The areas to which Christmas will be presents delivered include Lyminge, Etchinghill, Rhodes Minnis, and Postling but regretfully excludes the far end of Woodland Road and Elham.

Margaret Saunders' Meanderings

Winterton-on-Sea is just along the coast from Hemsby on the Norfolk East Coast. The sky is a uniform grey and looking along the beach to either end, a faint mistiness envelopes the coastline. Soft sand dunes form the frail barrier between land and sea, which is constantly being eroded when extra high tides reach further up the beach. Evidence for this is clear – double yellow lines on the tarmac road are suddenly cut off where the road has fallen into the sea!

Wind from the north-east is steadily blowing off the sea. It is low tide and a vast expanse of wet sand lays before me



as I slither down soft golden sand to get onto the beach. Spiky grass somehow grows out of these sand dunes but is helpless in holding them together when the sea claws at their base, dragging the sand back with it as the tide recedes, having eaten its way yet further into the land. Enormous concrete blocks have been placed along a short stretch of the beach below where the road once ran, in an effort to deflect the force of the sea. They seem insignificant compared to the strength of the North Sea. Each storm brings fear to the people who live along this coastline, wondering when the next landslide will take place and claim their properties. The Norfolk Coast Path runs along the top of these dunes, but for how much longer I wonder? On nearby Hemsby Beach, a Second World War concrete pillbox sits in the shallow waters of the bay and further south along the coast in Suffolk, Dunwich Village has been completely lost to the sea.

The salt-laden wind is brisk and tugs at my hair and jacket leaving the taste of salt on my lips. Crossing the high tide line I look for interesting finds, but nothing catches my interest – no little treasures, no interesting driftwood, no pretty shells. With the grey-green sea on my right, I walk northwards, firstly on the soft sand before moving nearer the sea, where the sand is wet and firm. Rivulets of water drain down from the upper beach. Dotted with pebbles and the odd patch of fine stones, the beach slopes very gently towards the sea. A large lagoon



of water is trapped in a hollow between myself and the sea, the wind rippling its surface. Once I have rounded the far end of this, I make my way to the water's edge where smallish waves lap in ever spiralling lines. This area is protected by a shallow offshore sandbank creating a calmer stretch of water on its landward side. However, agitated water boils over this sandbank, jumping and jostling, waves bumping into each other causing white foam to shoot up into the air. This collision of water creates a loud background roar. Compared with our local waters of the English Channel the sea here feels much more menacing and I view it with considerable respect. In the quieter but still choppy water this sandbank protects, I see a black blob, then another and another and realize that these are grey seals, their shiny heads raised, like periscopes, looking at me with their great big black eyes, but also scanning round in all directions before disappearing from view, only to bob up again a little distance away. One in particular raises its head

high and I can clearly see the mottled markings on its neck. I spend some time watching out for them and guess that I have probably seen at least six different seals.

Something catches my eye on a further sandbank and eventually when I am directly opposite I can see that it is a young golden coloured seal, stranded on the raised hump of the bank. Its head moves as gulls fly close by and I



wonder if it is distressed and will be able to survive once it can re-enter the water when the tide rises. Seaward of the seal on the same sandbank a group of large seabirds has gathered and a lone cormorant sits while gulls fly around. Further along the beach, some distance away, the sun has broken through, illuminating a small patch of breaking waves, making the foam an almost pure white. I hear the thrum of a boat's engine and looking out I see a boat taking people on a seal trip, one of many along the Norfolk coast. As the boat heaves up and down on the waves, I hope the passengers are able to enjoy their trip!

Struggling to climb back up the soft sand of the dunes to return to the Coastal Path I appreciate how fragile this coastline is. Every step I take, I slide back slightly as I can get no grip. Nature will win this battle ... and it is merely a matter of time.

PARISH CHURCH ALTERATIONS

The long-expected internal reordering of the western end of the parish Church will begin in January. This will involve the removal of the pews at the rear of the nave, replacing the flooring with slabs to match those existing, modifying the heating system, moving the font from its position in the north aisle to its original location close to the south door and installing chairs to replace the pews. To do this the western end of the church will be screened off and work will be underway for at least sixteen weeks. The car park will be in use by contractor's vehicles and possibly a skip; please keep normal vehicles clear.

The Church will therefore be closed for visiting during the period of work. Services will be possible on Sundays using the eastern end of the Church only, and heating, sound and music will be limited.

All this should result in a more comfortable, warmer and more user-friendly church by late spring/early summer next year.

The redundant pews are to be sold and are available for collection from December. Anyone who is interested in purchasing one or more pews should contact the Church Wardens. The guide price will be £70 as a minimum, depending on the size of the pew.

We want to inform you of some important changes regarding our Age UK Lyminge Centre. Due to rising operational costs that we can no longer sustain, we will be relocating key services to our Hythe hub, and the Lyminge Centre will close in March 2025. These changes will help ensure the long-term sustainability of our services while continuing to provide high-quality care and support to our community.

Dementia Day Break Service Relocation

Our Dementia Day Break Service will be moving to our Hythe hub by April 2025. This move is necessary to manage increasing costs, but rest assured, the same dedicated staff will continue to deliver care at Hythe, ensuring a smooth transition.

Closure of Laundry Service

After careful consideration, we will be closing our Laundry Service due to rising costs and decreasing demand. Final collections will occur during the week of 16th December, with last deliveries the following week. We appreciate your understanding.

Lyminge Charity Shop and Café

Our charity shop and café in Lyminge will remain open until Late March 2025, and we encourage you to visit. Afterward, our Hythe shop and café will continue to provide the same welcoming space.

Continued Support for Lyminge

We will be working closely with local parish councils to explore new opportunities for drop-in services and support groups, ensuring we remain connected with the Lyminge community.

District Councillors' Update - December 2024

Gift Card Scams - There has been a rise in scams involving people being requested by criminals to purchase gift cards from stores. Scammers will say anything to get you to purchase gift cards. If you believe you have been scammed phone your Bank immediately, by calling 159 and report it to www.actionfraud.police.uk or call 0300 123 2040. Sign up to Home Essential Fund - is a limited scheme to support low income households with energy efficient solutions to help reduce their costs and supply more efficient items to replace broken ones. This includes:



- Boiler servicing to ensure boilers are as efficient as possible.
- Boiler replacement for items that are no longer suitable for use.
- Oil heating servicing and support for residents that use oil for fuelling their home.
- White goods provision. To supply replacement or new energy efficient items to households including cookers, fridges/freezers, washing machines/dryers, microwaves and other items as appropriate.
- Beds and mattresses to homes that do not have suitable bed provision.

Otterpool Park – discussions are on-going with Homes England and the waste water treatment plant planning application is imminent. A public consultation has been announced for 3 December at Sellindge Village Hall from 3.30 – 8pm. 

Jobs in the garden for December

Most of us will be busy preparing for Christmas but if you do have time to get out in the garden your top job is mulching and spreading compost. Don't worry if your compost is not completely rotted it will continue to break down in situ especially with the coming frosts.

Or you could do something a bit more festive for the birds, such as the wreath alongside.




Who loves Boxing Day? Leftovers from Christmas Day and pickles.

Here's a recipe for Date Chutney that requires no cooking and minimal chopping, a winner. The ingredients are essentially all 1:1. This chutney goes so quickly in my house, I sometimes easily change the quantities to kilosl

- 1lb dried dates
- 1lb sultanas
- 1lb cooking apples
- 1lb brown onions
- 1lb light or dark brown sugar
- 1 clove garlic
- 1 teaspoon allspice

- 1 teaspoon ginger



Peel and core and roughly chop cooking apples. Roughly chop onion and garlic. Roughly chop dates.

Place all ingredients in a large bowl and leave to steep, covered with a cloth for 24hrs stirring occasionally.

Use a hand blender to mince together. Leave some bite though, you don't want a puree.

Pack into sterilized jars and leave for a couple of weeks for the flavours to develop.

This chutney makes very nice presents, especially in a nice jar with a pretty label and cover.

And for all those Christmas drink mixes

Fizzy drink replacement: Carbonated water makers can work really well to replace soda providing you don't bother with the syrups that come with some of them. Choose a herb tea with no flavourings, something like peppermint or chamomile. Pour on less than a ¼ cup of boiling water. Steep for a minute and leave to cool. Top up with carbonated tap water.

Pour slightly cooled boiled water over squeezed and cut lemon, lime or orange, store in the fridge and strain small quantities into a glass of carbonated tap water.

And for when you can't face another chocolate or glass of wine.......

Real Food as a 'New Year's Resolution'

Looking at problems with a more positive slant can make all the difference when seeking changes we need to make to our food lifestyle. What are the real foods you like the most, how can you eat more of them? What is 'out there' that you might try out? Would a spring clean of your food storage help to 'turn over a new leaf'? Would a New Year's Resolution work for you?



A Greener Christmas

There are many ways you can make this Christmas better for the environment from making your own decorations to planning what you eat, find out how you could make a real difference to the environment over the festive period with just a few simple changes.

1. Make your own decorations

Why not try decorating your home for Christmas without a trip to the shops? Try using what you already have or making your own paper chains with used wrapping paper. For a fragrant addition to your decorations, bake slices of

oranges studded with cloves and fasten to your tree with reusable ribbon.

2. Save paper and plastic

When it comes to wrapping paper, go for a recycled variety with no glitter or simply wrap your presents in brown paper or a scarf and a reusable ribbon. Your gifts will look festive and authentic, and you'll save money too.



3. Plan seasonal meals

Spark joy this Christmas with warming dishes packed full of goodness and seasonal local ingredients. Sprouts, cabbages, leeks, pears and cranberries are some of the tasty fruits and veg you can buy locally in December. Remember, buy only what you need and be creative with your leftovers.

4. Shop greener

Quality not quantity: Over half of UK adults say they have received gifts they don't want at Christmas. When buying gifts think less but better, putting the time into picking a quality item that will last a long time.

5. Keep the wildlife happy this winter

Lower temperatures and less daylight make a lot of wildlife less active, but many species are still easy to spot and will appreciate a helping hand in chilly conditions.

- Plant a hedge Winter is tree planting season and if you have the space, creating a mixed hedge of native species can make an enormous difference for wildlife as it provides shelter and food.
- Delay the garden tidy As plants die back, choose to leave some of the seed-heads standing. The seeds will provide food for birds and small mammals, and hollow stems and intricate seed-heads are valuable shelter for overwintering insects like ladybirds.
- Thaw icy waters When temperatures drop, sort out frozen bird baths whenever
 possible so wildlife can access drinking and bathing water. When surfaces freeze,
 defrost them by carefully pouring warm water over them but not boiling water
 as containers could crack.



6. Reduce our carbon footprint in 2025!

Thanks to the BBC for these tips for reducing our carbon footprint (full details on www.bbc.co.uk/news/science-environment-58171814):

- Changes to our homes. There are lots of changes we can make around the home that can help the planet, most of which will also save us money. See the past two month's newsletters for plenty of other ideas and opportunities.
- Cut out food waste and cut down on red meat. Apparently, 25-30% of the food produced around the world is lost or wasted, and global food loss and waste contributes around 8-10% of global greenhouse gas emissions.
- Drive less, fly less. Transport is responsible for roughly a quarter of all energy-related greenhouse gas emissions worldwide.
- Think before we buy. The carbon footprint of different types of clothing, household appliances, and other products, varies substantially from case to case so what, and how much, we buy can make a difference.

THE LYMINGE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

YOUR OPPORTUNITY TO SHAPE THE FUTURE OF OUR PARISH

Readers will recall that there have been numerous mentions of this Plan in the Lyminge Parish Council (LPC) pages of this Newsletter starting with the launch detailed in the February 2022 edition. Whilst progress has been slow, there is still a very firm commitment locally to continue the work and get the Neighbourhood Plan in place.

As a reminder, the Neighbourhood Plan is the community's opportunity to set out how land should be used locally and also other policies that would be used by anyone wishing to put forward a planning application in the Parish. The Neighbourhood Plan covers the whole of the Parish and will ultimately sit alongside the Folkestone and Hythe Local Plan, carrying legal weight in planning terms.

Briefly, the Lyminge Neighbourhood Plan will cover a series of issues including:

- · Setting out where any new housing should be located and the type of housing that is needed here
- Providing guidance on how any new development in the Parish should be designed so that it contributes positively to our local character and what makes our Parish special
- · Conserving our valued local heritage and providing opportunities to celebrate it.
- · Identifying areas of green space that we should protect from inappropriate development
- Encouraging biodiversity by safeguarding local habitats and linking these together as wildlife corridors
- · Promoting opportunities for walking, cycling and horse riding locally.
- · Protecting our dark skies
- · Setting out our infrastructure priorities in terms of community facilities and local amenities
- Supporting our village centre and local job opportunities.

With the urgent need to continue to progress the Plan, a notice of a meeting for villagers from all parts of the Parish was published in the November 2024 Lyminge Newsletter. Approximately 40 people attended, which was a fantastic endorsement as to the importance of this community project.

The outcome of that meeting, after a vote was taken, was to create a Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group (NPSG) and that a robust approach would then be made to the Full Parish Council Meeting on 11th November 2024.

The NPSG were to suggest that responsibility for developing the Plan should be handed to it. The request included that all files and correspondence that the LPC had accumulated would be handed over to the Steering Group together with access to the remaining balances of the Funding Grants already received and those which will come as the Plan is progressed.

In addition, the Parish Council would need to allow the Consultant employed by it until recently to be reemployed and work for the Steering Group. The LPC agreed. In addition the NPSG requested that two LPC members join the Group so that two-way contact and updates can be maintained.

At the time of writing the LPC meeting was only a few days ago but the NPSG is hopeful that it provides the files etc. in a timely manner. Once received, the NPSG will establish what work still needs to be done to produce a Draft Plan which is stage one of the application process.

The NPSG wishes to involve local residents in this process, particularly those who have knowledge, interest, skills and experience in the areas detailed above. In addition, the NPSG is anxious that the Plan covers all aspects of the needs of our residents and to achieve this welcomes information/participation from residents who have mobility difficulties or are in any way disadvantaged because of the facilities or lack of them within the Parish.

15th November - Distance Today 6.54km. Total Distance 84.41km

It was a cold yet bright morning as we set off in the south-westerly direction. The rolling nature of the countryside was accentuated by the low morning sun. Having reached the top of Brady Road, we joined a footpath that followed both the North Downs Way and Pilgrims Way in parts. Dad didn't seem to worry too much about which one as long as it was going downhill, bless him!! We are walking over the chalk bedrock that pops up as the White Cliffs in Dover.

The scene in front of us was very ethereal. You wouldn't have known that the major transport arteries, both road and rail, as well as communications and power flow through this area. It looks mystical other than the sound of traffic pounding along the hidden M20. As we enjoyed our sense of isolation we suddenly became aware of the obligatory cows and calves. Thankfully they had little interest in us as we passed by cautiously. We are fairly high up and in a prominent position. On reflection, it wasn't surprising that we stumbled across a beacon put in place for past national celebrations.

We were soon descending to the little hamlet of Postling and source of the East Stour river. Much of the area seems reflect its roots back in the Doomsday Book. The church is very quintessentially English with some parts of it dating back to 11th century as well as loads of bones!! Even the road sign seems to have a certain charm.

We leave Postling and wend our way back home via the bumpy field having had a great morning with lovely weather to match.

LYMINGE THEN AND NOW

Our monthly look at how Lyminge has changed over the years, with thanks to Lyminge Historical Society.





This month we look at the crossroads formed by the High Street, Church Road and Well Road. For centuries, this was the economic heart of Lyminge, and here was the pub, the Coach and Horses, known as such since at least 1769 when the landlord was John Hogben, and it may have had this name for much longer than this. The pub that stood then is seen in the picture on the left, which probably dates to the 1870s or early 1880s, judging by the dress of the woman standing at the door. The field that lies behind the pub is now thought of as Tayne Field, but earlier in the 19th Century this was Coach Meadow. Tayne Field was the field further south that is now largely occupied by the school, the boundary between the two still being visible as a raised bank near the footpath.

All that remains of the old pub is the coach house, not actually visible in either photo, but still standing to the south side of the pub itself and still with a small stable yard in front. The current pub building bears the date 1888, indicating that it was redeveloped in the wake of the opening on 4 July 1887 of the first section of the Elham Valley Railway that ran from Shorncliffe Camp (now Folkestone West) to Barham.

In the days before village halls, the Coach and Horses served as a meeting place for the village. The ratepayers of the parish would often hold their meetings there, and auctions are found listed in the local newspapers. Organisations would hold dinners at the pub, like the United Kentish Britons Friendly Society who met there in April 1862. Such events were so popular that around 1904, the facilities were expanded to include a free-standing dining hall that could house up to 150 people seated for dinner. This structure lasted into the 1960s, but although it was demolished, the space is still part of the beer garden and is often covered with a temporary awning. The Coach and Horses continues to serve the local community with food and drink, just as it has done on this same spot for at least two and a half centuries.
