# **Margaret Saunders' Meanderings**

# The following are some of my second observations made on my meanderings in the last week of September from around St Mawes in Cornwall.

Passing by the Tudor castle of St Mawes with its round keep, I wander along a road which runs parallel with the shore. This road ends with a wooden gate which leads on to the coastal footpath to St Just. Large individual houses have been built on the landward side of the road, with commanding views of the Fal estuary known as the Carrick Roads. Little sandy bays are separated by rocks over which the sea is frothing and foaming. Just above the waterline two oyster catchers, with their distinctive jet black plumage on their heads, backs and tails and white chest underneath, dart restlessly on reddish-pink legs amongst and over the rocks. They prod and poke their bright orange-red beaks in search of mussels and cockles, emitting a high pitched squeaky chirrup-like cry every so often. It is late afternoon and gradually the blue of the sky and sea turns to platinum then gold, the sunlight shimmering a path across the estuary, in preparation for another magnificent sunset.

One bright sunny morning I walk down the hill to the harbour village of St Mawes where a harbour wall protects the street and houses on its lower level. Boats and yachts are moored in the calm waters of the haven, well protected from the gale-force westerly winds that often blow around this coast. Picturesque newly whitewashed houses line the winding road, their names indicating their history – Pilchard House with pale blue shutters, Court House, The Old Bakehouse and Old Dairy. A candyfloss-pink cottage with a thatched roof is aptly called Pink Cottage. Steep steps lead down the harbour wall onto the beach where the dark rocks envelope pebble and shell-strewn sand. A diving platform is anchored off-shore, in the deeper water away from the rocks.

Away from the water the streets climb steeply inland, with footpaths becoming flights of steps. Walls made

from granite stones hold up gardens, some of the blocks of stones laid dry, some cemented together and others constructed of long thin stones laid dry in a zig-zag pattern. Similar walls line the lanes, holding firm the field edge over the centuries, ensuring safe passage for people, animals, carts and now motorised vehicles. These walls are often obscured by moss, ivy, brambles and other plants, whose seeds have found a foothold amongst the ancient hard wearing stone. A fern hangs over the top of a wall creating a dark shadow against the white lichened stone.

Above the castle are the Lamorran House Gardens, a sub-tropical Italianate garden, with a focus on foliage. Today is hot and I am grateful for the shade that is afforded by a huge variety of tall trees. Built on a steep south-facing slope, there are corners and spaces interspersed throughout and every so often, a view opens up of the deep sapphire sea beyond, sparkling with diamonds as the sun catches the ripples. Mini waterfalls lead into ponds where statues rest amongst fronds and leaves; elegant metal bird sculptures sit on sand at the base of a palm tree; rose-shaped succulents abound in bright greens, deep reds and mixtures of the two; tree ferns quiver in the breeze, their leaves shining in the sunlight; a face-shaped fountain with green trailing foliage for hair; a stone statue of pan playing his flute; a niche in a stone wall houses a female statue whose image is reflected in the fern-fringed pool below as a firecrest flits about in an overhanging tree. On the terrace in front of the house at the top of the garden, a few tables are placed where food and drink can be enjoyed in a wonderfully peaceful setting. Today is the last day the gardens will be open this season and I am pleased that this was my choice for today's outing, a mere five minutes stroll from our holiday cottage.

#### LYMINGE COMMUNITY HUB

Further to our update in the November issue of The Lyminge Newsletter, we agreed the date of Tuesday, 11th November for our meeting with Councillor Jim Martin, Leader of Folkestone & Hythe District Council and his officers. Five members of the Lyminge Community Hub committee attended the meeting and we were pleased that Councillor Tania Gauder, Senior Caseworker for Sojan Joseph MP, Christopher Hespe, Kent County Councillor for the Elham Valley and Shaun Pottage, Chair of Lyminge Parish Council, were all in attendance.

Gillian Heywood, Chair of Lyminge Community Hub, gave a PowerPoint presentation outlining our proposals for creating a village hub using the ground floor of the Jubilee Building at Everist Court. As detailed in our November update, this would provide us with sufficient space to have a commercial kitchen in which we could prepare breakfasts, light lunches and refreshments throughout the day from Monday to Friday, create a thrift shop and still have a good sized meeting room for local clubs and other groups to meet in and, hopefully, a monthly repair café.

During the discussions which followed, Councillor Martin emphasised again the need for social housing in the form of one-bedroom flats so that he can release some larger houses for families. We pointed out that whilst we fully appreciate the need for more social housing, Lyminge already has a good level of social housing provision for single people and that not everyone wants to

move to a rural location, where social isolation is much more prevalent than in urban areas.

The Jubilee Building (also referred to as Jubilee House) is located at Everist Court in Lyminge. The building was formerly used as a community day centre by Age UK, but it has been listed as an asset of community value since 17 June 2025 following a successful nomination by the Lyminge Community Hub, Community Interest Company (C.I.C.). If a planning application is put forward by the Council to change the whole building into flats, there would need to be a change of use from Community to Housing and this is something we will need to oppose if we are to secure use of the ground floor for our Community Hub. If deemed necessary, we would organise a further public meeting and would be looking to the residents of Lyminge for your support in objecting to this change of use.

Proposals for the possible installation of a Mansard roof on the Jubilee building were also discussed, as this would create provision for a third floor to the building and space for two additional apartments thus providing a total of five, which Councillor Martin is hoping to achieve. If this option works, it would mean that the Council would secure additional singleperson accommodation and the residents of Lyminge and the surrounding villages would have a much-needed social space for all ages once again using the ground floor of the building.

# **District Councillors' update**

Folkestone & Hythe

- December 2025

Otterpool Park – The District Council has, subject to no 'call in', agreed further collaboration with Homes England. From the outputs of the work to date a critical next step is to secure full planning approval for Otterpool Park. It is proposed that the Council and Homes England enter into a further period of formal joint working to December 2026 through a Planning Agreement which will be focused on securing the outline consent and enabling the early delivery of new homes. The Heads of Terms (HoT) which will form the basis for the detailed drafting / negotiation of the Planning Agreement can be found here <a href="https://folkestone-hythe.moderngov.co.uk/ieDecisionDetails.aspx?ld=3408">https://folkestone-hythe.moderngov.co.uk/ieDecisionDetails.aspx?ld=3408</a>. The agreement will cover the period up to the grant of outline planning approval and completion of related work.

**Folca** (previously Debenhams) The freehold of the c.26,963 square foot space, known as Folca 1, is for sale with marketing agents Avison Young. Sited in a prime town centre location, the building could be suitable for a variety of uses – subject to planning permission. Folca 1 is currently detached from Folca 2 (the Art Deco section of the building) on the first and second floors. The connection between the two on the ground and basement levels will be separated by the Council early next year prior to sale.

Folkestone Library – Creative Folkestone has recently announced a plan to work in Partnership with KCC and the Community. It is well known that the Central Library building is in need of extensive maintenance and repairs. Creative Folkestone said "a Significant capital investment will be required to realise the vision we have set out. The proposal to Kent County Council is to work together and apply for central government funding that will enable this important community asset to be brought back to life."

Bus shelters along Middelburg Square - the new Folkestone Bus Station, has recently been installed. The temporary shelters have been sourced to protect passengers from the elements over the coming months. A delay in the supply chain has meant contractor Bauer Media Outdoor (BMO) is unable to install the permanent shelters until early 2026.

Remembrance Day – it was good to see so many services being held across our Ward for Remembrance Sunday. I attended All Saints Stanford with the service starting outside by the Memorial in quite warm and dry weather. It is good to be reminded of those who lost their lives in our Villages and eighty years after the end of the Second World War – 'We will remember them'.

**Local Government Reorganisation** – At an Extraordinary full Council on 19 November the decision was to recommend to Cabinet that Model 3a was the preferred model for FHDC. This was ratified by Cabinet District and will now be put forward by the Leader to Government on 28 November 2025. Model 3a keeps East Kent together ie Folkestone & Hythe, Dover, Canterbury, Ashford and Thanet.

**Thanks** – it is the time of the year when I would like to say 'thank you' to – Peter Barnes, who diligently every month puts this magazine together, to the Parish Councillors, the Village Hall Committee, the Tayne Centre, Lyminge Association, Lyminge Church and all the volunteers and leaders of various other groups in the Village who give so much time to the Village and its community. May I wish you all and all local residents a very Happy Christmas and a peaceful New Year.

At the Extraordinary Full Council meeting last week it was agreed that F&HDC will put forward option 3a to the Government for LGR. This will divide Kent into three Unitary Authorities and combine F&HDC with Ashford, Dover, Canterbury, and Thanet. It will be the Government who make the final decision as to how Kent will be split. It is expected there will be public consultation on the recommended option(s) for Kent in spring 2026.

A £5m investment has been agreed for F&HDC to purchase 20 more properties to be used for homeless households in the district. Using council-owned properties as temporary accommodation reduces the reliance on private, nightly-let temporary accommodation and is more cost-effective in the long term.

Temporary bus shelters have been installed in Middelburg Square, Folkestone. Due to supply chain delays, the contractors are unable to install the permanent shelters until next year. Work creating the rain gardens element of the project is underway. The gardens will collect run-off water and filter pollutants to water vegetation and provide a natural habitat for wildlife as well as reusing rainwater to water surrounding plants.

A joint approach to bringing the library in Grace Hill, Folkestone, back into use as a multi-use centre is being made by Creative Folkestone and Sunflower House. They have announced that they propose working together to secure central government funding. The vision is to create a multi-use space as a library alongside new areas for education, creative industries and community events in a repaired and restored building that Kent County Council put up for sale in the summer.

## **Monthly Summary** from Chris Hespe, **Kent County Councillor** for Elham Valley


Kent County Council (KCC) is proposing a single **Unitary Council** with three Area Assemblies to streamline local government, aiming for significant cost savings and minimal disruption to essential services. The proposal balances strategic oversight with local involvement and will be submitted to central government by 28 November 2025, with final decisions expected by early summer 2026 and implementation in early 2028.

Alongside this, KCC has outlined its three-year strategic objectives in the 'Reforming Kent' https:// letstalk.kent.gov.uk/kent-strategic-statement statement focusing on residents' well-being, environmental protection, and business support.

Additional priorities include developing an Energy Strategy sensitive to the environment amid growing solar farm proposals, and advocating for the return of international rail services to Kent.


#### Christmas without Plastic...

#### **OK, Let's Talk Sprouts**

This recipe gives a zesty twist to these earthy vegetables.

- 1.2kg brussel sprouts trimmed and halved
- Fresh ginger grated to make 2 tbsp ginger
- 2 oranges, zested and juiced
- 100g butter
- 2 tbsp soy sauce

#### Step 1

Bring a large pan of water to a simmer and add a big pinch of salt. Add the sprouts and blanch for 3-4 minutes until they're bright green and tender, but still have bite. Drain well. Mash the ginger, orange zest, and butter with plenty of seasoning. Tip into a frying pan and let it melt for a minute.

#### Step 2

Add the sprouts and toss to coat in the butter. Fry for 5-10 minutes until the edges are starting to turn golden brown. Add the orange juice and soy and simmer until the sauce coats the sprouts.

#### **Getting to Know Permaculture**

The last in this series of looking at permaculture principles, we're finishing with looking at the value of Edges.

**Principle: Use edges and value the marginal** This principle comes from ecology, and the recognition that the richest ecosystems are at the edge, where two habitats meet. You can maximise this by

designing to create longer edges between two areas. This is also true away from the physical environment- the most productive discussions and ideas can come from that junction between different ways of thinking.

**In Action** A simple example might be designing a garden pond. By creating wavy edges, there is more surface area at the edge of the water where it meets the land, creating more opportunities for wildlife.

Please note that a "Local Green Space" in this context is a special designation that applies to certain green spaces within a community that safeguards them against inappropriate development, effectively bringing them up to the same level as Green Belt in planning terms. To be designated, the space in question needs to meet strict criteria as set out in national policy. Potential green spaces need to be truly and "demonstrably" special to the community under at least one of five specific categories.

We have made a start at assigning these categories to each of the sites on the current list, using the first letter of the category we think for which they are demonstrably special - R: Recreational Value; H: Historic Value; W: Wildlife Value: T: Tranquillity Value; B: Beauty Value.

## Rates for Advertising in the Lyminge Newsletter

In the mists of time (2012??), we increased the charges to advertisers using the classified ad space in the Lyminge Newsletter for businesses from £9 to £9.50 per month or £95 per annum and from £1.50 to £3 (£30pa) for charities.

With time and the increasing requests for larger advertising, these charges have changed in line with these charges. However, more recently, we have seen an increase in our circulation list from 1650 copies to 1750 to include the new Pentland Homes estate and requests for further copies from China China.

In addition, we have absorbed any increased printing costs over the years, particularly when we switched to a commercial printer and yet we maintained our margins, continuing to support grant requests, donations and funding individual events. (See P 6). This year our revenue for the newsletter fell slightly from £12470 to £11463 (-8%).

The Lyminge Association committee has therefore accepted the recommendation that our fees increase by 4% (approx). The new rates per month from 1st November are as follows:

Rates for an annual advert are calculated using the monthly rate, times ten (two months free). E.g. for a quarter page business ad, one month costs £15; the annual cost £150.

We regret having to make these increases but undoubtedly we remain exceptionally competitive.



## LYMINGE THEN AND NOW

Our monthly look at how Lyminge has changed over the years, with thanks to Lyminge Historical Society.

Although the picture on the left shows a close-up and the picture on the right a longer view that reveals more of the upper storey and house next door, these both show Korf House, which stands on Canterbury Road opposite the Coffee Cabin. The picture on the left was taken in 1977 when it was still operating as a shop.

The pair of houses now known as Korf House and Dorset House were built around the beginning of the 20th Century. It seems quite likely they were both bought by a widow, Louisa Goringe, who by 1911 was living in Korf House with her two daughters Ethel and Florence, both dressmakers. They had moved there from Corfe Castle in Dorset, which probably explains the names of the two houses. Ethel later married Percy Gordon, a tailor who owned Gordon Brothers tailors in Folkestone. They lived in Church Road in Lyminge. This



was a time when Lyminge was full of businesses. The Gordon family also ran a butchers in Aberdeen House, opposite Korf House at the end of North Lyminge Lane, as well as a greengrocery in Station Road.

In 1911, Albert Collins, a bootmaker was living next door to the Goringe's in Dorset House. We know his father Barnett Collins, aged just 12 in 1851, was at that time learning the trade of boot-maker as apprentice to his cousin in Northampton, a town still well known for shoe manufacturing. Barnett later moved to Cheriton and



ran a business there for many years. His son Albert learned his father's trade but moved to Lyminge, operating first from Dorset House, but by 1921 he was in Korf House. His son Roy took over the business after the Second World War. The picture above shows Roy outside his shop, when he was still selling shoes and offering shoe repairs. By this time, it appears he had ceased to make and sell shoes himself, another once-vital trade that used to be widespread but which has now virtually disappeared from our towns and villages.
