Margaret Saunders' Meanderings

Walking under a hazy sky with the sun doing its best to disperse the thin cloud cover, I make my way from the car park at Samphire Hoe towards the beach, walking parallel to the railway track, which connects Folkestone with Dover. Having driven through the tunnel to reach the wooden buildings made from reclaimed wood, it feels as if I am entering a different world, which in some ways I am. It has a similar feel to that of being on Romney Marsh – both places have been reclaimed from the sea – Romney Marsh after a natural event; Samphire Hoe from a man-made one.

Walkers are asked to keep to the footpaths to avoid ground nesting birds so I continue along the track. Greeny-yellow wood spurge is flowering the other side of the fence, as is some sweet-scented honeysuckle and early brambles. Wood spurge emits a toxic milky-white substance when the stem is broken, and in other parts of the world, this sap has been used to tip poisoned arrows. Clumps of yellow birdsfoot-trefoil brighten the edge of the footpath and the purple of common vetch makes it a subtle colour companion.

In a dip to my left, a pond has formed in a hollow of the land. Four adult mallards are supervising ten small ducklings who are showing off their skills of short takeoffs and skid landings as they scoot in and around the grown-ups. Another circular pond, smaller and shallower, shows the effect the recent long spell of dry weather has had – rings have formed around the edges as the water has steadily evaporated. It is May and the heatwave is currently being replicated around the country as reservoir levels begin to drop.

I approach the beach which bridges the gap between sea and cliff with Folkestone harbour just visible though

the haze. Above me, the mist starts to disperse at the top of the cliffs where the sky becomes blue and clear. The whiteness of the cliffs is dazzling and in places, large boulders of this pristine chalk lie around, freshly fallen and strewn about, with smaller jagged pieces finally coming to rest amongst the pebbles on the beach, not yet smoothed and rounded by the relentless action of the sea. Their freshness is a warning – at any time another cliff fall could bring tons of the relatively soft rock tumbling down. Cracks, crevices and fissures are all indications of the fragility of our 'White Cliffs' and there is talk that in the not too distant future, the railway line between Folkestone and Dover will have to close permanently, due to the instability of the cliff and the cost of maintaining the most expensive stretch of railway in the country. However, today, I am able to stand and admire their magnificence with one particular point reminding me of a snowy peak in the Alps. A meadow pipit, on the Amber List of conservation concern, with its fluttering flight, alights on a smooth white ledge and at my feet, a small waterfall tumbles water from deep inside the cliff, forming a small clear pool before disappearing into the shingle. Mounds of white flowering sea kale, with its subtle coloured bluegreen foliage, populate the top of the beach, out of reach of the tides. The shoots were used in the 18th and 19th centuries as a vegetable and after a lull in consumption, it is now cultivated in Britain and used by celebrity chefs. Purple sedum, or stonecrop, add colour and interest to this area between land and sea. A small blue butterfly flits by, moving across the grassland at the base of the cliffs.





Although the tide is receding, the rocks that appear at low tide and make the scene more interesting, are not visible and a finger of fallen rock is not yet clear of water, bringing to an end this part of my walk. Half submerged smooth white chalk boulders have become embedded in the seabed and a small eddy swirls each time a gentle wave ebbs and flows over a depression in the rock. Soothing sounds of the sea softly gurgling surround me as I sit and I am mesmerized by the constant pushing and drawing back of the water over rock which was once covered by the sea, tens of thousands of years ago, having only recently been reunited with that which had caused its formation. Stretching my gaze further out, the sea is almost flat. with differences of colour and texture caused by the currents as they move.

I walk back along the concrete apron behind the seawall. A fishing boat from Folkestone, which had been out at anchor, has now come closer to the shore. Thumps and thuds can be heard as the fisherman hauls in rectangular lobster baskets along a wire, one at a time, unhooking them to take on board, the sounds travelling easily across the flat water. And I wonder how changed this walk will be in fifty years time, when more rock will inevitably have fallen.

District Councillors' update

- September 2025



After a year of being closed the Romney Marsh Visitor Centre opened again at the beginning of August and is to be known as The Nest. They will be offering a café, retail and community space. Working alongside the visitor centre's new operator, the Romney Marsh Countryside Partnership, with F&HDC's support, manages the 11-hectare nature reserve. This has several nature walks and activities for both schools and young people.

The Edwardian section of the former Debenhams department store in Folkestone is to be put up for sale. This is part of a new strategy for the building agreed by the Council's cabinet members. The future of Folca 2 – the Art Deco section on Sandgate Road – is being explored with a mixed-use scheme the preferred option. This could be fully commercial or a combination of public sector, medical and commercial uses.

A quarter of the £20m regeneration scheme in Folkestone is now complete. As part of the project the Folkestone bus station will move to a linear layout and Bouverie Square will return to its former use as a garden square. The two bus stops outside the bus station will be moved temporarily from Tuesday 2 September. The rest of Folkestone bus station will close on Saturday 20 September. Stagecoach services currently operating from the bus

station will run from temporary stops erected along Middelburg Square.

An Asian hornet has recently been found in Stelling Minnis. Please look out for other Asian Hornets in the area and if you spot any, please try to take a picture and report it to alert_nonnative@ceh.co.uk.

Green Grant Programme – I was pleased to support the applications in the North Downs West Ward as follows –

Postling Village Hall – £11,700 - Solar PV & battery storage systems

In the Sticks Childcare - £10,944 - Solar PV & battery storage systems for Lyminge nursery

Rebel Farmer - £1,000 - Conservation event Lyminge

Folkestone – A Brighter Future – Work is now fully underway on this £20m regeneration scheme initiated under the previous administration. At the last full Council meeting I raised the issue of traffic disruption all around the town. I understand KCC are directing the works and are working hard to resolve problems.

Princes Parade – The Leader of the Council has confirmed that the Princes Parade site will remain exactly as it is for the time being. It will be interesting to see

how this changes under the Local Government Organisation.

Otterpool Park – a further collaboration agreement has been signed with Homes England and I await to hear further details.

Local Government Re-organisation – the 14 Districts of Kent and Medway continue to meet to try and come to a consensus as to how Kent & Medway should be divided into unitary bodies and how many. I attend the FHDC working group and from the information I have heard and read, if there is not a consensus by the 28 November 2025, then Government will direct. We do know that the timeline is for new shadow unitary bodies to be set-up in May 2027 and for the new structure to go live in May 2028.

Ward Budget – I still have some funding available to support local organisations – please email me with any request up to £500. I have recently supported Canterbury Beekeepers to the tune of £274 to provide an Asian hornet trap in North Downs West.

Unfortunately, none of these venues would be suitable for what we are trying to achieve.

The attraction of Everest Court is the commercial kitchen which would be used by a catering company to provide lunches and other refreshments, as well as other spaces suitable for a thrift shop and space for groups to meet; this can all be accommodated on the ground floor of Everest Court.

We are in the process of requesting a further meeting with Mr Martin and FHDC officers, now we have concluded our review of alternative venues and know that they are unsuitable.

We are also calling a Public Meeting on 10th September at 7.30pm at the Methodist Church and hope that you will come along to receive an update on all the work so far.

We would very much value your attendance at this meeting and your continued support to this venture.

As local community choirs go, Cantores has been around for a relatively long time, formed the better part of fifty years ago in 1979. It has been based in Lyminge for a few decades and has played a significant part in the musical life of the village ever since. 

'Nature is the greatest devourer of man's endeavours' Lucy Lippard

Article 7 in our series on permaculture advocates working with nature, not against it.

It's pretty hard work to row against the tide of nature, and wastes a lots of energy, time and resource, so our next principle is 'Work with nature, not against it'

Principle: Work with nature, not against it

Because nature has been marginalised in our world, we often barely consider it when going about our lives and making our choices in the world. As a result, we can sometimes find ourselves battling against nature, which is supremely more powerful than we are! This principle helps to highlight solutions that avoid that battle, but more importantly involve harnessing the power of nature to our benefit.

In action

On a bigger scale, renewable energy sources like wind and wave power involve this principle in action. We can use it on a smaller scale too - leaving the leaves is a great example.

Raking up leaves in windy autumn and winter conditions can be hard work, and interrupts natures' cycle of replenishing the soil with dropped and decaying foliage from above. It also reduces habitat for insects, which provides a food source for birds. Rather than working against nature, just letting the leaves fall and rot will enrich your garden (maybe less need for artificial fertilisers?). Everyone wins!

This year it is striking to see how early both wild and cultivated fruit and vegetables are appearing.

Blackberries are prolific around the village so there are plenty for all the foragers! Apple trees at the sides of the road are free for all and the elderberries are here at the same time as the blackberries! It's potentially a busy time of year for capturing and storing this bulk of food. I'm sure you have many ways you already make use of the bounty!

FREEZE FREEZE! Most fruit and veg will freeze well especially if you open freeze first then place the frozen fruit in a bag or container to take up less space. This applies to all currants, blueberries, elderberries and raspberries. I like to mix them together for future use however I like!



For apples, peel and core and chop into smallish pieces, place in freezer bags or boxes saved from butter or margarine or ice cream (thank you Phil Wilson - our local apple expert). This has to be done quickly to prevent the fruit browning.

Alternatively, if you have a huge number of apples you can invest in a juicer and have great fun and satisfaction from seeing the apples rapidly reduced to juice. The remaining dry matter does well on the compost heap. Pasteurise (rolling boil) the juice then freeze as quickly as possible in plastic bottles. Don't fill them completely full otherwise the bottles will burst when it expands!

The jury's out on whether you need to blanche beans before open freezing or just trim them as you would for cooking fresh. Perhaps you could let us know. Never quite as good as the fresh ones but not too bad! Better to eat them fresh from the plant!

Plums and stone fruit do freeze well fresh but you can de-stone them, cut in half and pack in old margarine/ butter/ ice cream boxes or freezer bags or cut in half, de-stone then stew them gently with maple syrup, honey or agarve syrup until softened then pack as the apples then freeze.

Soups

Tomatoes and courgettes. Roast together with fresh basil and make into soups then freeze the extra soup in containers. I find the large yogurt containers ideal for this. The only trouble is my husband gets confused with the contents of yogurt containers in the fridge because I forget to label them! (Editors tip, write on the containers with a Sharpie pen) In these warmer autumns I have still picked tomatoes and beans well into October but I have kept feeding them and kept watering which I used to finish about the beginning of September because the temperatures were lower.

It's too late now to sow any crops but you could get away with planting out ready grown plants of kale and spring cabbage and leeks - better do it before the second week of September.

FINAL TIP! Cooking sweetcorn the best and tastiest way. Leave it in its husk and just put in the microwave for 2 minutes then peel off, butter and salt generously and munch!

Sometimes the simple recipes that remind us of our childhoods are the best.

Easy Baked Apples

On sunny days serve with ice cream or cream. Add custard on those chillier autumn days.

Ingredients

- 50g butter
- 1 orange, zest and juice
- 50g light brown soft sugar
- 1/4 tsp ground ginger
- ¼ tsp ground allspice
- 100g dried mixed fruit (currants, sultanas, candied peel)
- 4 large sharp eating apples, such as Evita, Jonagold, Granny Smith, Braeburn
- crème fraîche, to serve

Method

- 1. Preheat the oven to 220C/200C Fan/ Gas 7. Melt the butter in a small pan over a medium-low heat. Take the pan off the heat and add the orange zest and juice along with the sugar and spic-es. Stir well to combine, then add the dried fruit. Set aside.
- 2. Core the apples, pushing the corer about three-quarters of the way through the apple, to make a container for the filling.
- 3. Put the apples cored side up into a deep-sided roasting tray, into which they fit snugly. Fill the empty cores with the spiced fruit mixture. Don't worry if the filling spills over a little: when the apple releases its juices as it bakes it'll create a delicious spiced apple caramel in the bottom of the tray.
- 4. Bake the apples on the bottom shelf of the oven for 20 minutes, or until the apples are soft.
- 5. Serve the apples with a generous spoonful of the roasting juices.





Second Hand September

With the hot weather coming to an end and us looking towards more cosy clothes for the colder season ahead, why not have a sort out of your summer clothes before you put them away. Are there items you haven't worn this year? Or are there items that just don't look right anymore? By recirculating our clothes – buying, wearing and donating second hand – we can help to reduce the demand.

Whatever your style, whatever your budget, Second Hand September is for everyone.

LYMINGE THEN AND NOW

Our monthly look at how Lyminge has changed over the years, with thanks to Lyminge Historical Society.





We are looking here at the west side of Station Road just before the sharp bend where it becomes Canterbury Road. Both of these buildings were constructed at the very beginning of the 20th Century, and for a while, they stood on their own with empty plots to either side. That had all changed by 1911 by which time the row of buildings we know today were all standing. This area became the economic heart of the village following the arrival of the railway in 1887, replacing the High Street.

The picture on the left dates to shortly after the Second World War. To the right of the picture is the bakery then run by Charles and Amy Brown. This shop had always been a bakery, and was run initially by Walter and Mary Potter and their niece Edith, and then after the First World War by Franklin Hornby, his wife Lilian and brother Ernest. Many residents may still remember the wonderful bread baked in the brick ovens by Bernard Hayward, the last baker on this site and the smell of spicy hot cross buns that would waft across the village at Easter time. Sadly these ovens were removed with the historic pitch-pine shop fittings by the next business on the site, which itself lasted only a few years. Today, the Chinese takeaway China China shows how the needs of today's villagers have changed and fast food finds more of a local market than artisan bread.

Next door to the bakery was the estate office of the firm of Messrs Finn-Kelcey, auctioneer and property manager. The five rooms above were let, and in 1911 were occupied by James Watt, a groom and domestic gardener from Canterbury, his wife Alice and their teenage son Frank, who worked as a houseboy. Over the years businesses have come and gone. Some may remember the insurance and financial services business of Harold Stenning, which also operated as a building society agency, providing services on the high street before they went online. Subsequently, a number of estate agency businesses have operated from this office, and today this continues with Laing Bennett, the current occupants.
