Margaret Saunders' Meanderings

I am speeding northwards on an Azuma train on the East Coast Main Line, on my way to Scotland to visit family. It is the hottest and final day of the fourth official heatwave of the year and I'm grateful for the air conditioning. Very soon we are out of the London sprawl and into the countryside, where dark green hedgerows punctuate the land, dividing fields into a patchwork of colour and texture. Harvesting is almost over, although a few fields await the cut of the combine, interestingly in the middle part of the journey: at either end the crops have been gathered in.

Apart from the different textures of fields providing animal pasture, the wheat fields vary in their post harvest progress: lines of straw lie golden on equally golden stubble; cylindrical and cuboid bales of straw lying haphazardly across fields; two straight parallel lines of rolled bales await a tractor's attention before being stacked and stored; short straight stubble will soon be ploughed-in on cleared fields; a mixture of gold and brown where stubble has started to be ploughed in; brown soil shows further ploughing and finally one or two fields with smooth softlooking earth, which has been tilled ready for sowing. Late summer is certainly a busy time in the farming year. Patterns appear in the form of pale green stripes where hay has been cut; combine harvester and tractor tracks which weave around



and about as they work, flattening the wheat as it grows, then when it is cut and the straw baled; sheep tracks meander through flat and undulating grassy meadows; water courses twist and turn as the water constantly seeks out lower land; footpaths, tracks and roads follow their own agenda of getting people from here to there - there are no straight lines in nature.


Church spires and towers rise above clusters of trees to mark out villages, their height having been the tallest constructions for centuries until pylons, wind turbines and phone masts have more recently dwarfed these ancient landmarks.

Dark rich soil - the plough followed by hundreds of seagulls - tells me we are passing through Lincolnshire, whose flat alluvial land provides plenty of nutrients for a variety of crops. Moving swiftly on through England we

come to Yorkshire, where dry stone walls bisect the countryside and bent wind-stunted trees form hedgerows. Sheep have been put into a field to search for grass between the dry stiff stalks of the stubble. A stand of larches have dried and died and small farm buildings, on the edge of fields, stand abandoned and ruinous, with only walls and gable ends remaining, empty shells from an earlier time. Cattle and sheep share a field.

We make our first stop at York, the Minister standing out solid and strong. Moving on northwards maize is growing, some fields with healthy upright plants and others with short, sparse and spindly stalks, ample evidence of the lack of rain. If further proof were needed, water cannons in the distance send out pulsating jets of water in an effort to replicate rain, which has been in such short supply this year. Darlington is the





(contd) next stop which is more or less the halfway point of my journey. The station is a Grade II* listed Victorian building with impressive Doric columns holding up the vast roof, a distinguished reminder of the early railway era.

Earlier in the morning mist had enveloped the Elham Valley and the nearby Kent coastline, now becoming thinner as the day and my journey progress. By mid afternoon, a pale grey sky that has prevented the sun from breaking through, begins to clear and streaks of light turquoise appear to the east and sunshine gradually lights up the countryside. At Newcastleupon-Tyne, we have to wait on the bridge over the River Tyne for a platform to become available. The tide is out and mudflats line each side of the river. To my right, a range of bridges carries traffic and trains in and out of England's northernmost city, which was once one of the world's largest shipbuilding and repair centres.

Buddleia and rosebay-willowherb hurtle past in a purple blur. From Newcastle northwards, the rail track moves eastwards running parallel to the coast, with views across the sea to the Farne Islands. The next stop will be Berwickupon-Tweed, on the border between England and Scotland. Here the town's defensive walls descend the riverbank to the water's edge, a reminder that this was once a frontier town. Sweeping on, we pass by the Lammermuir Hills, the name deriving from the Old English lambra mor, meaning "moorland of the lambs" words which describe well the current scenery. And then, with none of the spreading urban sprawl I saw leaving London, we are in to Edingburgh Waverley Station, and another fine piece of architecture and the end of our journey.

Note: apologies for lack of photos from the journey as it was not possible to take any through the windows due to the speed of the train and the reflection of the glass. Instead I have chosen a couple of local ones to illustrate the words.

IN OTHER NEWS

We have been working closely with Lyminge Parish Council and are pleased to confirm that new nets are being ordered for the goal posts on St Mary's Field; a 'Forgotten Women in War' statue will arrive in time for Remembrance Day (to be sited on the Teddars Leas/Canterbury Road triangle). The white T bone (now virtually disappeared) marking the emergency access path between Meriden Close and Westfield Lane together with the two sets of faded speed bump markings in Meriden Park will be repainted by F&HDC. Work is expected to be completed within the next 2-3 months.

In addition, the provision of a much needed bench has been confirmed by LPC and will be installed adjacent to the children's play area in St Mary's Close as there is insufficient space for seating in the park itself. Our thanks go to LPC members who reached out to the ERA recently with support and financing to help clear up some long-standing requests and issues.

District Councillors' update

October 2025



I hope you have all had a good summer.

The European Entry Exit system will start to be implemented from the 12th October. It is going to be a phased implementation over the next six months from October 2025 to April 2026.

The first time you cross to France you will need to provide your fingerprints and a facial scan. This will only happen the first time and will take a few extra minutes so there may be some hold ups at the crossing points, the Channel Tunnel and Dover. This should save time for future visits because your passport will not need to be stamped. In the meantime, the KCC website gives the latest - www.kent. gov.uk/roads-and-travel/travelling-around-kent/ eu-entryexit-system and there is an email where you can report any traffic problems -

ees@folkestone-hythe.gov.uk

Folkestone & Hythe District Council is once again supporting the open-air art festival which happens every three years. This year's Folkestone Triennial exhibition is titled "How Lies The Land?" and is the sixth edition. It invites residents and visitors to explore the stories and histories that shape the landscape.

There will be new temporary bus stops in operation in Middleburg Square from 21 September following 6 the closure of Folkestone Bus Station. Stagecoach has developed maps, a dedicated webpage and posters with details of all temporary stops. Details can be found on the F&HDC website.

I have some Ward Members' grants still to be awarded. Local groups can contact me with their proposals and I can advise them how to apply.

Green Grant Programme – I was pleased to support the applications in the North Downs West Ward as follows:

Postling Village Hall – £11,700 - Solar PV & battery storage systems

In the Sticks Childcare - £10,944 - Solar PV & battery storage systems for Lyminge Nursery

Rebel Farmer - £1,000 - Conservation event Lyminge

Folkestone - A Brighter Future - Work is now fully underway on this £20m regeneration scheme initiated under the previous Administration. At the last full Council Meeting I raised the issue of traffic disruption all around the town. I understand KCC are directing the works and are working hard to resolve problems.

Princes Parade – The Leader of the Council has confirmed that the Princes Parade site will remain exactly as it is for the time being. It will be interesting to see how this changes under the Local Government Organisation.

Otterpool Park – a further collaboration agreement has been signed with Homes England and I await to hear further details.

Local Government Re-organisation – the 14 Districts of Kent and Medway continue to meet to try and come to a consensus as to how Kent & Medway should be divided into unitary bodies and how many. I attend the FHDC working group and from the information I have heard and read, if there is not a consensus by the 28 November 2025, then Government will direct. We do know that the timeline is for new shadow unitary bodies to be set-up in May 2027 and for the new structure to go live in May 2028.

Ward Budget - I still have some funding available to support local organisations - please email me with any request up to £500. I have recently supported Canterbury Beekeepers to the tune of £274 to provide an Asian hornet trap in North Downs West.



As advised in the September issue of The Lyminge Newsletter, we held a Public Meeting on 10th September at the Methodist Church. We were really pleased that 48 people kindly came along on what turned out to be a very wet and windy evening.

Following a presentation highlighting our efforts to secure the use of the Jubilee Building at Everist Court, we shared our plans to use only the ground floor. As noted in our September update, the attraction of the Jubilee Building is the commercial kitchen, which will enable us to provide a café offering lunches and other refreshments. In addition, we would be able to have a thrift shop, a space for village groups to meet and, hopefully, a monthly repair café. Our committee then answered a wide range of questions from those present at the meeting.

We very much appreciate the support we receive from Shaun Pottage, Chairman of Lyminge Parish Council, and Sue Baldwin, Vice Chairman of Lyminge Parish Council. They kindly attend our committee meetings whenever they can sharing advice and guidance on the best way forward and attended our meeting on 10th September.

Our next step is to request a further meeting with Jim Martin, Leader of Folkestone & Hythe District Council and his officers. We have been advised that Councillor Martin's proposals for developing the building back into flats should be available by October. We are hoping that he and his councillors will be willing to compromise and allow us to develop the ground floor into our proposed 10 community hub, which we are confident will be welcomed by the residents of Lyminge and the surrounding villages.


Letter to the Editor

The nostalgic atmosphere of the Railway Museum is missing without these period advertising signs.





Getting to know Permaculture

Up next in our run through of permaculture principles (there's a lot hey!) is 'Integration, not segregation'. This is one of the great lessons we can learn from observing nature.

Principle: integration, not segregation

In several areas, we as humans have created 'monocultures'. These are essentially environments where only one kind of living thing is allowed to thrive. The traditional garden lawn is a classic example – spraying off or digging out any plant that isn't just that single type of grass we deem desirable. Many types of farming follow this methodology too – fields of wheat as far as the eye can see. However, there are no monocultures in nature. As they are self-sustaining, natural systems rely on diversity – a mixture of living things each taking a niche role and playing it's part in sustaining the whole. Monocultures as a result are hard to sustain (remember 'work with nature, not against it') and are inherently wasteful ('create no waste' and 'self-sustaining systems').

In action

We can see this in our working lives. Research suggests that diversity in teams is a significant factor for success. With different skills, perspectives and attributes, a diverse group of people working together will do better work than a group of very similar people. Of course in the garden, a polyculture will do the same, with different elements offering benefits to the group, and all needs met, to form a self-sustaining solution. More winning.

Recipe tip

For those of you wondering how on earth you can introduce 30 different plants into your weekly diet, a good place to start is a recipe that has flour as one of its main ingredients. There are so many flours readily available now other than wheat – chick pea, buckwheat, rice, coconut, wholemeal, millet, almond, oat, quinoa, amaranth and probably a lot more. You can mix these up and use them in dishes such as pancakes, crumbles and baking (although you will need to add 1 tsp of baking powder to 8oz of flour if you want to make a cake.) Each one of these is a different plant so you could easily tick off 4 or 5 in one element of one recipe.





Fruit Crumble with mixed flours

Switch on oven to 170°, gas mark 3. 10oz plain flour.

This could be 2oz of wheat flour. 2oz of chick pea flour, 2oz of buckwheat flour, and 2oz coconut flour.

You could also add a tsp of chia seeds or spirulina (that's 7 plants).

Chopped nuts are good here too, that's more plants.

Ilb of prepared fruit (this could also be a mix, apples, blackberries, red, white or black currants, can you see how the numbers are racking up!)

Around 6oz to 8oz of brown sugar although this will depend on the tartness of the fruit and how sweet your tooth is.

I tsp of cinnamon (adding spices and herbs to your cooking is another way of adding plant species).

Prepare fruit and pop into a deep oven proof dish that fits in your microwave. Microwave for a couple of minutes to start the cooking process.

Place the flours and spice into a mixing bowl and rub in the butter until it resembles fine breadcrumbs. Stir in anything else you have decided to use.

Gently place on top of the fruit loosely, don't be tempted to pack down

Pop into a preheated oven 170° until the crumble is an even golden brown, around 25 minutes.

Serve warm with cream, yogurt, ice cream, custard or vegetarian/vegan alternative.

COURT LODGE GREEN CUT AND COLLECT NEWS

Reported by Cllr Tony King, Climate Action Lead

You may have noticed that the annual cut and collect of the grassy areas of Court Lodge Green was partially undertaken in August. The rest will be undertaken a little bit later, once the red bartsia flowers have finished flowering and seeding, which are the only source of pollen for the rare red bartsia bees which forage on Court Lodge Green in August and September.

This is the first year we have undertaken the cut and collect in two distinct periods. One reason is to allow a more diverse level of vegetation cover over the winter months, to provide a bit more shelter to wildlife than if the entire field is moved late (although significant sections are left unmown even in this case, so there is a certain level of shelter in any case). Another reason was to try to reduce the density of hogweed on the field, by mowing earlier than we normally do.

However it may be necessary next year to strim or brush-cut some of the denser areas of hogweed even earlier in the season, to avoid them out-competing other wild flowers. We constantly monitor the impacts of our mowing regimes on the biodiversity of Court Lodge Green, and try to adapt our plans accordingly.



When sewers and drains get blocked, it can cause any or all of the following problems:







Foul waste flooding

Pollution

Excavation and repair, causing roadworks

We can't control the water companies and what they do with our wastewater at this time, but we can control how we dispose of our waste at home.

Did you know that 48% of people still pour fats, oils and grease down their drains?

Unblocktober is all about making small changes to your habits and the way you dispose of certain everyday items, to make a big difference to the environment.

We all need to do our own little bit and in turn this will make a big difference without a big effort.

Sibton Park Cricket Club win Kent Cricket Award 2025 for 'Tackling Climate Change'

This year Sibton Park Cricket Club decided to tackle how the club was dealing with the change in the climate and the increase in energy costs.

Having been successful in various grant applications, the club took on the process of updating the roof by re-felting and battening it to make it more energy efficient before putting on a 9.7kW solar panel system including three batteries to maximise storage.

From this, we have reduced our

energy costs by 66% and are 71% self-sufficient on the grid for our electricity.

This is not our only project as we having been working closely with Southeast Rivers Trust and others on a unique way to deal with the wet and flooded ground around the club in the winter months.

We shall cover this in more detail next month but for now we are pleased to be awarded this from Kent Cricket in recognition of all our hard work this year.... so far.





LYMINGE THEN AND NOW

Our monthly look at how Lyminge has changed over the years, with thanks to Lyminge Historical Society.

This month we have a view that has been completely transformed within living memory. Although it does not look like it, the two views above are taken from more or less the same position.

Until they were demolished in 1960, Upstreet Cottages stood on the main road through Etchinghill opposite the old workhouse (the site of which is now occupied by Meriden Park). The cottages stood at right angles to the road, directly on the roadside, facing in the direction of the junction with Teddars Leas Road. The western end of the range, to the right of the photograph, has been truncated by the photographer but we know from another picture that there was another window before the building ended at the roadside.



Exactly how old Upstreet Cottages were is open to debate as nothing now survives, but they show timber-framing that suggests they could easily be several hundred years old. When they were demolished, the walls were found to have an inner core of wooden faggots, (ie bundles of wood), overlaid with cow dung which was then plastered. Although the cottages appear to be two buildings built side by side, at the time of the first house-by-house



census in 1841, the cottages were occupied by a single family, tenant farmer Stephen Sandford, his wife Mary and their five children Stephen and Mary (like their parents), James, Eliza and Thomas, aged from 9 down to 1 year.

It is thought that the depression that can still be seen in the pavement by no 5 is the site of the well that once served Upstreet Cottages.

THE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN: Progress and Community Involvement

Introduction

The Neighbourhood Plan has been revived and is now progressing swiftly. Under the leadership of Sue Baldwin, Vice Chair of Lyminge Parish Council, much of the initial groundwork has already been accomplished. The next phase involves recruiting community members to help shape the foundation of the plan through three dedicated working groups, each focusing on the distinct areas of Etchinghill, Lyminge, and Rhodes Minnis.

Working Groups and areas of focus

To ensure a comprehensive approach, three working groups have been established, each covering a key aspect of neighbourhood development:

- Environment including Ecology
- · Community & Economy
- · Buildings, Housing & Heritage

The purpose and power of Neighbourhood Planning

Neighbourhood planning empowers local communities to develop a shared vision for their area, directly influencing how their neighbourhood develops and grows. This process enables residents to decide where new homes, shops, and okices should be located, and to have a say on the design of these buildings as well as the infrastructure that supports them.

By harnessing neighbourhood planning, local people are equipped with a powerful set of tools to determine the types of development that best meet their community's needs.

Importantly, this planning process ensures that the ambitions of the neighbourhood are aligned with the broader strategic requirements and priorities of the wider local area.

Community participation and meeting arrangements

The Lyminge Association has been tasked with encouraging members of the community to join the working groups. These groups will aim to meet fortnightly, where possible, to accelerate progress by gathering the necessary information and details. Meetings are scheduled for early evenings and will take place at either Lyminge Village Hall or Etchinghill Village Hall.
