What information we collect and use, and why:

We may collect or use the following personal information to provide services or make purchases

- Names and contact details
- Addresses
- Payment details (including card or bank information)

Lawful bases and data protection right:

Under UK data protection law, we must have a “lawful basis” for collecting and using your personal information. There is a list of possible lawful bases in the UK GDPR (General Data Protection Regulation). You can find out more about lawful bases on the ICO’s (Information Commissioner’s Office) website - <https://ico.org.uk/>

Which lawful bases we rely on may affect your data protection rights which are set out in brief below. You can find out more about your data protection rights and the exemptions which may apply on the ICO’s website.

Your right of access – You have the right to ask us for copies of your personal information. You can request other information such as details about where we get

personal information from and who we share personal information with. There are some exemptions which means you may not receive all the information you ask for.

Your right to rectification - You have the right to ask us to correct or delete personal information you think is inaccurate or incomplete.

Your right to erasure - You have the right to ask us to delete your personal information.

Your right to restriction of processing - You have the right to ask us to limit how we can use your personal information.

Your right to data portability - You have the right to ask that we transfer the personal information you gave us to another organisation, or to you.

Your right to withdraw consent – When we use consent as our lawful basis you have the right to withdraw your consent at any time.

If you make a request, we must respond to you without undue delay and in any event within one month.

To make a data protection rights request, please contact us using the contact details at the top of this privacy notice.

Our lawful bases for the collection and use of your data:

Our lawful basis for collecting or using personal information to provide services or make purchases is:

- Legitimate interests – we are collecting or using your information because it benefits you, our organisation or someone else, without causing an undue risk of harm to anyone. All your data protection rights may apply, except the right to portability.

For more information on our use of legitimate interests as a lawful basis, you can contact us using the contact details set out above.

Where we get personal information from:

- Directly from you

How long we keep information:

We keep information for a maximum of 6 months after you cease trading with the Association.

For more information on how long we store your personal information or the criteria we use to determine this please contact us using the details provided above.

How to complain:

If you have any concerns about our use of your personal data, you can make a complaint to us using the contact details at the top of this privacy notice.

If you remain unhappy with how we've used your data after raising a complaint with us, you can also complain to the ICO.
