Margaret Saunders' Meanderings

My starting point today is the Tadpole Tearooms in Bishopsbourne and the warm day, the last in April, has lured me out. This is a new walk for me and I decide to follow my nose, knowing that there are footpaths around as many walkers start or end up at the tearoom. Leaving the entrance I walk past a delightful cottage named Oswalds Cottage built in 1875 and once the home of Joseph Conrad, the Polish-British novelist writing in the years either side of the turn of the 20th century. Sweet scent fills the air from a lilac tree in full bloom in the cottage's garden. A footpath sign pointing to the right takes me through a kissing gate and ahead of me stretches a path bordered on either side by squared mesh fencing, which leads up a slight incline and through the land which belongs to Bourne Park House. Although only mid morning, the sun is strong and warm so I am grateful for the breeze. Either side are expanses of close cropped grass. Adjacent to a few of the fence posts, a variety of saplings have grown up, thanks to



birds dropping seeds as they perch on the posts. Reaching the brow of the rise, I wonder what will lie ahead. The pale chalk path continues for a while then enters a narrow wooded area with the old A2 on my right, which passes through Bridge, and I see a No 17 bus on its way to Canterbury. This patch of woodland has lost many mature trees, uprooted in past gales, including beeches with their shallow roots and a huge yew, the dusky-red bark peeling off in flakes. More light, created by these fallen trees, has enabled new seedlings to grow, together with wild flowers in a never ending cycle of

birth, growth and death.

Five trees in a group are providing deep shade for sheep and their lambs to graze or doze. Across the

pasture in a dip lies Bourne Park House, a Queen Anne style mansion, built in red brick and pleasing in its symmetry, surrounded by parkland filled with a variety of mature trees. Within this parkland, Cambridge University have found evidence of Roman occupation as well as artefacts dating from the iron and bronze ages. Once through another gate the footpath diverges and I have to decide which to take. I can see walkers in both directions and so I opt for the left hand pathway, which slopes downwards, hoping that maybe I can return on a different path. I stop frequently to admire the woodland,

the individual trees and the general vista. Ahead of me, a magnificent and mature copper beech stands alone,



only a very short length of trunk visible under the enormous crown of deep red foliage. Once up close, I see amongst the opening leaves, new beech mast, dangling and dancing in the breeze as their stems are still soft with immaturity. Thin clouds have been brushed across the sky, their swirling patterns a work of art against a pale blue backdrop.

A crow on silent wings glides past tall slender pines whilst its cousins, high up in a nearby pine, caw continuously as they fuss around their nests. It is at this point that I realize that this is a circular path, with an opportunity to leave through a gate onto Bourne Park Lane, but I continue round and begin to walk up the incline. Lack of rain for weeks has resulted in

solid ground where the grass is cropped with only an occasional clump of daisies and scattered solitary dandelions. Dry droppings and half-hearted



attempts at burrows evidence the presence of large numbers of rabbits, no doubt only bold enough to come out onto this open ground in the night-time hours of darkness and relative safety. An occasional empty acorn shell might well have been dropped by a passing squirrel.

Once through the gate, in the field on my right, a ewe and its lamb have ventured to the water trough by the gate, moving back to the shade once refreshed. Another ewe moves in for her turn as other sheep begin to bleat in the near distance. It must be uncomfortable for them in their thick woolly coats in this run of unseasonable and record-breaking hot sunny days.

Having completed the circular walk, I am now, for a short time, back in the shade of a few trees. Other walkers are out and about and we wish each other a cheery 'Good morning'. As it is nearing midday, I am grateful that the path now descends gently back towards Bishopsbourne and I can 'free-wheel' without too much effort for the last part of my walk. Along the road, there is an Easter Garden laid out along the bench in the lych gate of St Mary's church. It was started during Covid so that people could see it without going into the church. I know that there are other routes I could have taken today and that there is a footpath that runs through the churchyard, but I shall save this for another time.

Update from the Lyminge Community Hub

On 9th May, members of the Lyminge Community Hub met with Councillor Jim Martin, Leader of Folkestone & Hythe District Council, and Sojan Joseph MP, in order to complete a tour of the village with a view to determining a suitable venue in which the Lyminge Community Hub could provide initially:

- a café, which would sell light bites and provide a welcoming community meeting place
- · a thrift shop
- · a monthly repair café
- and later, rooms for other activities e.g. exercise classes, singing sessions, knit-and-natter, and other activities to support the residents of Lyminge

Whilst the meeting was well received, there was no indication forthcoming as to whether or not Folkestone & Hythe District Council would support our request to use the building in Everist Court, recently vacated by Age UK.

As we are very keen to get the Community Hub established as soon as possible, we have been considering alternative accommodation, which includes the Tayne Centre. However, we are aware that a fair amount of work would be required to bring the rooms available there up to the standard we require to be able offer all that we hope to do. In addition, the Parish Council is considering altering the Village Hall so that it can be accessed by more daytime groups, but neither of these venues will be available for quite some time.

Please rest assured that we are all working hard to establish the Lyminge Community Hub as quickly as possible and we will continue to keep you informed of our progress.

District Councillors' Update - June 2025

Work has now started on the Folkestone town centre improvements. The work will be done in phases and the road works there will last until next spring. For the old Debenhams building (FOLCA) council officers have now secured a grant £1.44 million for a heating pump system for the refurbished building which will both help expedite the project overall and greatly help in the Council's long held ambition to become net zero.



At the time of writing, we are still awaiting feedback on the interim submission that was sent to the Government in January about Local Council Reform. This feedback was due

to be given at the beginning of May. From letters received by Surrey and Sussex it is unclear whether the 500,000 minimum population within the new single councils to be formed is a target or just guidance.

We recently held a very informative North Downs Forum meeting where issues such as organising monitoring of the Nailbourne stream and work going on with the reinstatement of heritage ponds were discussed. If anyone is interested in joining the Group to help with the monitoring please contact me.

Can I make an appeal on behalf of horseback riders. All too often we see riders and their horses intimidated by vehicles travelling too fast. Please do slow down to at least 10 MPH when approaching a horse on the road and leave plenty of room when passing a horse. I strongly support the Green Party policy of a 40 MPH on minor country roads as opposed to the current 60 MPH limit.

Finally, I would like to welcome Chris Hespe, the newly elected Kent County Councillor for the Elham Valley, and wish him every success.





Thank you also to Philip Blanch and the Methodist church for allowing us to hold this event under their beautiful beech tree at short notice.

It seems the idea has spread along the valley with the Bridge Allotment Association holding a similar event on 17th May. One lady who was visiting Lyminge from Worcester said she was going to take the idea back there. Let's hope so; who knows how far this could go!



Tayne Centre Allotment Update

We've all been busy since April at the TC allotments: preparing the soil, germinating seeds and planting seedlings in our plots. Some of us have taken the one plot/one crop approach and others have diversified and planted a range of vegetables in theirs. Between the 11 plots we're growing a good range of veg; so far we've got broad and climbing beans, courgettes, onions, garlic, shallots, squash, lettuce, radishes and raspberries. It's surprising how productive a metre-square bed can be.

Although we have communal water butts at the allotments, the supply of water is running out due to the exceptionally dry spring. Some of us are collecting our 'grey' water to use instead. If you're interested in finding out how to use grey water, the RHS web-site has some useful guidelines.

The intention underlying the small beds is to encourage people who haven't grown their own food before to have a go. The one-metre beds are a good size with which to experiment; easy to maintain and hopefully let the gardeners savour the fruits of their labour.



Permaculture

Continuing our series based around using permaculture to improve our sustainability, let's look at the principle of 'obtaining a yield'. *Principle:* Obtain a yield. Permaculture values self-reliance - the ability of communities to support themselves and each other. This principle focuses on looking for opportunities to create resources with everything that we do. There are many opportunities to design our world to provide outputs that benefit us, sometimes incidental to the main purpose.

In action: When the developer of a new housing estate plants trees and shrubs to improve aesthetics they could be fruit and nut trees to supply food available to local residents. A new animal shelter roof could capture rainwater to supply water for livestock. This helps to maximise what we can produce from the land around us, thereby reducing reliance on others.

Elderflower Cordial

Everything is a bit late this year so there is still an opportunity to make some Elderflower Cordial, a great crowd pleaser when mixed with sparkling water (or Gin!) This recipe makes about 2 litres

Ingredients:

- About 25 elderflower heads
- Finely grated zest of 3 unwaxed lemons and 1 orange, plus their juice (about 150ml in total)
- 1kg sugar
- 1 heaped teaspoon of citric acid

Method:

- 1. Inspect the elderflower heads carefully and remove any insects. Place the flower heads in a large bowl together with the orange and lemon zest.
- 2. Bring 1.5 litres water to the boil and pour over the elderflowers and citrus zest. Cover and leave overnight to infuse.
- 3. Strain the liquid through a scalded jelly bag or piece of muslin and pour into a saucepan. Add the sugar, the lemon and orange juice and the citric acid.
- 4. Heat gently to dissolve the sugar, then bring to a simmer and cook for a couple of minutes.
- 5. Use a funnel to pour the hot syrup into sterilised bottles. Seal the bottles with swing-top lids, sterilised screw-tops or corks.





Trying to Renovate a House Sustainably...

If you've driven through the Elham end of Lyminge recently and wondered if a new supermarket was going up—don't worry! The large scaffolding and "tin hat" are simply signs of a major home renovation that's been going on since January, come rain or shine. This project has a special history: originally built in 1960 by Olive and Roy Rawlings, the home was passed down through the family, extended in 1980, and now—45 years later—is being re-imagined by their granddaughter and her husband to house three generations (and their pets) under one roof. Intergenerational living, as it turns out, can also be a great place to start when thinking sustainably.

....Our Sustainable Building Efforts

We've tried to make choices that reduce our environmental impact while also future-proofing the home Here's what's worked (and what hasn't):

Energy Efficiency

- · We began with a heat loss calculation to understand where improvements were most needed.
- Switched from gas to an air-source heat pump—cutting CO2 emissions by an estimated 80%, with an estimated £ of £1000+ per year.
- We're planning to add a battery to the existing solar panels for maximum self-sufficiency, including in power cuts which we expect to be increasingly frequent with extreme weather events on the rise
- · Upgraded insulation across floors, walls, ceilings, and cladding.
- · Chose high-efficiency glazing and debated long and hard on the most sustainable frames, eventually opting for aluminium frames to balance thermal efficiency with lifespan.
- Smart home tech going beyond smart meters, there are apps available that connect solar panels, batteries etc to electricity providers to understand when the best tariffs are, how to be most efficient in what to use and when.

Reuse & Recycle

- We're planning to reuse all internal doors with a spruce up with new hardware, and using the old kitchen unit doors in a utility room.
- · Salvaged timber offcuts and even found a second life for our old roof tiles—thanks to helpful neighbours using them in their garden beds!

Sustainable Purchases

- Selected materials with recycled content and lower environmental impact where possible—like steel eco baths that use less water and keep it hotter for longer, and lower-impact paints and carpets. I've even seen aluminium showers made from recycled materials... but it will come down to cost.
- Sustainable timber from bathroom vanity units, to front doors and flooring, we've selected sustainable timber in order to reduce the amount of plastic, and materials that are hard to recycle at the end of life.
- Sourced many items locally—from windows and doors to contractors and craftspeople, including the brilliant Charlie Mills who is the main contractor, from CM Carpentry and his Lyminge-based team.

Financing the Build

- Grants we jumped at the chance to use the Government grant for heat pumps, and with Solaris (local company supplying the heat pump) taking care of the application, it really is simple. The one watch out is that you have to pay the total amount first, then the Government pays the grant once the pump is installed.
- Mortgage/ loans We know that who we borrow money from is one of the highest impacts of the whole project, along with the long term efficiency of the house itself. There are also preferential rates on mortgages and loans if you can demonstrate improvements/ high levels of energy efficiency in the final build. We're improving an EPC rating from C to A, which is helpful in finding finance options.

Where We Struggled

- · Clearing out the house inevitably involved more landfill trips than we'd hoped, despite many trips to charity shops too.
- · Some materials like concrete and plastic guttering had no affordable or practical alternatives.
- · Hidden materials—behind the walls and beneath the floors—aren't always visible or easy to choose sustainably.
- Budget limits meant we couldn't insulate quite as much as we'd like, and the recycled plastic roof tiles were too expensive and too much of an unknown for us!
- Rainwater harvesting whilst we're definitely going to be using water butts for gardens, apparently the relatively low amount of rainfall in this area of the country does not make this particularly impactful, whilst it would have cost quite a bit to install.
- Green roofing or walls adds insulation and encourages biodiversity, but not possible on a steeply pitched roof, and not sure FHDC Planning department are ready for "green" walls yet!

In Summary: Sustainable renovation isn't perfect or easy—but every choice adds up. From reusing what we could, to improving energy efficiency and supporting local trades, we've learned that it's about balance. Some days it's insulation and solar panels; other days it's plastic guttering because the budget's gone!

The celebrations took the form of an 'off the street' tea party on Tayne Field.

Later that evening, there was singing of songs from that particular era which took place within the Parish Church due to the extremely cold weather outside.

The proceedings were concluded by the lighting of the beacon, sited on the top of the tower at Saint Mary's and Ethelberga Church





A Man of Straw


I'm generally a solitary figure,

LYMINGE THEN AND NOW

Our monthly look at how Lyminge has changed over the years, with thanks to Lyminge Historical Society.





Mayfield Terrace in Mayfield Road was built in the early years of the 20th Century. The land it occupies used to be pasture, a field known as Libertine owned by the Rector, but this was sold in the years following the arrival of the railway in Lyminge in 1887. This was when developers were keen to build new houses for an expanding population, who wanted to live in the countryside now that transport links were better than they had been in the past.

The picture on the left dates probably to before the First World War when the houses were new. The end wall of the terrace shows chimney flues and fireplaces suggesting the intention had been to build at least one more house and possibly others to extend the terrace further. But the Ordnance Survey map of 1907 shows that the terrace was built exactly as it is today, with eight houses in total and access to the rear between numbers 3 and 4.

The Census of 1911 shows that the end house was occupied by police sergeant George Martin, his wife Florence and their three children Sidney, Dorothy and Leonard. All of them were incomers, part of the great increase in local population at this time. George came from Tudley near Tunbridge Wells, Florence from Gillingham, and their children were each born in different locations. Little Leonard, aged 4, was born in Alkham, demonstrating that the family were very recent arrivals in Lyminge.
