

Margaret Saunders' Meanderings

This year's meanderings will comprise monthly observations I have made over the past year, 2025.

January

Dawn – huge white clouds to the east, like snow covered mountains, stand in front of the rising sun, which is providing a textured red background. It is indeed a shepherd's warning as the day proves cold and dull, with rain following.

Another dawn – flocks of birds, about twenty to thirty strong, move steadily northwards along the other side of the valley. Temperatures well below freezing at night make for heavy frosts and delicate patterns on vegetation and car windscreens. Sparrows emerge from the ivy clad wall of the house next door and fly straight into the beech hedge, where they begin the day's chatter. Central heating has largely replaced fires so steam instead of smoke rises from houses in the early morning, catching the moving air and giving a clear indication of the wind direction. On this particular day, after a clear



dawn and sky, rich patterns of clouds begin to move in from the south-west, the golden light of the early sun delicately colouring those that are to the south-east. But even with this

golden glow, the sky looks cold and hard echoing the frost covered landscape below.

We are clearly in a run of stunning sunrises. Behind the church the sky is a vibrant orange-red and grey clouds are rising in columns vertically from behind the hillside, echoing the wild fires in California, where they have been raging for the past weeks. It is a strange sight and one that I have never seen before. An early magpie flies past, identifiable by it's distinctive long tail, which comprises half its total length.

Several nights of frost have created wonderful patterns on windows and vegetation. Fallen Autumn leaves are always worth a closer look as rime forms around their edges and along the veins, creating wonderful pieces of art. Ice crystals have made delightful fern-like leaves on the glass of my garage door and I spend some time in the

cold morning
air, admiring
their complexity
and beauty, not
wanting the
rising sun to
melt them into
obscurity. Moss
mimics these
frost patterns,
bright green
fronds reaching



forwards in the damp areas of woodland. Birds visit the bird feeder more frequently in these cold January days, trying to keep up their food



levels. Six long-tailed tits regularly visit, coming in a flurry together, feeding on the fat-balls, then all leaving at the same time, off to some other garden café where the menu might be slightly different. Today I cut back the leaves of my hellebores and before I had stepped back from the border, a robin had appeared, eager to feed on anything that I had unearthed that had survived the night's frost.

Walks on frozen muddy footpaths mean boots stay clean but deeper ruts can cause ankle twists. Walking back down Woodland Road late one afternoon, black ice is making the road very slippery so I keep to the very edge, where there is leaf litter which provides some grip. We are now more than a week into the New Year and the waxing gibbous moon (soon to be the Wolf moon when it is full) is riding high in the sky by four o'clock in the afternoon. Clear nights have enabled the moonshine to lay a silvery light over the land, even casting shadows around the time of the full moon.

By mid January Lyminge churchyard has clumps of snowdrops in full bud and on Brady Road, a clump is fully out. A friend who keeps bees tells me that he has seen a few honey bees leaving the hive on a sunny day, most likely on a search for water to soften the honey, rather than looking for nectar.

At midnight one clear night, the now waning gibbous moon looms large in the eastern sky glowing a warm and dusky soft orange as opposed to the usual cool silver. It is a clear chilly night, hovering around freezing. The blue-black velvety sky is full of stars, the constellations clearly visible with a haze of faint stars as a more distant backdrop. Bright stars twinkle and glimmer, creating a magical scene, a firmament admired and puzzled over by many for millennia.

Storm Herminia follows hard on the heels of Storm Éowyn at the end of the month, the latter carrying a red Met Office warning, meaning a threat to life. Here in the south-east we only experience strong blustery winds where leaves scurry about frantically and birds stay in sheltered spots, compared to the 100+ mph winds in the north and west, where widespread damage occurs. As January comes to an end we wait to see what February will bring – it is often the coldest month of the year

Rector's Wonderings...

I wonder if you had any surprises last year?

The beginning of a New Year is often a time when we look over the past year, take stock and consider how we might make some improvement to our lives. New Year's resolutions become very popular.

For Christians it's a time for us to consider our gifts and talents, and what we can give to God and the church in terms of our service.

We are asked to think about our vocation (calling) like the magi, are you being called to something new?

There were a record number of baptisms in some benefice churches last year, including 3 adult baptisms - these were lovely surprises to all those concerned.

Encountering Jesus in the waters of our baptism, we are called to be children of God. It's something which doesn't leave us, no matter what happens to us in life.

Last month we told you about the meeting we had with Jim Martin, leader of Folkestone & Hythe District Council (FH&DC), who wants to turn the whole of the Jubilee Building in Everist Court (formerly the old Council building) into housing for older, single people.

We put forward our proposal for the use of the ground floor as a Community Centre to replace part of that lost when AgeUK left the village in February 2025, leaving the first floor available for housing. We also suggested that, with the existing flat roof, it would be possible to build a light-weight mansard roof on top, which would mean the building would have both 4 flats and a much-needed Community Hub.

Jim took away this proposal and came back on 10th December with his reply:

He said "This would cost an additional £630,000. So effectively this would give us one less flat when compared with the proposed scheme and cost the Council £630.000 more. You can see my problem?" We would like to question these statements.

This building has been partially used as Community Centre since 1977 - 49 years, and the whole building has been in Community use for the last 17 years. Added to that, following our successful application in June 2025, it has now been designated as an ACV i.e. an Asset of Community Value.

For FHDC to be able to turn it to housing, they will have to make a planning application to change the use from Community Use to Housing. This is where we come in and we hope that we can look to the residents of Lyminge and the surrounding area, for your support. There needs to be a substantial number of objections to this application, which can be based on the above facts and also personal reasons for keeping the building in Community use.

As of 22nd December, no application had been lodged but there were 3 days left before Christmas for this to happen.

As soon as the application is validated, we will post this on Nextdoor and Facebook asking that as many objections as possible be sent in to FHDC. We will also put up some notices around the village.

Finally, to be able to question Jim Martin's figure of £630,000 to build a timber frame top floor of about 143 square metres. we would need the services of a quantity surveyor. If there is anyone out there who could help with this task, working with the full plans we already have drawn up, we would be very grateful.

LYMINGE COMMUNITY HUB

Further to our update in the November issue of The Lyminge Newsletter, we agreed the date of Tuesday, 11th November for our meeting with Councillor Jim Martin, Leader of Folkestone & Hythe District Council and his officers. Five members of the Lyminge Community Hub committee attended the meeting and we were pleased that Councillor Tania Gauder, Senior Caseworker for Sojan Joseph MP, Christopher Hespe, Kent County Councillor for the Elham Valley and Shaun Pottage, Chair of Lyminge Parish Council, were all in attendance.

Gillian Heywood, Chair of Lyminge Community Hub, gave a PowerPoint presentation outlining our proposals for creating a village hub using the ground floor of the Jubilee Building at Everist Court. As detailed in our November update, this would provide us with sufficient space to have a commercial kitchen in which we could prepare breakfasts, light lunches and refreshments throughout the day from Monday to Friday, create a thrift shop and still have a good sized meeting room for local clubs and other groups to meet in and, hopefully, a monthly repair café.

During the discussions which followed, Councillor Martin emphasised again the need for social housing in the form of one-bedroom flats so that he can release some larger houses for families. We pointed out that whilst we fully appreciate the need for more social housing, Lyminge already has a good level of social housing provision for single people and that not everyone wants to

move to a rural location, where social isolation is much more prevalent than in urban areas.

The Jubilee Building (also referred to as Jubilee House) is located at Everist Court in Lyminge. The building was formerly used as a community day centre by Age UK, but it has been listed as an asset of community value since 17 June 2025 following a successful nomination by the Lyminge Community Hub, Community Interest Company (C.I.C.). If a planning application is put forward by the Council to change the whole building into flats, there would need to be a change of use from Community to Housing and this is something we will need to oppose if we are to secure use of the ground floor for our Community Hub. If deemed necessary, we would organise a further public meeting and would be looking to the residents of Lyminge for your support in objecting to this change of use.

Proposals for the possible installation of a Mansard roof on the Jubilee building were also discussed, as this would create provision for a third floor to the building and space for two additional apartments thus providing a total of five, which Councillor Martin is hoping to achieve. If this option works, it would mean that the Council would secure additional singleperson accommodation and the residents of Lyminge and the surrounding villages would have a much-needed social space for all ages once again using the ground floor of the building.

District Councillors' update

- January 2026



Government Re-organisation - A lot of time has been spent on considering Local Government Re-organisation. There was no overall consensus of the 14 Council leaders. At Folkestone & Hythe District Council, each Councillor was given the opportunity to vote on their preferred model and the result was overwhelmingly in favour of 3a which was then ratified by Cabinet and taken forward by the Leader. Model 3a is the three unitary option consisting of Dartford, Gravesham, Medway and Swale in the north; Sevenoaks, Tonbridge and Malling, Maidstone and Tunbridge Wells in the west and Ashford, Canterbury, Thanet, Dover and Folkestone and Hythe in the east. Ashford on the other hand put forward 4d as their preferred option. This would reorganise Kent and Medway into four new unitary councils but would divide Folkestone & Hythe into two. Other Kent Councils voted for different Models and these submissions were made to the Minister on 28 November. It will be Spring before we get a decision on how Kent and Medway will be organised.

Otterpool Park - I continue to question the Leader on Otterpool Park. We now understand there is another collaboration agreement with Homes England on setting up a joint planning group to finalise the reserve matters that are still outstanding. This apparently runs until December 2026 so we will watching closely!

Rural Prosperity Fund – in the recent round of allocations, in our Ward the application from Wild & Wise Collectives at Bodsham to provide equipment to allow Kombucha business to upscale was successful. The fund is still open to expressions of interest but you will need to act fast as all projects must be completed and grants paid out by the end of March 2026.

Napier Barracks – The District Council has just been advised that all asylum seekers accommodated at Napier Barracks have now been moved on. The Barracks will now be handed back to the Ministry of Defence who will pass it on to the Developers.

I hope you all had a happy festive season and New Year. Since Southern Water's Eastern Treatment Works released up to 10 tonnes of plastic beads into the sea, F&HDC have been closely monitoring the beaches along the coastline. Currently only a small quantity of beads has been found. The matter was raised at a recent meeting with town and parish councils where there was a presentation by

Southern Water and the Environment Agency. On an unrelated issue, the beaches at Dymchurch and Greatstone were given a poor bathing water quality rating and a 'No Swim' notice has been issued by the Environment Agency for these beaches.

A blueprint for a net zero district by 2041 has been unanimously backed by the council's cabinet. The district-wide carbon plan sets out actions for the council, businesses, residents and groups to tackle the urgent challenges posed by climate change and achieve a more sustainable and climate-resilient future. The plan is due to be launched at an event in January 2026.

The Edwardian section of the Folca building in Folkestone has gone on the market. The space in the former Debenhams store is being marketed as suitable for a variety of uses. Great progress has been made with the Integrated Care Board to deliver the Health Centre to Folca 2. The council bought the Folca building in May 2020 and is continuing with plans to regenerate the Art Deco part facing Sandgate Road.

Ideas for topics to be discussed by the council's Overview and Scrutiny Committee are being welcomed.

Kent and Medway Local Nature Recovery Strategy Launched

DEFRA appointed KCC to lead in the production and management of the Strategy in 2023. The Strategy has been launched and sets out priorities for nature recovery and, through an interactive mapping portal, identifies actions and locations where the greatest contribution can be made. It is designed to help any organisation or individual take forward nature recovery in their area by providing the information and advice needed. Key priorities include tree planting to enhance air quality and protecting Kent's coastline with measures such as seagrass restoration, which has created habitats for seahorses and wintering Brent Geese.

Committee Restructuring

In order to reduce bureaucracy, duplication and costs, KCC is reducing its number of committees. The administration believes there are too many meetings, taking valuable time of Members and Officers. The changes to the committees will improve efficiency and make financial savings, 14 whilst ensuring compliance with statutory requirements. Further savings from committees will be found in forthcoming months as efforts to reduce bureaucracy continue.

Spatial Planning

In the government's English Devolution White Paper of December 2024, it set out the intention to introduce a new duty for all areas, regardless of the pace of devolution or local government reorganisation, to prepare a Spatial Development Strategy. This would transform the delivery of housing and economic growth, coordinating with the necessary infrastructure provision relating to transport, energy and water. From Spring 2026, the preparation of a Kent and Medway Spatial Development Strategy will be led by a new Strategic Planning Board. This will provide the strategic planning framework that has been missing in Kent since the demise of County Structure Plans in 2011, enabling development prioritisation and investment in the County.

Playground Festival

A new festival designed to encourage play, imagination and creativity is launching in Kent in 2026, taking place between 22 and 31 May. The Playground Festival has been created for babies, young children and their families, involving immersive installations, workshops and playground sessions at 20 venues. There will be 150 events showcasing some of the most inspiring national and international work created for young audiences. Tickets can be booked via playgroundkent.co.uk/playground-festival

New Highways Contract

KCC has signed a new long-term contract with Ringway to maintain and improve Kent's roads, worth £50 million.

The new contract will mean that residents will benefit from faster, more efficient repairs and maintenance, including potholes and drainage issues. The contract covers gritting, maintaining bridges and responding to emergencies. A key benefit of the new contract is that value for money for Kent taxpayers is sought, as the contract is designed to ensure efficiency, be transparent and provide visible results that Kent residents will see.

Moving Traffic Offences

KCC is inviting residents, businesses and road users to share their views on proposals to enforce moving traffic offences at certain key locations across the County. Yellow box junctions will be enforced via camera at one location in each of Ashford, Canterbury and Dover, in addition to a number in Maidstone. Thoughtful Food...

...is a group of local volunteers looking at our food, and how this impacts climate change. Our aims are to support people to produce more of their own food, and to shop locally, sourcing seasonal produce. We also run a community allotment in Lyminge and welcome new members.

Next Thoughtful Food meeting, 7.30pm MONDAY 26th January, at The Coach & Horses.

We wish you all a Happy New Year and hope that some of your new year resolutions may be food related!

In 2026 we will be focusing on Local Food heroes who have a passion for producing nutritious food whilst being custodians of the land. Sarah and Martin Mackey run Ripple Farm Organics, supplying veg boxes, mainly to East Kent but their reach extends to Ashford, Whitstable and Faversham. They also sell their produce at Farmers Markets.

They manage three sites in the idyllic setting of Wye, (Martin says he wouldn't risk living anywhere else! Despite his roots being in Ireland he loves it) One site is an extraordinary round walled garden that used to be part of a Victorian Manor house, one is the hub of the business where the boxes are packed, part of the Ripple estate. When Wye College closed in 2009, Sarah and Martin had the opportunity to rent 100 acres. This was slightly daunting but they decided they had to go for it. Nearly 20 years on they have not looked back. This is their third site and produces not just crops for the veg boxes but for wholesale to the Better Food Shed, https://growingcommunities.org/ better-food-shed a London based company, that sells veg grown organically, distributing this to shops and restaurants in a sustainable way using electric vehicles.

Meeting Sarah and Martin on a rather damp, cold December day I was surprised at the variety of veg and salads being picked to go into the veg boxes. Leeks, Radicchio, Ca-volo Nero and Kale. Potatoes, onions, Celery and beetroot were piled up in the barn. Some salad crops like rocket were just about

hanging on under fleece outside and some were being brought on ready for planting in greenhouses. Mustard leaf and claytonia, known as miner's lettuce were almost



ready to go outside. This is a really hardy crop, it has a spinach like, mild, sweet flavour and is rich in vitamin c, so great for winter.

Both Sarah and Martin have an obvious passion for what they do. Sarah says she has always wanted to produce what people need, highly nutritious food that is grown to enhance rather than damage the land leaving it healthy for future generations.

Martin's tips for growing are to know your soil and just keep going, don't give up if you have a bad crop, look at what is happening and learn. He doesn't grow many cauliflowers as they need too much water, difficult to



maintain on a chalk base soil and he hates growing runner beans but will persevere with carrots as he loves them. The secret to good carrots is dual sowing and lots of weeding.



Over 200 veg boxes a week go out of the sheds in the most sustainable way possible, locally they are delivered by bicycle and trailer, further afield they are dropped off in one or two hubs per village where they can be collected. Currently, Lyminge has a delivery every Thursday to Dog Kennel Lane. You can purchase a small, medium or large box. They are extremely good value and such good quality.

OK - you may have to wash a bit of dirt off but you will be rewarded in flavour.

Getting a veg box would be one way to practise permaculture, Buying and eating produce that is grown locally with sustainability in mind.

Moroccan chick pea, Squash and Cavolo Nero stew

- 4 tomatoes halved
- · 5 tbsp olive oil
- 250g butternut squash peeled and chopped into large chunks
- · 1 tbsp thyme leaves
- 1 garlic clove,crushed
- · 1 onion sliced
- \cdot 2 x 400g cans chickpeas, drained
- 1 bay leaf
- · 1 tbsp ground cumin
- · 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- ½ tsp turmeric
- 1 tbsp harissa
- 11 vegetable stock
- 100g feta crumbled
- · 1 lemon zested, cut into wedges
- · 2 tsp fennel seeds
- · 1 tsp ground coriander
- · 200g cavolo nero.shredded
- handful fresh coriander leaves, to serve

Heat oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. Put the tomatoes on a baking sheet lined with baking parchment for 20 minutes or.....

Moroccan chick pea, Squash and Cavolo Nero stew (contd from P 17).

....until the vegetables begin to soften (but not brown).

Meanwhile, pour 2 tbsp oil into a large saucepan and add the squash, thyme, garlic and onion. Season generously and cook on a low heat for 15 mins

Add the tomatoes, chickpeas, bay, ground spices and harissa. Season to taste and pour in the stock. Bring to the boil, then reduce the heat and simmer for 30-35 mins until the liquid has reduced.

Put the feta in a small bowl and add the remaining olive oil and the lemon zest. Mix well and set aside.

Toast the fennel seeds in a frying pan for 1 min, then lightly crush with a pestle and mortar, or in a bowl with the back of a rolling pin.



Add the ground coriander and cavolo nero to the stew and cook for 2 mins. Put the stew in a bowl and top with a scoop of feta, a sprinkling of coriander leaves and fennel seeds, and some seasoning. Serve with lemon wedges on the side.

Rates for Advertising in the Lyminge Newsletter

In the mists of time (2012??), we increased the charges to advertisers using the classified ad space in the Lyminge Newsletter for businesses from £9 to £9.50 per month or £95 per annum and from £1.50 to £3 (£30pa) for charities.

With time and the increasing requests for larger advertising, these charges have changed in line with these charges. However, more recently, we have seen an increase in our circulation list from 1650 copies to 1750 to include the new Pentland Homes estate and requests for further copies from China China.

In addition, we have absorbed any increased printing costs over the years, particularly when we switched to a commercial printer and yet we maintained our margins, continuing to support grant requests, donations and funding individual events. (See P 6). This year our revenue for the newsletter fell slightly from £12470 to £11463 (-8%).

The Lyminge Association committee has therefore accepted the recommendation that our fees increase by 4% (approx). The new rates per month from 1st November are as follows:

Rates for an annual advert are calculated using the monthly rate, times ten (two months free). E.g. for a quarter page business ad, one month costs £15; the annual cost £150.

We regret having to make these increases but undoubtedly we remain exceptionally competitive.

LYMINGE THEN AND NOW

Our monthly look at how Lyminge has changed over the years, with thanks to Lyminge Historical Society.

The War Memorial has stood in Lyminge Parish Churchyard since it was erected in 1921, after the end of the First World War.


It was built to the design of Frederick Wheeler, a local fruit farmer who lived in Rhodes Minnis. It was dedicated at a service in September 1921, and annual Services of Remembrance organised by the Royal British Legion commenced in November 1924.

Initially this service was held on 11 November the anniversary of the Armistice that ended the war, and the two minutes of silence was rigidly observed across the country with traffic stopping and people marking the time silently wherever they were. The names of the 28 local men who died in the First World War are inscribed on the memorial. One of them, Private James William West is even buried in the churchyard, and a stone to him was recently



erected by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission, but it is a cenotaph as surprisingly the location of his grave is unknown.

The picture to the left dates probably to the 1920s, and may show the memorial shortly after the first annual Service of Remembrance. The wreaths then were of fresh flowers. Burials had not extended to this



part of the churchyard, and as in many photographs of Lyminge at this time, there were many fewer trees. After the Second World War, thirteen more names were added to the memorial and the annual Service of Remembrance moved to the second Sunday in November, the one closest to the 11th. The path to the memorial was created in 2020.
