breakfast.

PARISH COUNCIL QUESTIONS & ANSWERS REGARDING THE 24/25 BUDGET & PRECEPT

Q: In response to Letters to the Editor in last month's Lyminge Newsletter, I would like to raise the following questions in relation to the substantial local parish council tax increase of 48%. This increase is substantial. I have been unable to find anywhere the reasons behind this increase or what this increase in tax is going towards. Please can this clearly be set out in an open and transparent budget for the year.

A: The precept increase is 41.7% and while this does seem substantial, it is to be put to use for the good of the parish. The full budget for the 24-25 period is set out on the website, however there is an open ended 'future projects' listed with £45,000 set against it. Upon reflection, the Parish Council appreciates that this isn't transparent. The 'future projects' have not yet been finalised nd therefore we cannot name specific projects. The aim of this budget item was to set aside funds for acting on aspirations identified as part of the emerging Neighbourhood Plan. The Parish Council held a community event at Lyminge Village Hall on 22nd February with the intention of gathering information on what parishioners would like to see implemented in the parish. The full results of the event can be found on our website. Some of those ideas have included better signage highlighting our many local walks, a bandstand, increasing accessibility and footpaths in general, safeguarding local facilities, adaptable housing and much more. The £45,000 is intended to be used to get the ball rolling on projects while we wait for the Community Infrastructure Levy monies to become available to us.

Q: I understand some of this increase is to pay the wage of the 'village handyman'. I would like to know what work is being carried out by the handyman in the village, how this is requested and logged as I understand some works on the village is contracted out. It also includes provision of overtime. What hours is the handyman doing and is there sufficient work in the village to warrant over time?

A: The work that is contracted out as part of our grounds maintenance contract tends to be larger jobs, for example mowing Tayne Field. The handyman, who works 16 hours per week, does the smaller, more regular jobs. Part of the handyman's role is also to report issues within the parish. During the work day if he sees potholes etc he will report them to the relevant authority. Another aspect of the role is to keep the parish looking tidy by strimming/mowing and generally maintaining areas of the parish. Some recent works include a complete tidy up of the Lyminge Village Hall grounds and the removal of dangerous rusted gates at the top and bottom of Court Lodge Green. The Parish Council also donates some of the handyman's time to the parish, for example Lyminge Library needs some wood furniture sanded and varnished and the handyman is completing the task as a donation from the Parish Council. The handyman is also due to complete a complete refurbishment of the allotments over the summer months. The overtime provision relates to the Clerk, RFO and handyman. As larger projects emerge, it is likely that the Clerk and RFO will need to take on additional hours due to the increased workload. If this appears to be a regular occurrence, their contracted hours may be revisited however for now the intention is that the requirement for overtime is only temporary.

Q: As a Lyminge resident and having become aware of the huge rise in the Lyminge Parish Council part of the Council Tax bill (close to 50% for this year alone) and looked back on the last few years, the increase since 2018 is over 200%.

A: Below is the data from the Parish Council's precept requirements over the last few years.

As you can see, the increase in precept requirement is closer to 40% than 50%, though the % figure will vary on the individual council tax statements as different bands pay different amounts. That said, we can understand that the figure appears to be an incredibly high amount. To put it into perspective, for a band D property, this figure would result in an increase of around £130 per year or £2.50 per week. This will allow the Parish Council to bring to life many of the aspirational projects set out by residents via the

Q: When you look at the other sections of our Council Tax, all have kept the increase to a minimum despite the financial times we currently live in. Lyminge Parish Council have definitely not followed this line. Why is the rise in the Lyminge Parish...

PARISH COUNCIL QUESTIONS & ANSWERS REGARDING THE 24/25 BUDGET & PRECEPT (contd)

...Council tax so large compared to the other components of the Tax. Not just this year but the past few years?

A: By law Local Authorities (FHDC/KCC) are only allowed to increase their precept by a certain amount. This doesn't apply to Parish Councils. Of course, this doesn't mean that Parish Councils should be aiming to increase their precept requirements by continuously large amounts.

Q: Why has the Parish Council approved such huge increases particularly in view of the financial problems people have faced in the past few years bearing in mind we have had the Pandemic and an economic collapse?

A: The Parish Council wants to improve the parish and this comes with additional costs. As shown above, the figure of £130 per band D property (around £88 for band A) will give us an additional £50,000ish to make improvements. LPC understands that the increase on the council tax statement can feel jarring, however the improvements that it will facilitate will be a great benefit to the community, many of which are accessed free of charge. One of the recent additions to the parish was Tayne Field play park which has been thoroughly enjoyed so far. The play park cost around £150,000 which would have used precept funds. The park is free to use and will last years into the future to be enjoyed by many.

Q: I see that £40k is being budgeted for the salary of the clerk, RFO and handyman and I wouldlike a breakdown of this. Please state the annual salaries of each Clerk, RFO and Handyman together with the overtime provision included.

A: The salary guidelines for the Clerk and RFO are set out in the Local Government Services Pay Agreement issued by the National Association of Local Councils each year. Lyminge Parish Council is an LC2 council with the pay scale points being set between 18 and 32 which equates to £15.21 - £20.90 per hour. When advertising for the handyman position a salary range of £26,000 - £34,000 (pro-rated for 16 hours per week) was given based on qualifications and experience.

Q: Why is there an increase of 148% against the expenditure for 2023/24 Clerk, RFO and Handyman salaries from £16,534 to £40,000? A: The 23/24 budget for salaries was £23,130. This budget line has been increased by just under 73% to allow for additional hours for the clerk (from 20 hours to 25 hours per week), the salary for the handyman (who works 16 hours per week) and for the potential for overtime.

Q: £2k has been budgeted for training. Who is being trained and what training is taking place?

A: £2,000 is a very small budget for training and training is incredibly important. Training is offered to all councillors and employees of the council. We are at the start of the financial year so none of this £2,000 has currently been spent, however I have included some examples of training that has been completed in the last year below:

- Planning (reforms to planning system, neighbourhood planning policies, renewable energy, legislation etc)
- Finance (community banks, VAT liability, councils as landlords, medium term financial planning etc)
- Community Engagement (engaging audiences with social media, managing risks, embracing tourism etc)
- Allotment management (legislation, contracts, water etc)
- Public Play spaces (inclusivity and accessibility, health and safety, aesthetics etc)
- Quotes, tenders and contract management

We are currently planning a dynamic councillor training for all councillors and this training will help them understand their role and how to best represent the parish.

Q: Repairs & replacements, what is the reason for this 433% increase from last year? You state that the Council have spent between £8K and £13K in previous years but this is not true as the average over the last 5 years has been £7,500 with last year being £2,439. So why this increase?

A: This budget line has been consistently over budget as shown:

Given that this has been consistently over budget, it was reasonable for the Parish Council to increase the budgeted amount.

Q: Where are the accounts kept and where can they be viewed?

A: Anything related to finance can be obtained by contacting the Responsible Financial Officer (RFO). You can request information directly from the RFO by emailing rfo@lymingeparishcouncil.org.uk or by emailing the Clerk who can pass it on to the RFO.

Q: Who has oversight of these accounts?

A: The RFO oversees the accounts on a day to day basis. Each month at the Finance and Administration committee, the accounts are reconciled and approved by the committee. These meetings are public as is the information should you wish to attend.

Q: I want to know why the Council required a Handyman. The usual small tasks needed in the Parish can be carried out by employing local traders as before.

A: The hiring of a handyman has been discussed by the council for a number of years and the council did consider this as an option but decided that by employing a handyman we would have someone available who could prioritise the work needing completing in the parish. In addition, due to laws and feelings around 'gig economy' the council felt that it was more appropriate to offer employment.

Q: Why do you not have separate meetings? This is more efficient in terms of accomplishing all of the work involved. Looking at the meetings scheduled not enough time is allowed to do the work.

A: The council is currently made up of full council and six committees. There are currently more committees and meetings than ever before and this will allow adequate time and resources for the council to achieve their aims. Committees will change based on the requirements of the council.





LYMINGE THEN AND NOW

Our monthly look at how Lyminge has changed over the years, with thanks to Lyminge Historical Society.





It is hard to believe that these two photographs both show Yew Tree Cross, looking across what is now Canterbury Road to Brady Road which snakes off to the right. Although now greatly obscured by trees, the house's distinctive chimney stacks are still visible. The upper windows too have remained, but at ground level, two new bay windows and a much larger porch have radically changed the look of the front so it is barely recognisable. The photograph on the left is taken from a higher vantage point from the top of the bank, looking over the hedge that is still there and bordered what was then Mill Meadow but is now the gardens of The Old Mill and Four Wents.

The older photograph is undated but we can guess the photographer was standing above the ground on the windmill that once stood there. It is likely to have been taken in the second half of the 19th Century. The house is said to have once been a pub, but this did not deter the first Methodist congregation in Lyminge meeting here from 1820, initially outside and then from 1822 actually using the house. This remained the Methodist meeting house for six years, until a chapel was built in the High Street on the site now occupied by the post-war houses Lynton and Draris.

Yew Tree Cross was shown as Palm Tree Cross on a map of 1769, recalling how at that time yew boughs were used as a substitute for palm tree boughs on Palm Sunday, the Sunday before Easter. In 1840, this house was known as Mill Land Homestead and was occupied by Edward Hogben, although it belonged to Stephen Gibbs who owned and ran a farm in North Lyminge. Gibbs's farmhouse still survives and is the row of three dwellings now called Sparrow Tree Cottages.



Visually it was a great success with some very interesting stands. From the feedback on the day all those who came with their stand or display were very pleased to have a chance to meet and speak to people who were running other groups. It was a pity that not more than about 40 of the public from the village actually came. The challenge is how can we make contact with the younger generation in the village, the thirty year and forty year olds??
